-SEAT has been unwilling to compromise with university administrators who have asked it annually to "tone it ing about \$29,000 down" and consider the impact of its language choices.


> The Comptroller's Office also examined policies and practices at other public Tennessee universities that could be applied at UTK. For example, other Tennessee universities limit the amount of funding student organizations may request or receive.

14 policy considerations ranging from minor changes to campus policy to an outright ban on the event. Some policy considerations may have potential legal implications.




