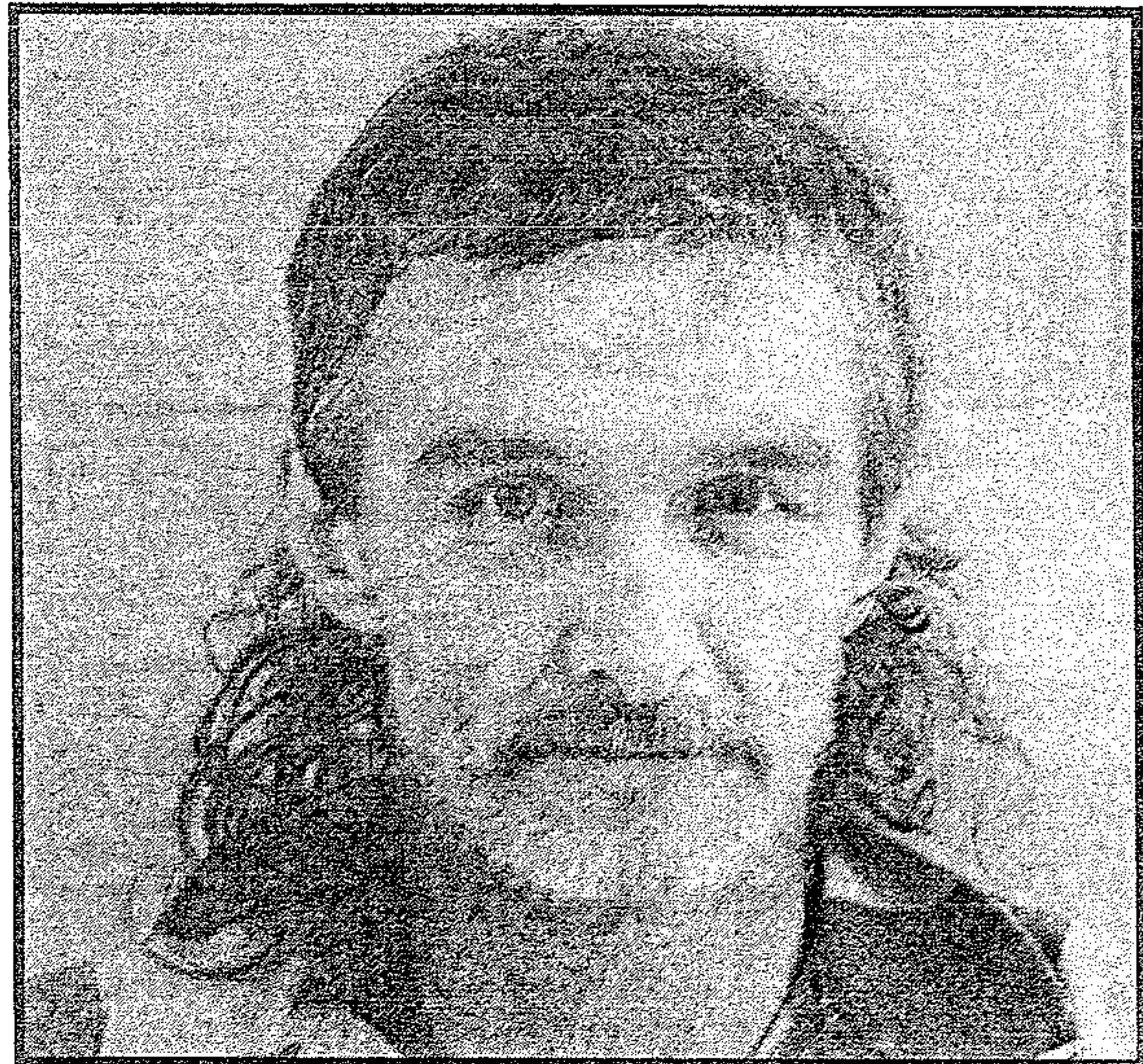

Addressing the Cyber Threat Director Discusses FBI Approach at Cybersecurity Conference

With cyber threats to the United States and across globe reaching unprecedented levels, the FBI uses a full spectrum of expertise, technology, and partnerships to root out cyber criminals, FBI Director Chris-

topher Wray said at the annual RSA Conference in San Francisco yesterday.

"Today's cyber threat is bigger than any one government agency—frankly, bigger than government itself," Wray

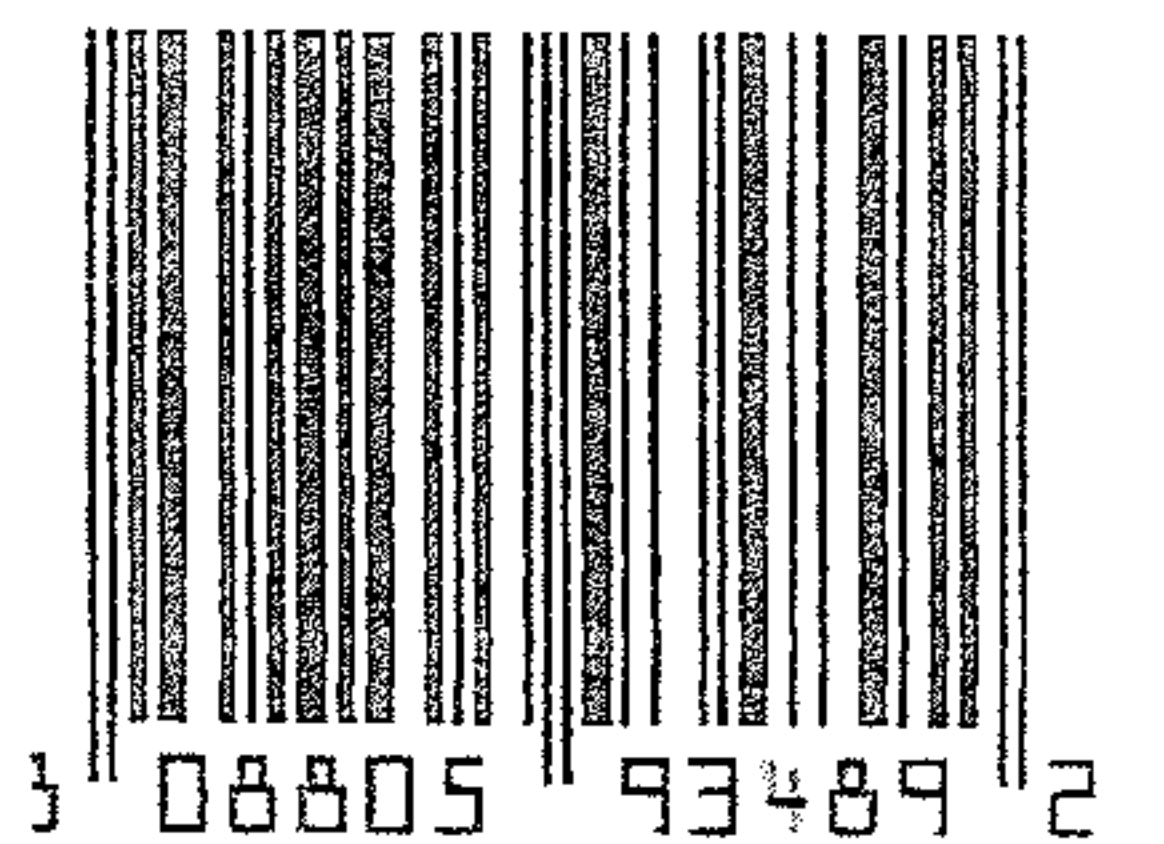

on scene to crashed vehicle that was abandon and the driver fled the scene of the accident. Trooper began a tow report when LCSO notified they had found the driver who left

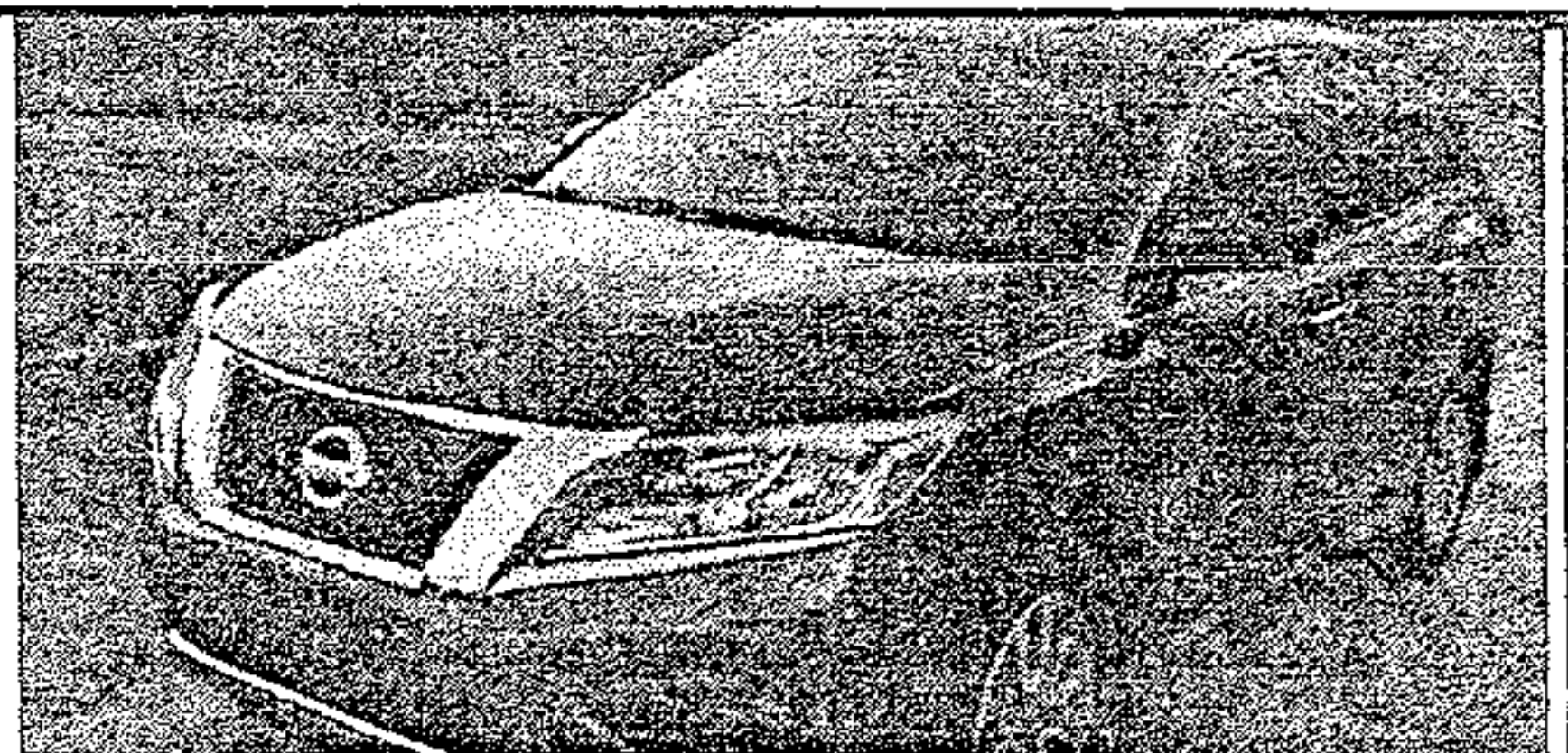
the scene. The driver was identified as Jaret Axell, due to the laceration on his head. Axell was transported to Fort Loudon Hospital. Trooper investi-

gated further and noticed a strong odor of marijuana coming from the vehicle near the passenger glove box. Trooper searched and found drugs para. In the form of needles, crack pipe with white residue, 23 one hundred dollar bills that

were counter fit, one orange pill identified as oxcarbazine. Trooper went to Fort Loudon Hospital and made contact with Axell. Trooper ask Axell about the items located in the vehicle he claimed them. Trooper gave Axell sobriety test which he did poorly on. Jaret Axell was placed under arrest.

DUI

Christopher Sunstein, 35, Brittini Lane Lenoir City, was charged with DUI. Deputy Akins LCSO, observed a white vehicle traveling at a high rate of speed. Deputy followed behind the vehicle and witnessed it crossing over the white center line and the white fog line several of times. It was also swerving in it's lane. Deputy stopped said vehicle and identified the driver as (Christopher Sunstein). When asked for license, registration and proof of insurance, Mr. Sunstein handed him all but license. He seemed very hyper and could not stop talking. His speech was slurred and had dried saliva on the side of his lips. Mr. Sunstein was asked to exit the vehicle

to perform Standardized Field Sobriety testing. Mr. Sunstein agreed to test, which he did poorly on. Mr. Sunstein admitted to taking his prescribed medication (Suboxone and Klo-nopin) earlier in the day, "morning time". He also admitted to smoking Marijuana approximately two or three hours prior to Deputy stopping Mr. Sunstein. Based off of Mr. Sunstein driving and Field Sobriety, Deputy felt that Mr. Sunstein was to impaired to be operating a motor vehicle. He was place under arrest and transported to Loudon County Jail without incident. After arriving at the jail, Mr. Sunstein agreed to a breath test but refused a blood test. All the above incident did occur in Loudon County Tennessee. Breath results showed 0.000

Pipe

Donnie Bauswell, 46, West 1st Ave Lenoir City, was charged with DUI, and Poss. Of Drug Para. Officer Green LCPD, responded to W. Broadway to assist Officer Riley Miller on a traffic stop. Off. Miller stated he observed a Black Dodge Charger fail to signal a left hand turn at the intersection of Industrial Park Dr. at West Broadway. Officer made contact with the driver of the vehicle, Donnie Bauswell, who appeared nervous, would not make eye contact, was talking excessively, and fidgeting his keys. Officer asked Mr. Bauswell to exit the vehicle for further questioning. While speaking to Mr. Braswell, Off. Dragon observed a red straw in Mr. Braswell's boot which contained a white powdery residue. I asked Mr. Braswell if he had consumed any narcotics prior to driving in which he initially denied. Officer requested Mr. Bauswell to perform Standard Field Sobriety and ARIDE testing in which he consented. Mr. Braswell did give several clues and indications of impairment during testing and performed poor-

ly overall. Officer once again asked Mr. Braswell if he had ingested any narcotics in which he stated he had snorted a "Hydro" approximately four hours to driving. Officer took Mr. Braswell into custody for suspicion of driving under the influence. During search of the vehicle Off. Miller did recover a glass pipe with a white cloudy residue believed to be used for inhaling Methamphetamine. This pipe was recovered in Mr. Braswell's boot that he was initially wearing at the time of stop, now located in the back seat of the vehicle. Mr. Braswell was read TN implied consent and refused to provide a blood sample for chemical testing but stated he would consent to a breath test. Officer transported Mr. Braswell to Loudon County Jail where he was charged with Driving under the influence and possession of drug paraphernalia. All the above did occur in Lenoir City, Loudon County, TN.

said in an on-stage interview at the cybersecurity conference. "But I think no agency brings the same combination of scope and scale, experience, tools, and relationships that the FBI has."

From multinational cyber syndicates to foreign intelligence services, hacktivists, and insider threats, Wray explained that the FBI takes a multidisciplinary approach to combating threats. For example, the Bureau has an elite rapid deployment force and Cyber Action Teams that can respond to incidents anywhere in the world. In addition, the FBI has joined other federal, state, and local law enforcement agencies on Cyber Task

Forces to coordinate responses. Specially trained cyber agents are also embedded in FBI legal attaché offices in more than 60 countries worldwide.

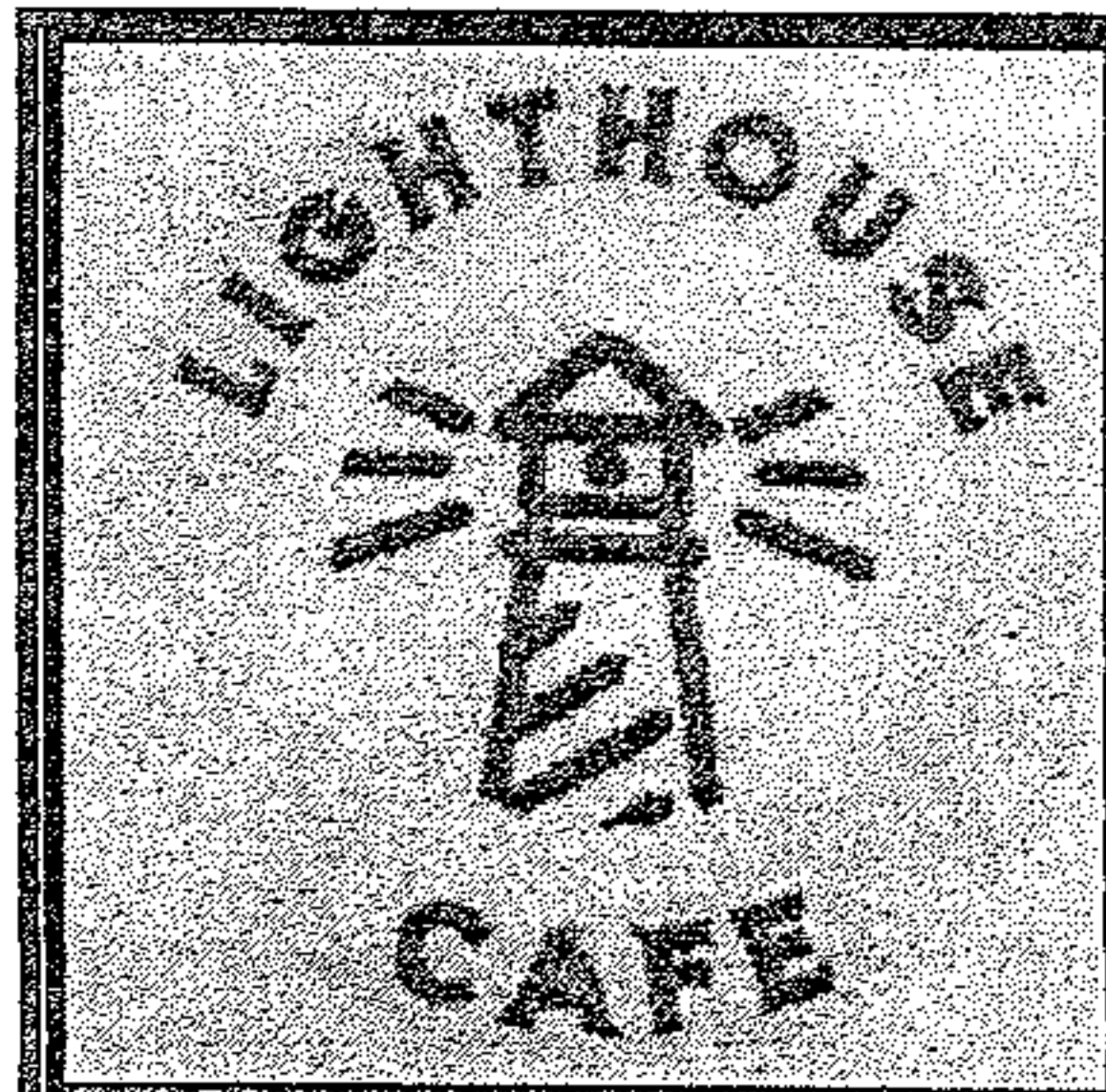
In addition to law enforcement partnerships, Wray also stressed the importance of public-private partnerships, so prevention and response can be swift and coordinated.

"The key is hav-

ing the private sector start to form relationships with their local field office beforehand," Wray said.

As the FBI continues to grow its partnerships, the FBI is also developing its workforce's cyber expertise. Wray spoke about the FBI's success in recruiting special agents and professional staff over the past year.

"SEC Athlete of the Year Award" is presented annually as the Roy F. Kramer Award.

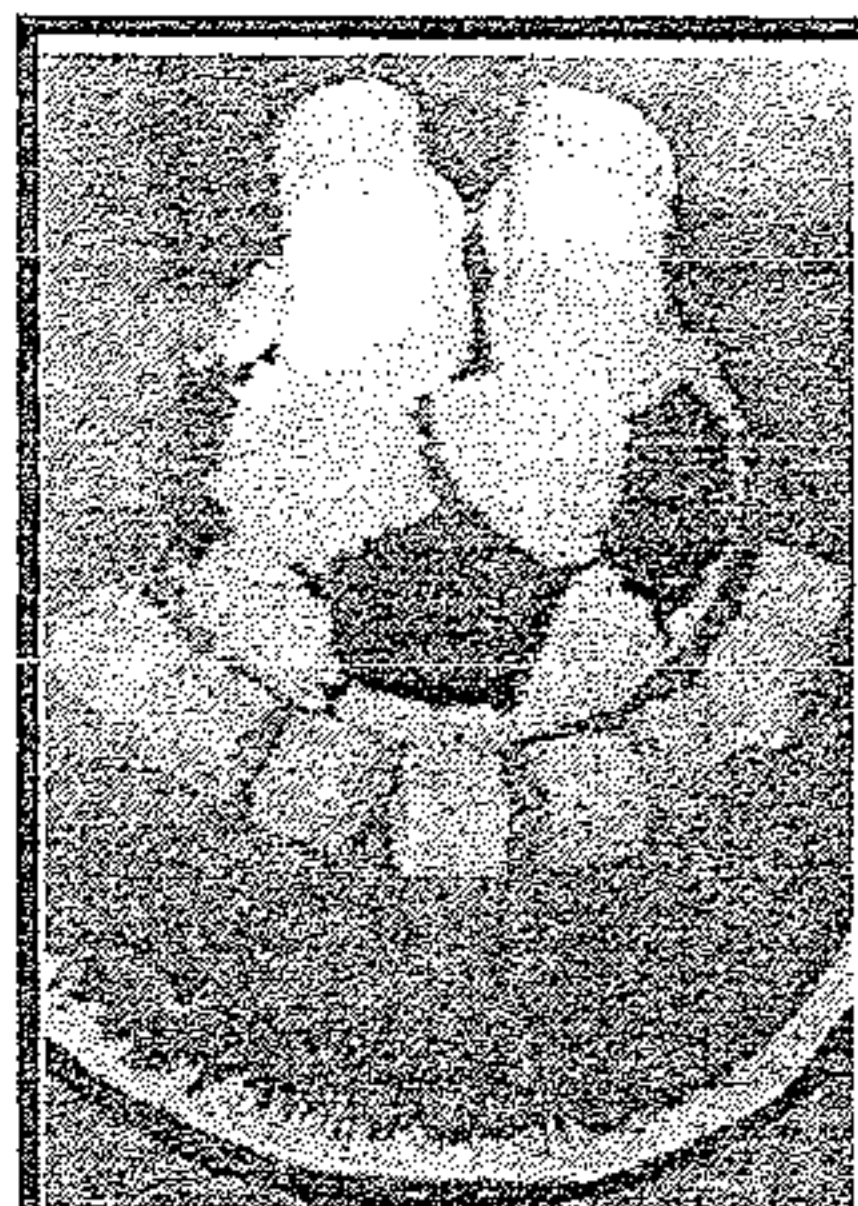
