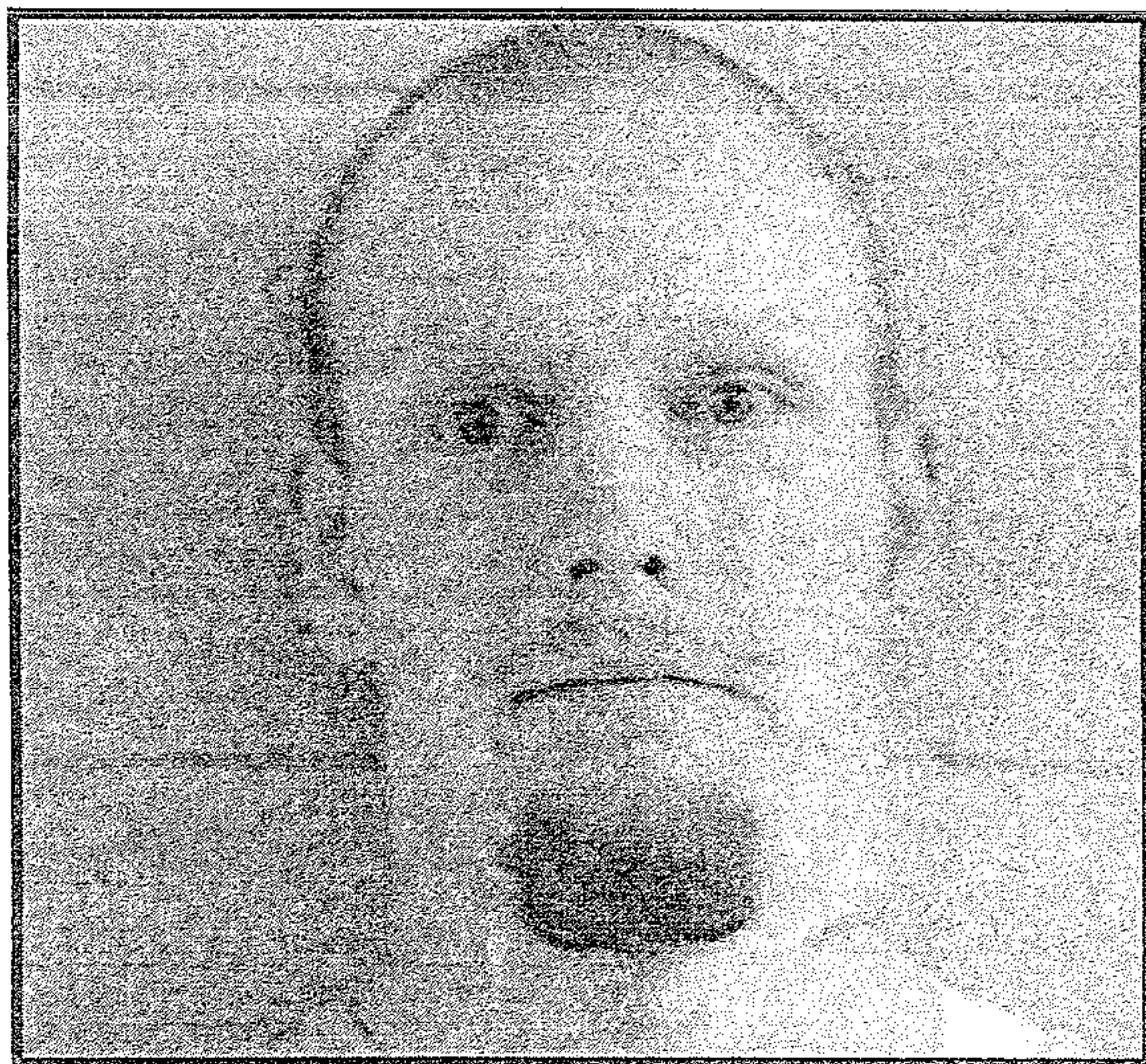

day, April 9, 2019.

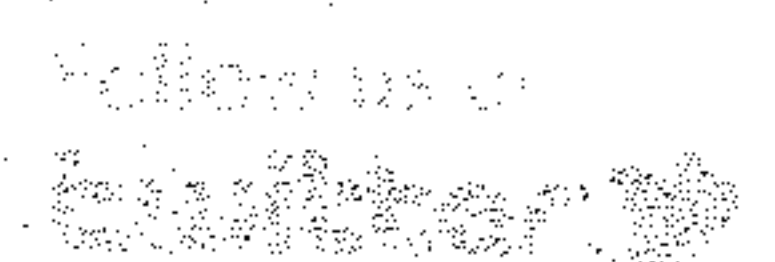

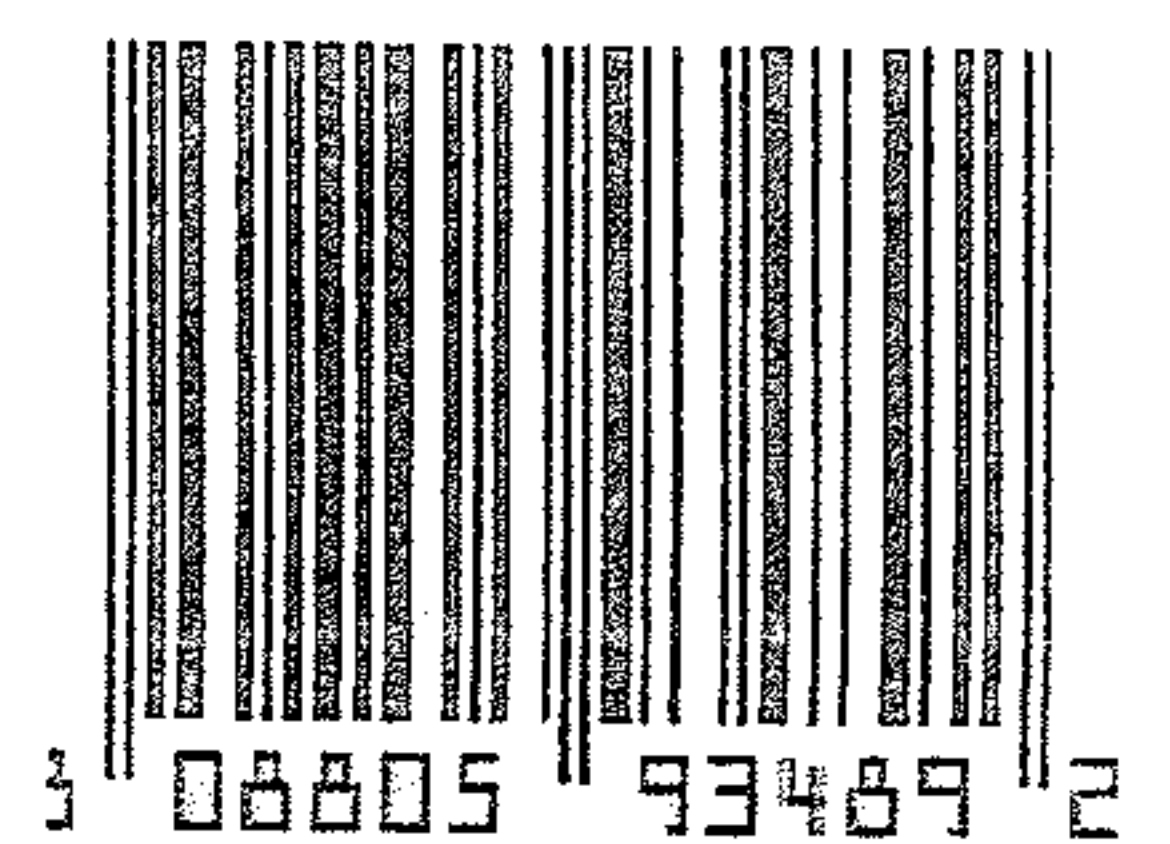

Att Murder

Leslie W Myers, 42, Hwy 95 Greenback, TN was charged with Attempted First Degree Murder. A woman is behind bars for attempted murder after stabbing her husband multiple times, according

to Loudon County authorities. The Loudon County Sheriff's Office said deputies arrested 42-year-old Leslie Myers and charged her with attempted first-degree murder of her husband, 38-year-old Alan Myers Jr. The LCSO said

deputies were called out to a home off of Highway 95 in Greenback for a domestic situation. When they arrived, deputies said they found the wife trying to leave in a vehicle. The wife was tak-

en into custody without incident before a patrol found the husband inside the home. Officers said the man had been stabbed multiple times and had lost a significant murder ctd. to pg. 3

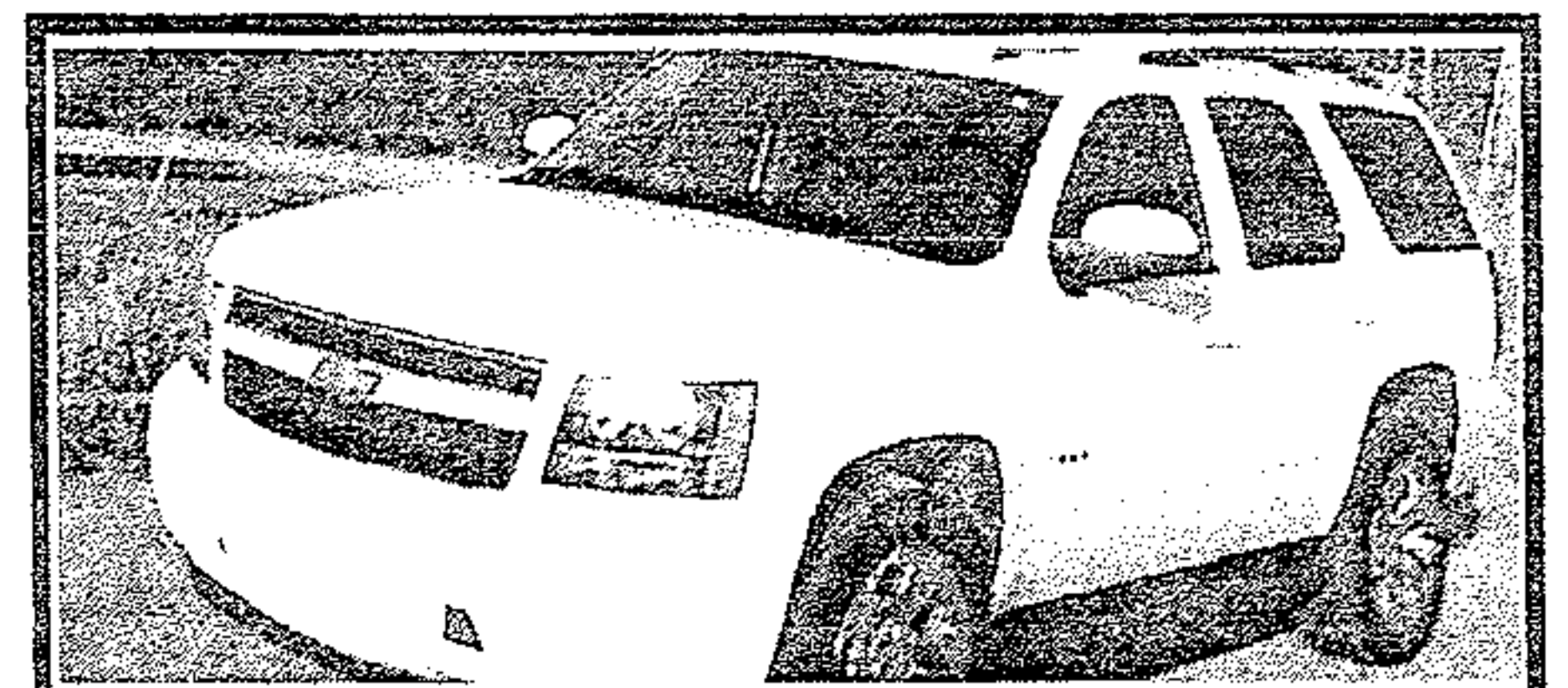

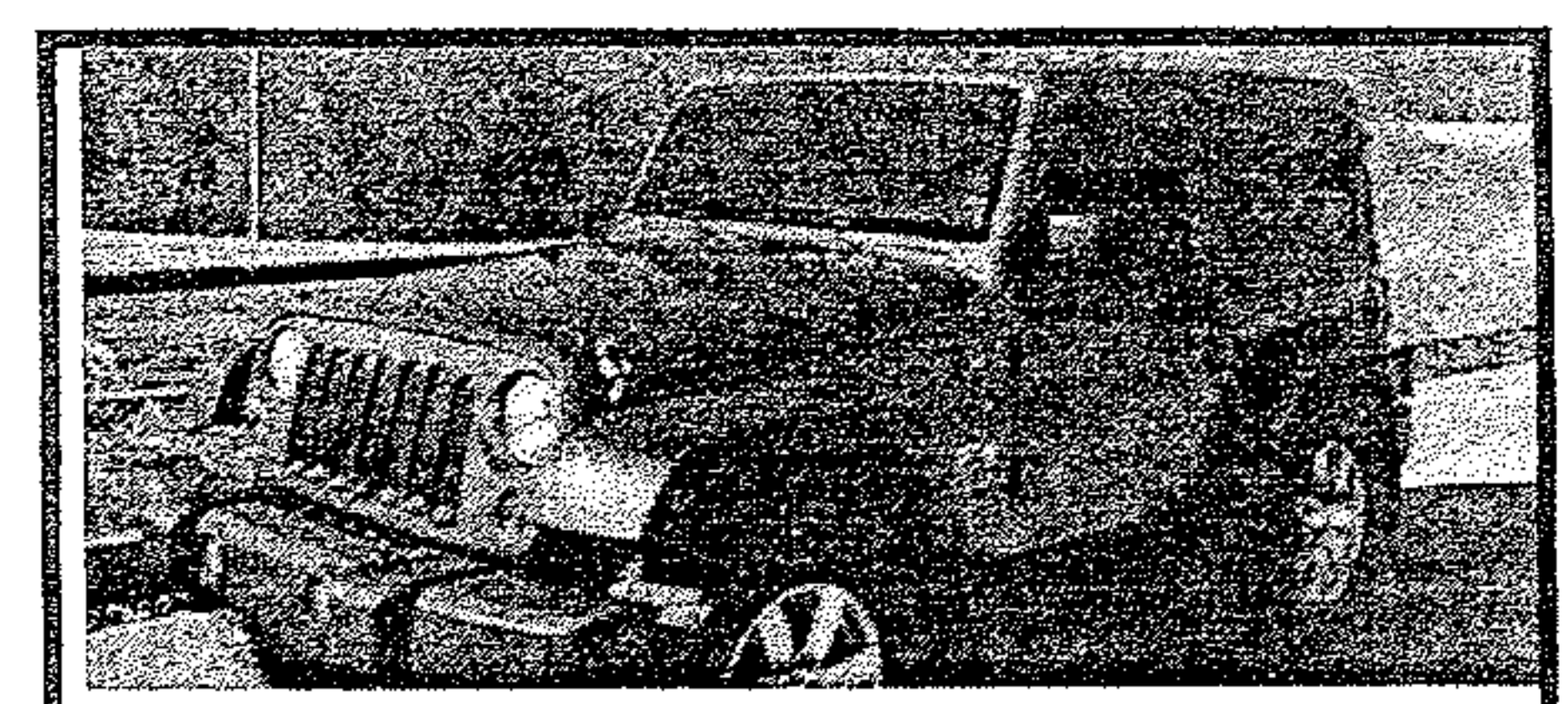

of the driveway scaring them. Deputy made contact with Shane Selvidge and he advised the victims drive fast up and down the driveway blowing there horn. Selvidge stated he came outside while they were coming down the driveway and fired shots into his yard to let them know someone lived there. Deputy could smell an odor of alcoholic beverage on Selvidge breath, he stated he had drank 3 or 4 beers. Selvidge was placed under arrest.

"National Crime Victims' Rights Week is a time to reflect on the history of the victims' rights movement, celebrate its progress,

Our prosecutors are also committed to supporting and providing service to victims of all federal crimes, including violent crimes, fraud, identity theft, human trafficking, elder abuse and exploitation, and sexual crimes against children."

Each year in April, the Department of Justice and U.S. Attorneys' offices observe Na-

tional Crime Victims' Rights Week nationwide by taking time to honor victims of crime and those who advocate on their behalf. In addition, the Justice Department and U.S. Attorneys' offices organize events to honor the victims and advocates, as well as bring awareness to services available to victims of crime. This year's observance takes place April 7-13, with the theme: Honoring Our Past. Creating Hope for the Future.

The U.S. Department of Justice will host the Office for Victims of Crime's annual National Crime Victims' Service Awards Ceremony in Washington, D.C. on April 12, 2019, to honor outstanding individuals and programs that serve victims of crime.

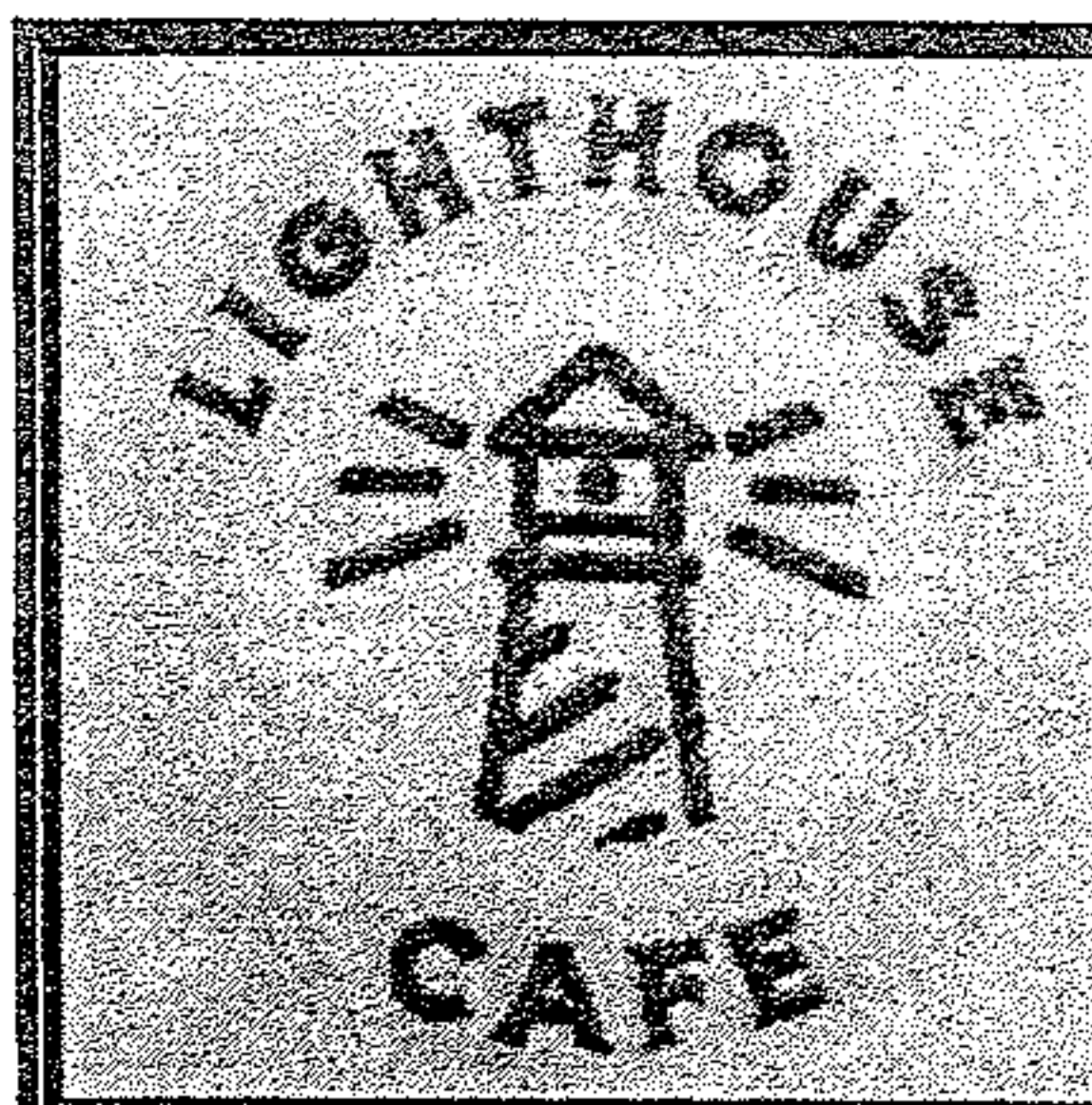

Jeremiah Davis, 27, Homeless Lenoir City, was charged with Lenoir City Capias, Mfg/Del/Sell or Poss. Of Meth, Poss. Of a Firearm, and Criminal Impersonation.

Inv. Ketner, received information that a subject with active warrants was staying at the Knights Inn located at Interchange Park Dr. Lenoir City, Tn. While on scene at the hotel Agents were approached by the hotel manager who stated that he wanted the subjects in room 209 to leave and that checkout time was 11:00am. At 11:35 am Agents made contact with a


male and female in front of room 209. Agents were able to properly identify the female and the male stated that he did not want to provide any identification to Agents but that his name was Jay Davis. While speaking with the subjects Mr. Davis went back inside Room. Agent Farmer then spoke with the female subject outside the room and she stated that there was a firearm inside the bathroom under the towel's, which Mr. Davis had just placed there before Agents approached him. For Officer safety the firearm, a Smith and Wesson SD9VE, was re-

moved and secured. During an interview of Davis he admitted to holding the gun for another individual and that he had recently transported and moved it into the bathroom of the hotel room. Jay Davis's true identity was found to be Jeremiah Davis and he was found to have an active warrant out of Lenoir City for F.T.A. Mr. Davis was arrested and transported to the jail. During the search at the jail Deputy Purdy located approximately 3.2 grams, in two separate baggies, of methamphetamine on Mr. Davis's person and \$698.00 in U.S. currency. Davis was charged with Possession of a weapon during a dangerous felony, Possession of methamphetamine and Criminal Impersonation. These actions did happen in Loudon County, TN.
