





Leslie W Myers, 42, Hwy 95 Greenback, TN was charged with Attempted First Degree Murder. A woman is behind bars for attempted murder after stabbing her husband multiple times, according

to Loudon County authorities.

The Loudon County Sheriff's Office said deputies arrested 42-year-old Leslie Myers and charged her with attempted first-degree murder of her husband, 38-year-old Alan Myers Jr. The LCSO said

deputies were called out to a home off of Highway 95 in Greenback for a domestic situation.

When they arrived, deputies said they found the wife trying to leave in a vehicle. The wife was tak-

en into custody without incident before a patrol found the husband inside the home.
