## Seeking Tips, Pursuing Justice

*During Police Week, the FBI Asks for Help Finding Those Responsible for Killing or Assaulting Law Enforcement Officers*

Robert Rosenbloom knew the dangers that came with police work. The New Mexico State Police patrolman, who was killed during a 1971 traffic stop on Interstate 40 near Albuquerque, talked to his wife about it before they were married. "He told me the dangers, the risks, what might happen," said Rosenbloom's widow, Linda.

Patrolman Rosenbloom was fatally wounded on November 8, 1971, after he stopped a car that in-

vestigators believe was carrying Michael Finney, Ralph Goodwin, and Charlie Hill. The three suspects fled into the desert after allegedly shooting Rosenbloom in the neck and chest, emerging weeks later to allegedly hijack a truck and then a plane that took them to Cuba, where they were sheltered from prosecution. Goodwin and Finney are believed to be dead. Hill is still living in Cuba and is wanted by the FBI and New Mexi-

co state authorities. "You can't just kill somebody, flee the country, and live your life," said Tammy Minicki, Rosenbloom's daughter. She was 3 when her father was killed and has only a single, fleeting memory of her dad.

Her brother, Rob Rosenbloom, was just 2 years old when his father was murdered, and though he doesn't remember his dad, he followed his career path and became a parole officer in Okla-

Alicia Gabriel, 51, Deerfield Lane Lenoir City, was charged with Domestic Assault, Public Intoxication, and Resisting Arrest.

Deputy Marshall Lynn LCSO, was notified, via Loudon County E911 dispatchers, of a domestic disturbance at Deerfield Lane.

Deputy arrived on scene and observed a white female, later identified as Suspect (Alicia Gabriel), walking in front of the residence. Deputy asked Alicia Gabriel what was going on, when she stated her dad was very mad. Alicia Gabriel and Deputy walked to the back of the residence, where he observed a white male, later identified

as Victim standing at the back door. For the safety of Deputy and all parties involved, Deputy instructed Alicia Gabriel to stand beside the garage door, while he spoke with victim. Deputy made contact with victim

and began asking investigative questions, when he noticed Alicia Gabriel was attempting to walk back to the front of the residence. Deputy ordered Alicia Gabriel to stay where he could see her,

**Wreck**

Martha Long, 36, Forest Brook Lane Kingston, was charged with DUI, Possession of a Handgun while under the Influence, and Legend Drugs.

Deputy Rogers LCSO, was dispatched to a suspicious vehicle in the area of Stockton Valley Rd. Upon arrival Deputy observed a silver BMW that had just been pulled out

of the ditch. After talking with a subject in the first truck he advised he had helped the lady pull her car out of the ditch. Deputy then made contact with a male who advised his girlfriend (Ms. Long) was coming to see him when she wrecked and called him to come get her.

Deputy then made contact with Martha Long the driver of the BMW who was sitting in the driver's seat of her vehicle. Ms.

Long first advised she had hit a large rock that popped her tire and sent her into the ditch. Ms. Long later stated that her dog had jumped in the front seat causing her to run off the road. While speaking with Ms. Long her answers were very delayed and requested for every question to be repeated. Ms. Long did admit to using Gabapentin and marijuana for seizures. Ms. Long did consent to S.F.S.T and she did not perform satisfactory. Deputy placed Ms. Long in custody for Driving Under the Influence. Ms. Long was read Tennessee Implied Consent several times and refused to answer a request for a blood draw. While Deputy Gray was inventorying the vehicle he did find a prescription bottle labeled hydrocodone but was marked out with pencil and labeled "levoxy" as well as a loaded 40 caliber JCP Highpoint Firearm.

Deputy then transported Ms. Long to the Loudon County Jail at which time he did also charge Ms. Long with Possession of a Firearm While Under the Influence (39-17-1321) and Possession of Legend Drug (53-10-105). Said did all occur in Loudon County, TN.

when she proceeded to stick both middle fingers in the air and stated "F" You". Alicia Gabriel continued walking toward the front of the residence and appeared very agitated. Deputy then caught up to her and told her to put her hands behind her back, for his safety. Alicia Gabriel was unwilling to comply with lawful orders. At that time, Deputy grabbed Alicia Gabriel's arm and assisted her to the ground, where she continued to resist but was eventually taken into custody. an alcoholic beverage emitting from Alicia Gabriel's person. Victim stated he was involved in an argument with the suspect and was trying to get away from her. He further stated she cornered him, pushed him, and hit him. Victim further stated Suspect bit him on the arm when he was attempting to restrain her. Deputy did observe visible injuries on the Victim's arm. Alicia Gabriel was determined to be the primary aggressor. Alicia Gabriel was evaluated by EMS, arrested, and transported to the Loudon County Justice Center. This did occur in Loudon County, TN.

lice Officer Nicholas Scott Grainger, EOW February 24, 2019; and, Sergeant Steve Hinkle with the Sullivan County Sheriff's Office, EOW February 26, 2018. Both were valued members of the law enforcement community in the Eastern District of Tennessee.

In October 1962, Congress enacted a joint resolution, which the President signed, declaring May 15th as National Peace Officers Memorial Day to honor law enforcement officers killed or disabled in the line of duty. The resolution also created National Police Week as an

annual tribute to law enforcement service and sacrifice. "National Police Week is a time for all of us to reflect upon and celebrate the contributions of police officers from around the country, recognizing their hard work, dedication, loyalty, and commitment in keeping our communities safe. As the United States Attorney for the Eastern District of Tennessee, I want to thank all of our federal, state, local, and tribal law enforcement officers, who often face uncertain and dangerous situations, and ensure them that they have the unwavering support and appreciation from the U.S. Attorney's office," said U.S. Attorney Overbey.

According to statistics reported to the FBI, 106 law enforcement officers

were killed in line-of-duty incidents in 2018.

Comprehensive data tables about these incidents and brief narratives describing the fatal attacks are included in the sections of Law Enforcement Officers Killed and Assaulted, 2018 <https://ucr.fbi.gov/leoka/2018/> released this week by the FBI.

The names of all 106 fallen officers nationwide will be formally dedicat-

ed on the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial in Washington, DC, during the 31st Annual Candlelight Vigil on the evening of May 13, 2019. No tickets are required, and everyone is welcome. For additional information please call 202-737-3400.

The Candlelight Vigil is one of many commemorative events taking place in the nation's capital during National Police Week 2019.

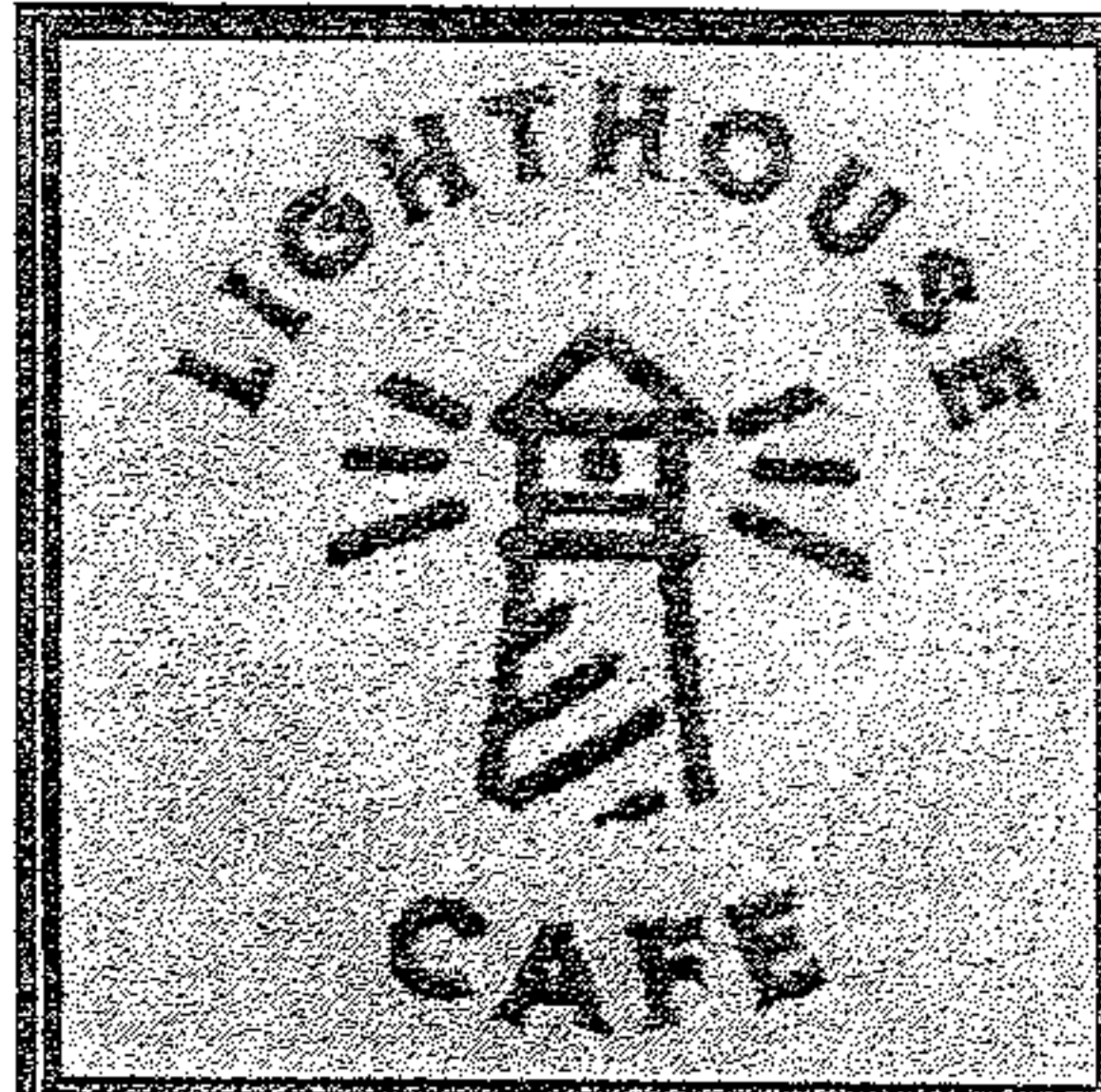

homa. Rob said he and Tammy grew up surrounded by law enforcement and an extended family of sorts created by New Mexico State Police colleagues who were committed to remembering their dad. He stressed that seeking justice is important for his father and for every officer who goes to work and then doesn't return home to his or her family. "Every year there are police officers being shot," Rob Rosenbloom said. "They have to know that they are not going to be forgotten." On Wednesday, May 15, 2019, the nation will come together at the 38th Annual National Peace Officers' Memorial Service to remember law enforcement personnel who lost their lives while protecting their communities. It is one of the most solemn of the events during Police Week, which is celebrated annually to mark the daily commitment, service, and sacrifices of law enforcement. "During Police Week, we honor the memory of those we have lost and intensify our commitment to bring to justice those responsible for killing or injuring members of the law

enforcement community," said FBI Executive Assistant Director Amy Hess. "It is imperative that we continue all efforts to find—and ultimately hold accountable—those fugitives. We are hopeful the focused attention to these cases will generate new tips for the FBI and our partners."

According to the most recent figures released by the FBI's Law En-

forcement Officers Killed and Assaulted (LEOKA) Program, there were 106 law enforcement officer deaths in 2018 alone; 55 of those officers were killed feloniously. Each death leaves a family mourning, a department missing a colleague, and a community going without one of the men or women who worked to keep them safe.

This Police Week, the FBI is highlighting eight cas-

es that led to the deaths of six officers and resulted in serious injuries to three others. They date back as far as 1971, in Rosenbloom's case, and occurred as recently as 2013 with the unsolved murder of Officer Jason Ellis in Kentucky. In all eight cases, justice has not yet been served. Either the perpetrators are unknown or the person suspected or convicted of the crime has escaped or evaded capture.

The FBI and the Sacramento County Sheriff's Department are seeking information that will lead to the person or persons involved in the death of Deputy Jeffrey Mitchell.

Mitchell was patrolling

rural Sacramento County during the predawn hours of October 27, 2006, when he logged into his in-vehicle computer to inform dispatch that he was going to investigate a suspicious white Chevrolet van. Mitchell reported that he could see at least one person at the vehicle.

"At some point during the contact, the dispatcher heard his radio microphone click," said Sergeant Tony Turnbull, a homicide detective with the Sacramento County Sheriff's Office and friend of Mitchell's. "When they radioed back to him, there was no answer."

The dispatcher immediately called for other patrol vehicles to come to the scene. When units arrived, they found Mitchell had been shot in the head with his service weapon after a violent struggle.

Mitchell was a nine-year veteran of the Sacramento County Sheriff's Department, a skilled baseball player, a husband, and the father to a 6-year-old boy.

Turnbull said the department took his death extremely hard. "We take these risks every day, but Deputy Mitchell's murder was one of the first we had in quite a long time. And there were not a whole lot of answers right away."

Turnbull said several hundred people from

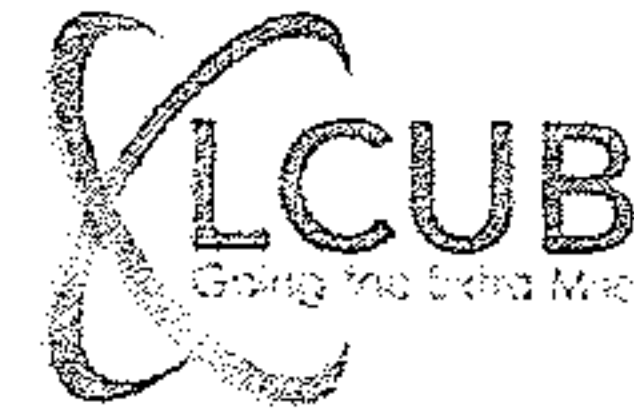

multiple agencies, including the FBI, California Highway Patrol, the Elk Grove Police Department, and the Rancho Cordova Police Department, assisted in the intense early phases of the investigation. That investigation remains active for Sacramento County and the FBI, who want answers and justice for Mitchell's family and the department he served.

"This is something we would never let go," said Turnbull. "Not just because he's one of our own, but that's the way we do things. We don't forget." Turnbull said the sheriff's office has sifted through more than 4,000 tips and leads. "We follow up on every piece of information we receive. And we are looking for something that will push us over the finish line."

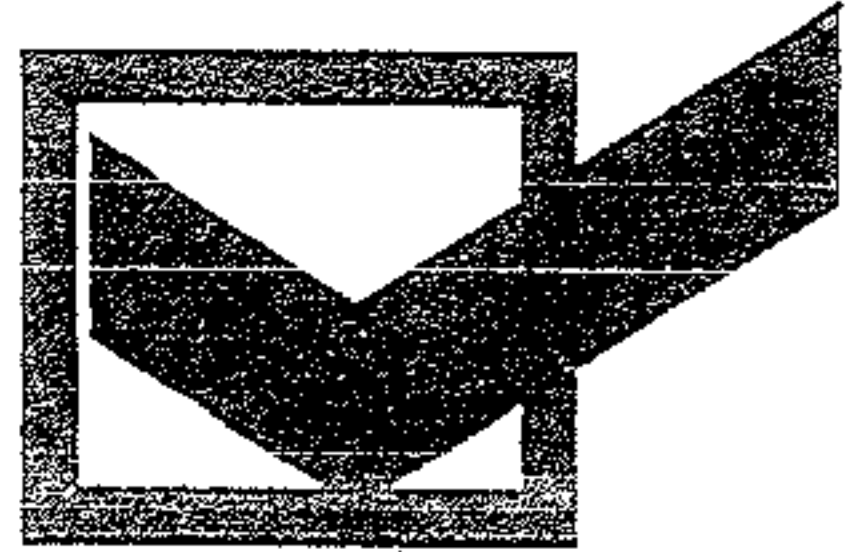
