





Tara Litwin, 24, Old Hwy 95 Lenoir City, was charged with Simple Possession.

Larry Muller, 22, Rocks Spring Road Lenoir City, was charged with Driving on Revoked/Suspended License.

Cpl. M. Fagiana LCSO, was dispatched to a disturbance involving a male who had pulled a firearm on a female subject on Hotchkiss Valley Road. Fagiana, Sgt. Bowen and Deputy Pesterfield were

on the scene when the vehicle driven by the suspect went by. Per the witness account and statements, the suspect later identified as Larry Muller was still armed with some type of handgun. Traffic stop was conducted on the vehicle on Old Hwy 95 in front of Lenoir City High School to determine the suspect involvement in the incident. Matthew Spurling, 24, Breazeale Road Lenoir City, was charged with Unlawful Carrying or Possession of a Weapon. Deputy Pesterfield LCSO, responded to Hotchkiss Valley Road. Upon arrival Deputy met the complainant who stated he opened his door to let another resident in and witnessed 2 people

on his porch. When leaving complainant stated a male subject on the property was pointing a gun at her as she drove by. Deputy spoke with witness who stated 2 subjects at Breazeale Road got into an altercation with both producing a firing weapons at each other. Complainant stated she has called in the past about the residence on Breazeale Road shooting weapons. Sgt. Bowen made contact

with 3 subjects outside the residence due to the totality of the circumstance the subjects were ordered to the ground. Sgt. Ask the offender identified as Mathew Spurling if he had anything on him to which he stated he had a gun in his waistband. Sgt. Did recover a 9mm hi-point from inside his waistband. The handgun contained 10 rounds of ammo. Spurling is a convicted felon out of Georgia.

counterintelligence threat to the U.S. and other countries. The Chinese intelligence services strategically use every

tool at their disposal—including state-owned businesses, students, researchers, and ostensibly private companies—to systematically steal information and intellectual property “China has pioneered a societal approach to stealing innovation any way it can, from a wide array of businesses, universities, and organizations,” Wray said.

Wray said the FBI has China-related economic espionage investigations in nearly all of its 56 field offices and in nearly every industry. “Put plainly, China seems determined

to steal its way up the economic ladder, at our expense,” Wray said.

In recent months, the U.S. government charged Chinese tech giant Huawei with theft of trade secrets and other offenses. Chinese government-affiliated hackers have also been subjected to indictments in the U.S. Wray described the variety of resources that the FBI uses to thwart terrorists, spies, and criminals, such as multi-agency task forces, international legal attaché offices, and rapid response teams. Partnerships, whether with other government agencies or the private sector, are key to carrying out the FBI’s mission and something the FBI continues to strengthen. Wray said he meets with law enforcement, private sector, academic, and other FBI partners during his

travels throughout the U.S.

“In our country, the vast majority of our critical infrastructure and intellectual property is of course in the hands of the private sector,” Wray said. “You own it, you run it, you’re on the front lines. ... That’s why it’s so important for these lines of communication to be open.” Wray also said the recent terrorist attacks in Sri Lanka are a reminder that terrorism remains a

persistent danger, although smaller plots from homegrown violent extremists are also a threat—one that is more challenging for law enforcement to thwart ahead of time. “These are people moving from radicalization to attack in weeks, or even days, not years,” Wray said. “And they’re doing it online and in encrypted messaging platforms, not in some camp or cave.”
