



Christopher Johnson, 26, Homeless Loudon, was charged with Man/Sell/ Del/Resale Sch. IV, and Man/Sell/Poss. Of Controlled Substance. Officer Sam Harrison LPD, observed a male subject slumped over in the driver seat of a black vehicle in the parking lot of the

Loudon Court House Annex. The driver was identified as Christopher Johnson, had apparently fallen asleep while writing himself a check with someone else's checks. When Officer asked for his ID, Johnson produced a gray metal money box and opened in Officer Presence. Officer observed numerous

pill bottles within the box. When ask about the pills Johnson stated he bought them from a female to help her out. Inside the box were approx.. 162 Gabapentin pills, an additional bottle with 121 pills was located

in the back seat. Located on Johnson person were 5 Xanax pills, and \$332 in cash, and 2 more Xanax in the floorboard. Christopher Johnson was placed under arrest and transported to the Loudon County Jail.
