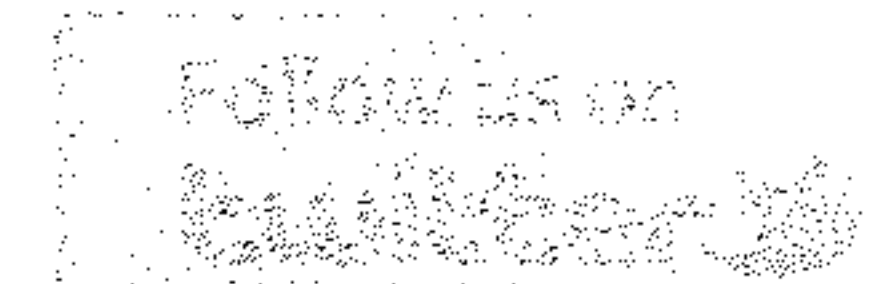

## Knoxville man sentenced to 324 months in prison for production and possession of child pornography

Dustin Schaud Fox, 29, of Knoxville, Tennessee, was sentenced by the Honorable Pamela L. Reeves, Chief U.S. District, to serve 324 months in federal prison for coercing a minor to engage in sexually explicit conduct for the pur-

pose of producing child pornography and for possessing child pornography. Following his imprisonment, Fox will be supervised by the U.S. Probation Office for 20 years and will be required to register with the state sex

**Pills**

Christopher Johnson, 26, Homeless Loudon, was charged with Man/Sell/Del/Resale Sch. IV, and Man/Sell/Poss. Of Controlled Substance. Officer Sam Harrison LPD, observed a male subject slumped over in the driver seat of a black vehicle in the parking lot of the

Loudon Court House Annex. The driver was identified as Christopher Johnson, had apparently fallen asleep while writing himself a check with someone else's checks. When Officer asked for his ID, Johnson produced a gray metal money box and opened in Officer Presence. Officer observed numerous

pill bottles within the box. When ask about the pills Johnson stated he bought them from a female to help her out. Inside the box were approx.. 162 Gabapentin pills, an additional bottle with 121 pills was located

in the back seat. Located on Johnson person were 5 Xanax pills, and \$332 in cash, and 2 more Xanax in the floorboard. Christopher Johnson was placed under arrest and transported to the Loudon County Jail.



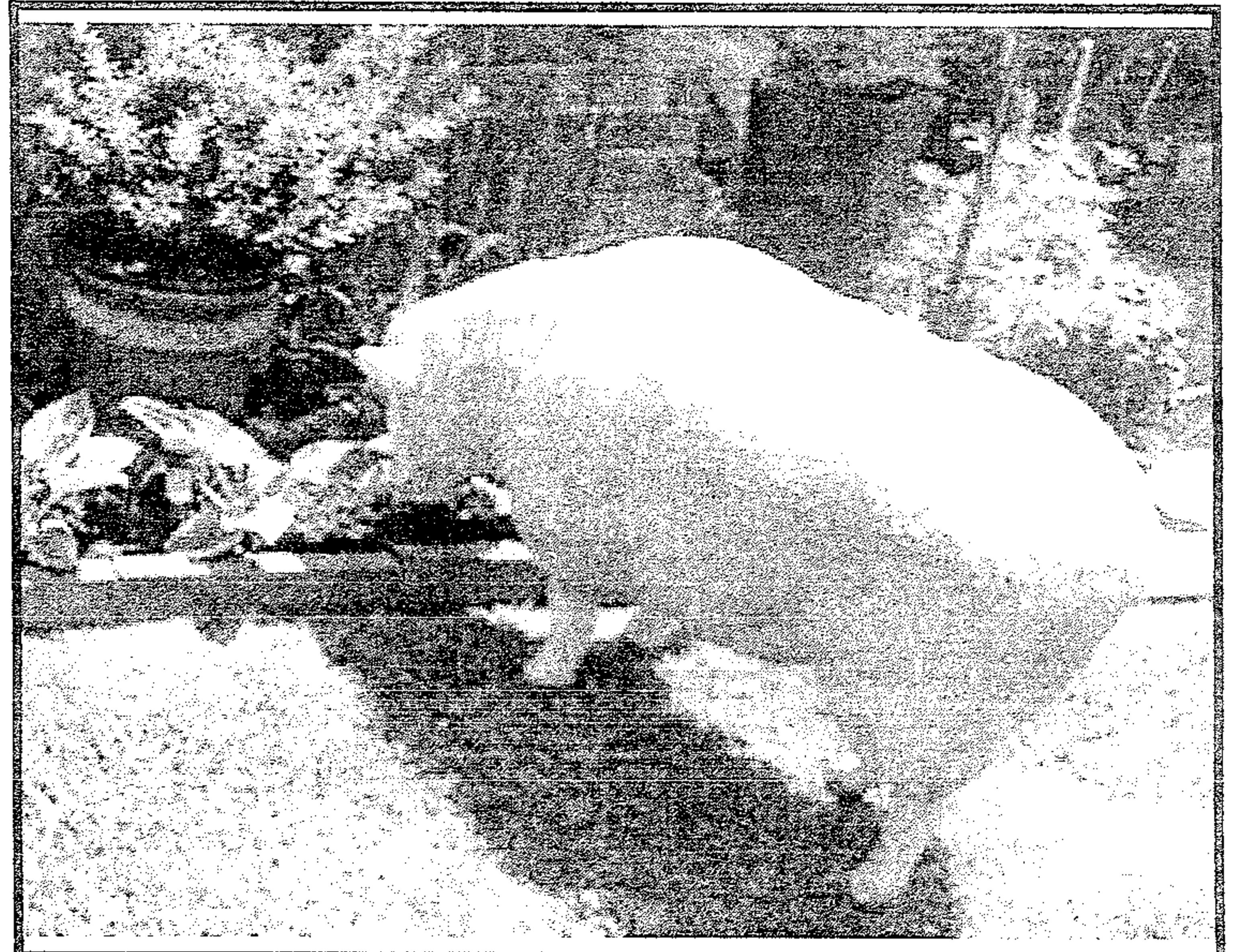

The Loudon County Commission will hold a public hearing at 6:00 p.m. on Monday, August 5, 2019, in the boardroom at the Loudon County Courthouse Annex, 101 Mulberry St., Loudon, TN, to receive public comments regarding amending the Zoning Map of Loudon County, TN to rezone approximately 20.18 acres, Parcel 004.00, Tax Map 078, 10616 East Coast Tellico Parkway, in the 3rd Legislative District, from R-1, Suburban Residential District to R-1, Suburban Residential District with Planned Unit Development (PUD) overlay, 2.5 units per acre.

offender registry in any state in which he lives, works, or attends school.

The investigation arose after the mother of a 14 year-old girl in Texas informed a local law enforcement agency that an adult male, later identified as Fox, had established an online relationship with her daughter and had directed the minor to record videos of herself engaged in sexually explicit conduct and send them to him through social media.

"This prosecution represents part of our ongoing efforts to work with law enforcement agencies to protect children from persons who would manipulate them online for child pornography," said J. Douglas Overbey, U.S. Attorney for the Eastern District

of Tennessee. U.S. Attorney Overbey encouraged parents to be vigilant concerning the online activities of their children, stating, "These child predators secretly operate from the shadows of the internet, seek out vulnerable minors, pretend to befriend them, and then prey upon the minors' vulnerability, unbeknownst to the parents."

The case was investigated locally by the Knoxville Police Department's Internet Crimes Against Children unit. Assistant U.S. Attorney Matthew T. Morris represented the United States at trial.

This case was brought as part of Project Safe Childhood (PSC), a nationwide initiative to combat the growing epidemic of child sexual exploitation and abuse launched in May 2006 by the Department of Jus-

tice. Led by U.S. Attorneys' Offices and the Criminal Division's Child Exploitation and Obscenity Section, PSC marshals federal, state and local resources to better locate, apprehend and prosecute individuals who exploit children via the Internet, as well as to identify and rescue victims. arrival he observed a white vehicle with Ohio tags with a male asleep in the passenger seat. Officer approached the vehicle Jeremy Dison walked from the porch of the residence and Officer ordered him to come closer. Dison then turned and walked back to the porch and Officer heard a heavy object impact the decking. Officer order Dison to return with his hand visible. Once Dison was secure Officer approached the porch and located a black pistol and a 40 caliber bullet laying to the left of the door. Dison was the only person on the porch. A close look at the pistol revealed the removal of the serial number. While Officer was speaking with Dison a text message on his

phone was visible to Officer stating get the gun off the porch. The text was sent to another person in the residence. The keys to the vehicle were located on Dison. Clothing and other item belonging to Dison were located in the vehicle. The vehicle was reported stolen out of Ohio. Jeremy Dison was placed under arrest and transported to the Loudon County Jail.
