

The trial is set for November 12, 2019, in front of United States

District Judge Thomas A. Varlan. If convicted of the methamphetamine distribution conspiracy charge, each

defendant faces a minimum mandatory term of at least 10 years and up to life in prison, at least 5 years of supervised release, a fine of up to \$10,000,000, criminal forfeiture, and a \$100 special assessment.

FBI Agents and Knoxville Police Officers are looking for Alim Turner. Turner goes by the street name "Baby Popoff." Turner stands 5' 9" and weighs 170 pounds. He is known to carry firearms. 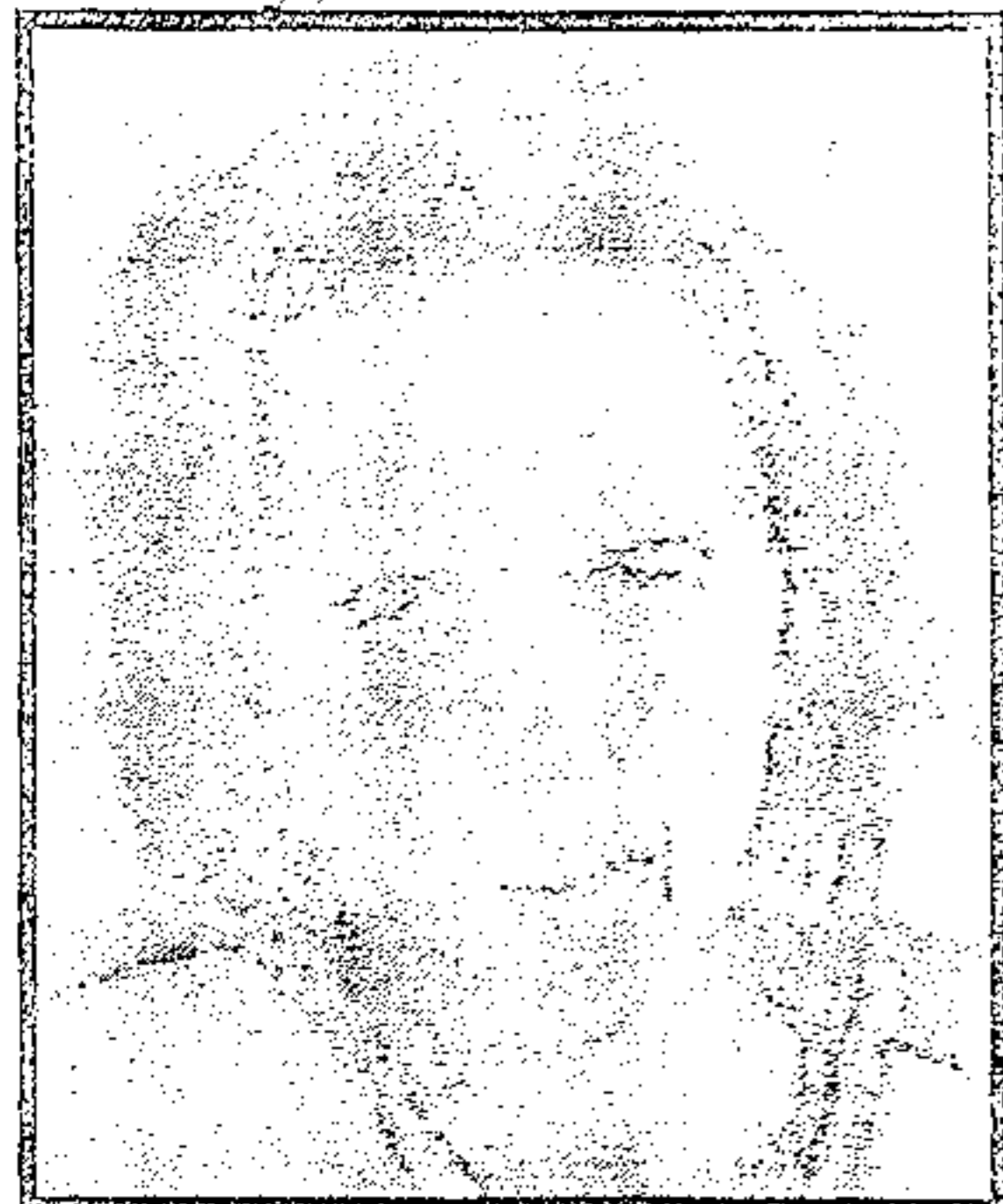
