

Reckless Evading Driver Tells Officer "I was scared, I'll Run Every Time!"

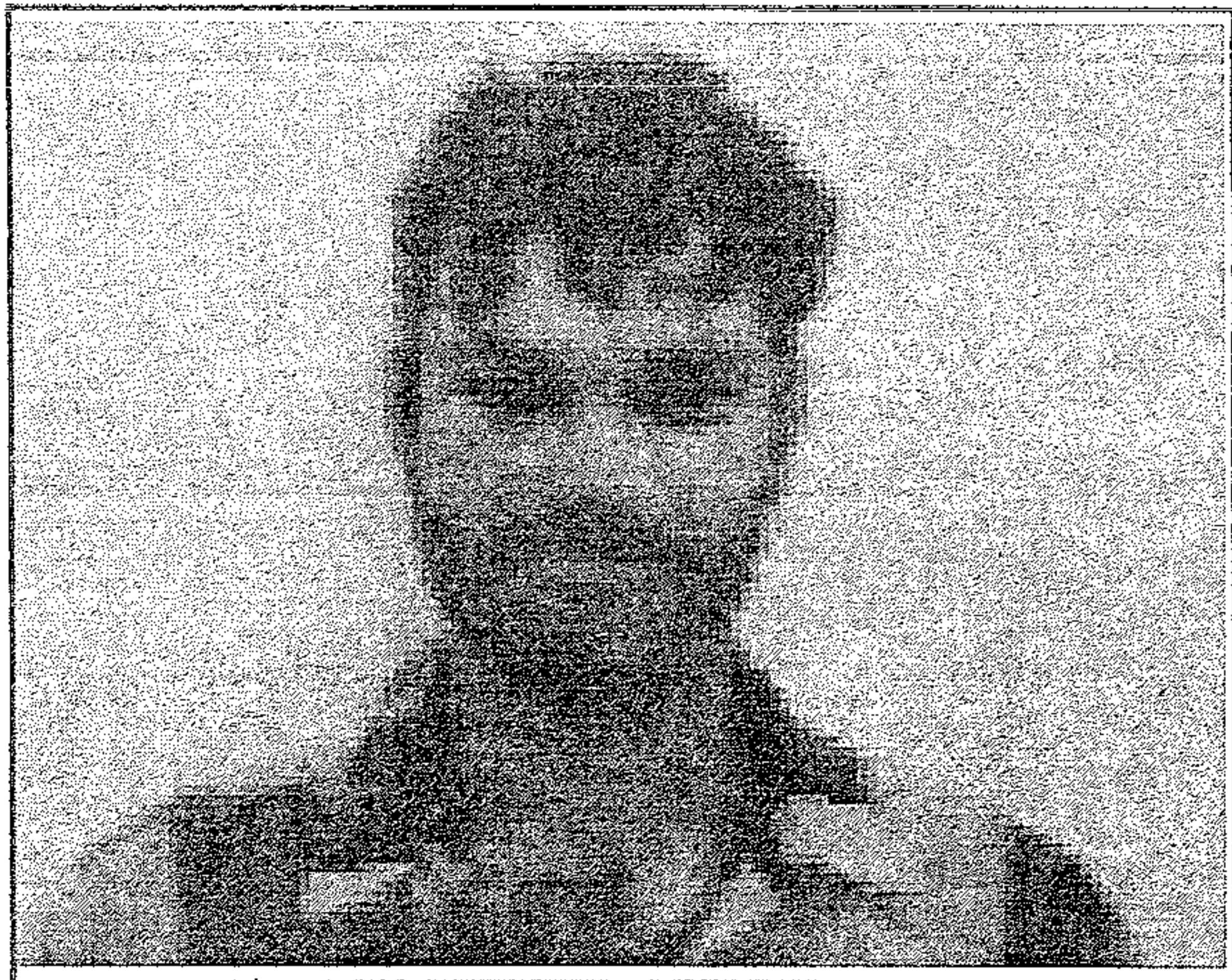

DOJ Charges More Than 14,200 Defendants With Firearms-Related Crimes In FY20

The Department of Justice announced it has charged more than 14,200 defendants with firearms-related crimes during Fiscal Year (FY) 2020, despite the challenges of COVID 19 and its impact on the criminal justice process. These cases have been a Department priority since November 2019 when Attorney General William P. Barr announced his commitment to investigating,

prosecuting, and combating gun crimes as a critical part of the Department's anti-violent crime strategy. These firearms-related charges result from the critical law enforcement partnership between United States Attorneys' Offices and the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives, led by Acting Director Regina Lombardo, who has

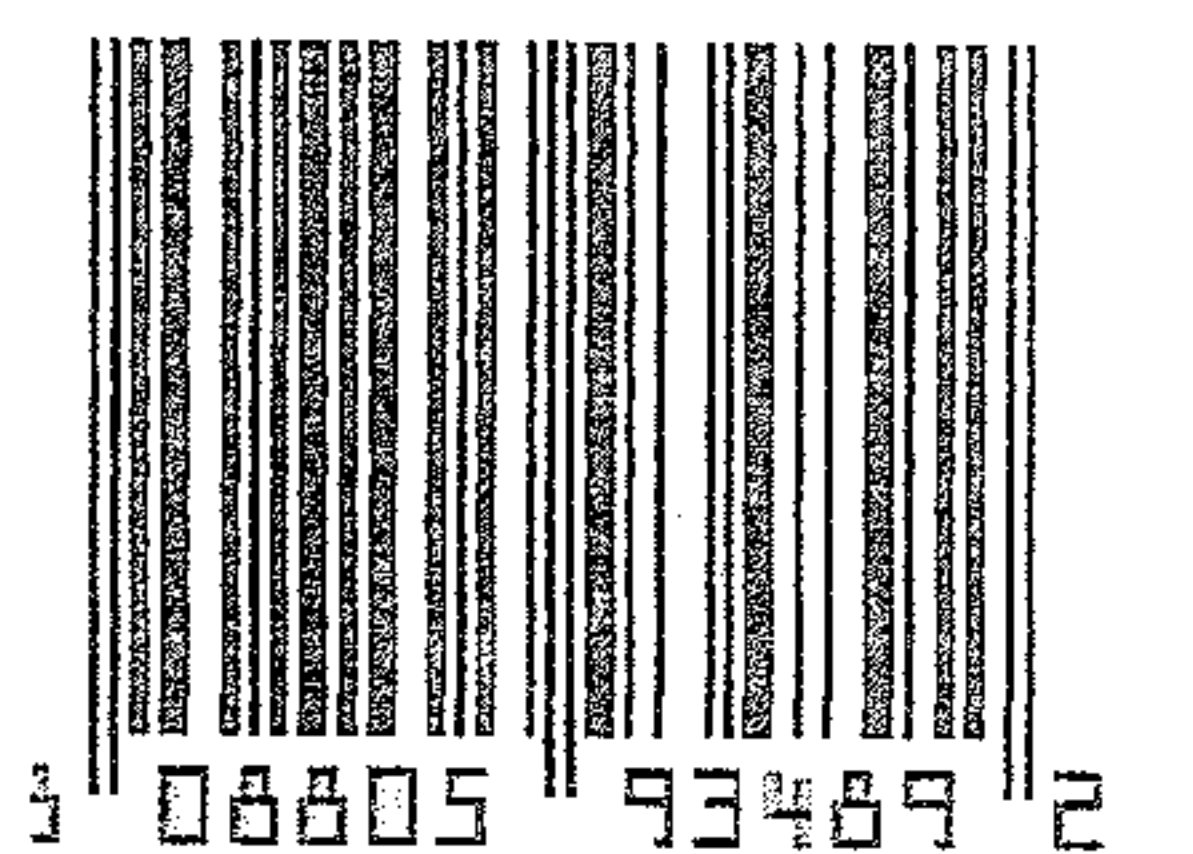

Deputy then initiated a traffic stop on Fork Creek Road and Highway 11, the Mustang then ran through the stop sign and across Highway 11 onto Christian Street failing to stop. It then drove in the other lane of traffic around a vehicle traveling in the same direction.

Deputy pursued the vehicle and it turned left on Church Street, then we went right onto Spring Street. The vehicle continued to drive recklessly sliding on the roadway when it turned. It then turned left onto McCrary Street and left again onto Pond Creek. The vehicle continued on Pond Creek, then again passed a vehicle in the wrong lane of traffic recklessly in a curve. It then turned into the Marathon on Pond Creek Road and came to a stop.

At that time the three occupants in the vehicle were detained. The driver, John Stone, and two passengers. When Deputy spoke with Mr. Stone he advised he did not stop because he does not have

a drivers license. He also stated, "I was scared, i'll run every time." While speaking with him Deputy noticed he was slurring his words and had watery bloodshot eyes. Deputy asked Mr. Stone had consumed anything and he stated he smoked meth and marijuana three days earlier. He then advised he smoked earlier this morning, after that he then again advised it was this afternoon. S.F.S.T. was preformed and it was unsatisfactory. Dep. B. Pesterfield LCSO, then conducted A.R.I.D.E. and it was unsatisfactory.

Based on my training and experience, statements and condition of Mr. Stone, S.F.S.T. and A.R.I.D.E. conducted by Dep. Pesterfield Mr. Stone was believed to be under the influence of narcotics. He was read Implied Consent and he refused. The two passengers were released with no charges. James Wrecker Service towed the vehicle from scene. Mr. Stone was placed into custody.

in with some papers and activated them, using them for the sum of \$4,000.00 at multiple locations including a PayPal account, but the main use was for cash.

The transactions made on the cards were made in several different jurisdictions. There was one transaction from her husbands account at Lake Country Market in Lenoir City, Tn in the amount of \$30.00. The theft of the credit cards, activation of the cards, and the \$30.00 transaction in Lenoir City did happen in Loudon County Tn.

The victim did advise Deputy that the fraudulent transactions

began on September 20th, 2019 and the last known fraudulent transaction occurred on October 6th, 2019. During this period she advised that she was in Florida on September 17th through the 27th,

2019. Her husband is currently living in North Dakota and has been there since August of 2018 for work. David Landry was located in Knox. County Jail. On 10/9/20 David Landry was transport-

ed from Knox County jail to Loudon County Jail on the active warrants from 10/14/19.

fering a reward of up to \$1 million for information leading directly to his arrest.

Villarreal-Hernandez, also known as "El Gato," is believed to hold an active leadership position in the Beltran Leyva Drug Trafficking Organization within the region of San Pedro Garza Garcia, Nuevo Leon, Mexico. He is also believed to be responsible for numerous murders in Mexico.

The victim of the Texas murder, 43, was shot while sitting in the passenger seat of his vehicle outside an upscale shopping center in a Dallas-Fort Worth suburb on May 22, 2013. His wife was standing near the driver's side door when her husband was killed. And the brazen ambush occurred in the early evening hours, while the center was full of shoppers.

According to evidence and testimony gathered in

the trials of those accused of tracking and killing the man, Villarreal-Hernandez ordered and financed a multi-year effort to find and watch the victim and then kill him. Investigators believe Villarreal-Hernandez had a long-standing personal grudge against the victim.

Several of the individuals involved in tracking and killing the victim have already pleaded guilty, have been tried and convicted, or are awaiting trial in federal court.

"The fact that Villarreal-Hernandez was willing to send people to the United States to track someone within the United States and then execute that person in a neighborhood in Texas—we need to set the example that this will not be tolerated," said Special Agent Gary Koenig.

Koenig has been investigating Villarreal-Hernandez with the FBI's Dallas Field

Office since the shooting occurred in 2013. El Gato's apparent role in trafficking drugs into the United States and the evidence linking him to more than 10 murders in Mexico have made this case a top priority for both U.S. and Mexican authorities. "He's a ruthless guy," Koenig said.

The FBI and Mexican authorities feel the publicity of the Top Ten list and such a large reward will help generate the tips they need to bring El Gato to justice.


Villarreal-Hernandez is 42 years old. He has black hair and brown eyes and stands 5 feet 4 inches tall. He is believed to weigh about 165 pounds and is likely hiding in Mexico. Villarreal-Hernandez should be considered armed and extremely dangerous.





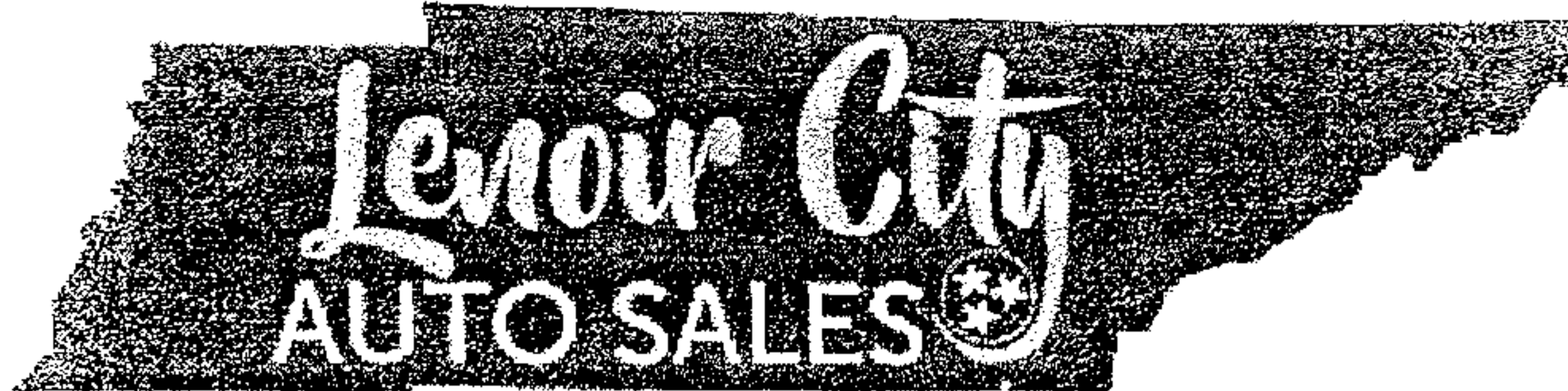

“The number one priority of government is to keep its citizens safe,” said Attorney General Barr. “By preventing firearms from falling into the hands of individuals who are prohibited from having them, we can stop violent crime before it happens. 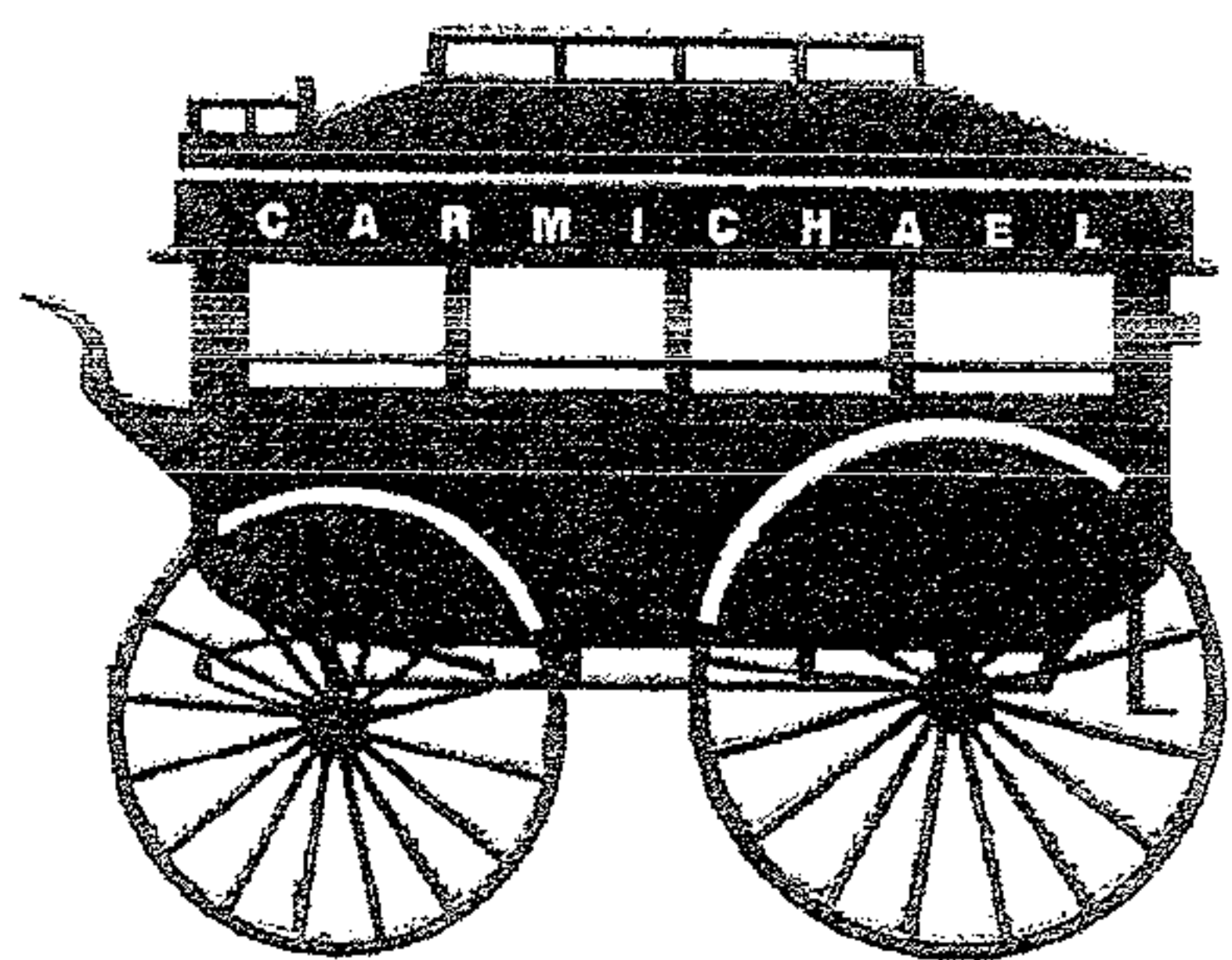

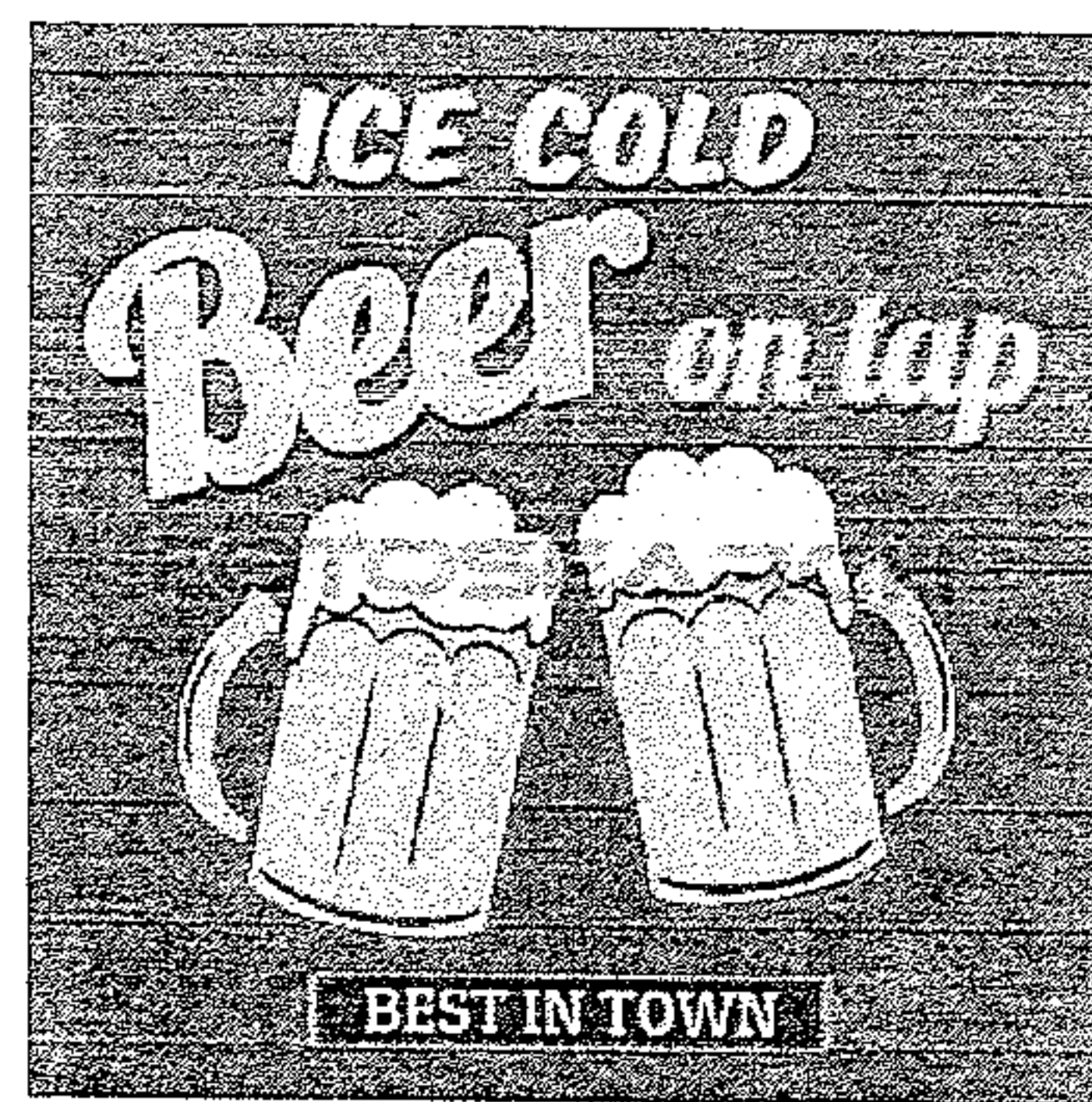

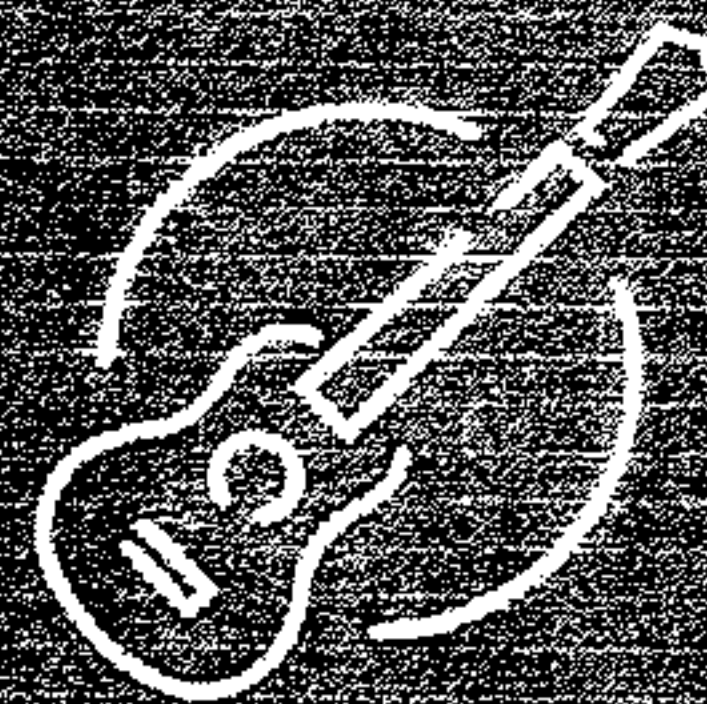

ously pursue and prosecute those who use firearms to commit violent crimes within our communities," said U.S. Attorney J. Douglas Overbey.

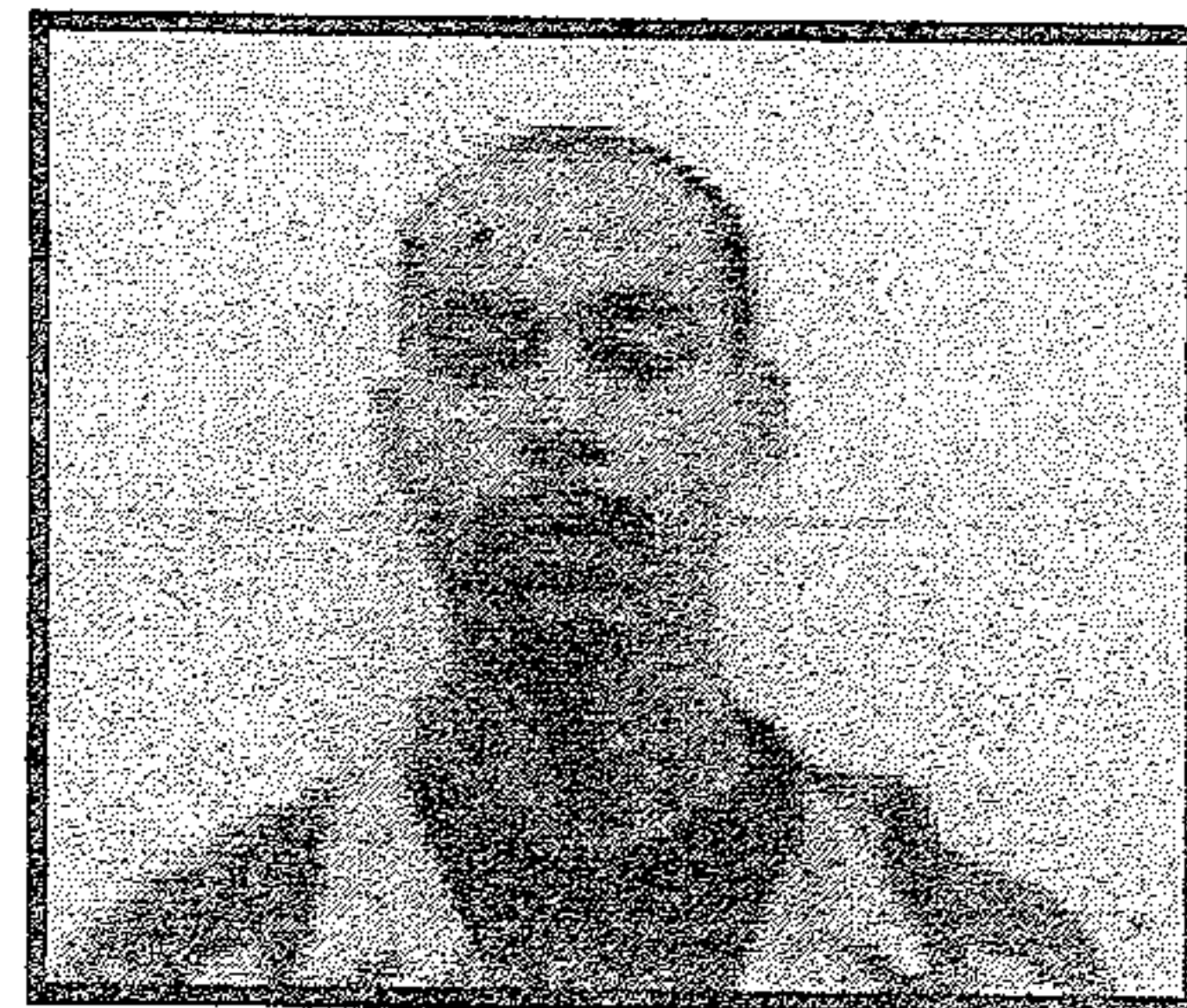
Under federal law, it is illegal to possess a firearm if one falls into one of nine prohibited categories, including being a felon, illegal alien, or unlawful user of a controlled substance. Further, it is unlawful to possess a firearm in furtherance of a drug trafficking offense or violent crime. It is also illegal to purchase – or even to attempt to illegally purchase - firearms if the buyer is a prohibited person or illegally purchasing a firearm on behalf of others. Lying on ATF Form 4473, which is used to lawfully purchase a firearm, is also a federal offense. The Department is committed to prosecuting these firearms offenses, and using all modern technologies available to law enforcement such as the National Integrated Ballistic Information Network, known as NIBIN, to promote gun crime intelligence. Keeping illegal firearms out of the hands of violent criminals will continue to be a priority of the Department of Justice and we will use all appropriate, available means to keep the law-abiding people of this country safe from gun crime.
