CDC Director Dr. Robert Redfield would like to thank the ACIP for all of their work in crafting these recommendations as interim guidance that both 1) health care personnel and 2) residents of long-term care facilities be offered COVID-19 vaccine in the initial phase of the vaccination program. Dr. Redfield

supports their recommendations and has signed the memo and accepted these interim recommendations.

Dr. Redfield looks forward to future recommendations that, based on vaccine availability, demonstrate that we as a Nation also prioritize the elderly (>70 yo) who reside in multi-gener-

Announcement of Maximum Effective Rate of Interest on Home Loans

The Federal National Mortgage Association has discontinued its free market auction system for commitments to purchase conventional home mortgages. Therefore, the Commissioner of Financial Institutions hereby announces that the maximum effective rate of interest per annum for home loans

as set by the General Assembly in 1987, Public Chapter 291, for the month of January, 2021 is 5.67 percent per annum.

The rate as set by the said law is an amount equal to four percentage points above the index of market yields of long-term government bonds adjusted to a thirty (30) year

maturity by the U. S. Department of the Treasury. For the most recent weekly average statistical data available preceding the date of this announcement, the calculated rate is 1.67 percent.

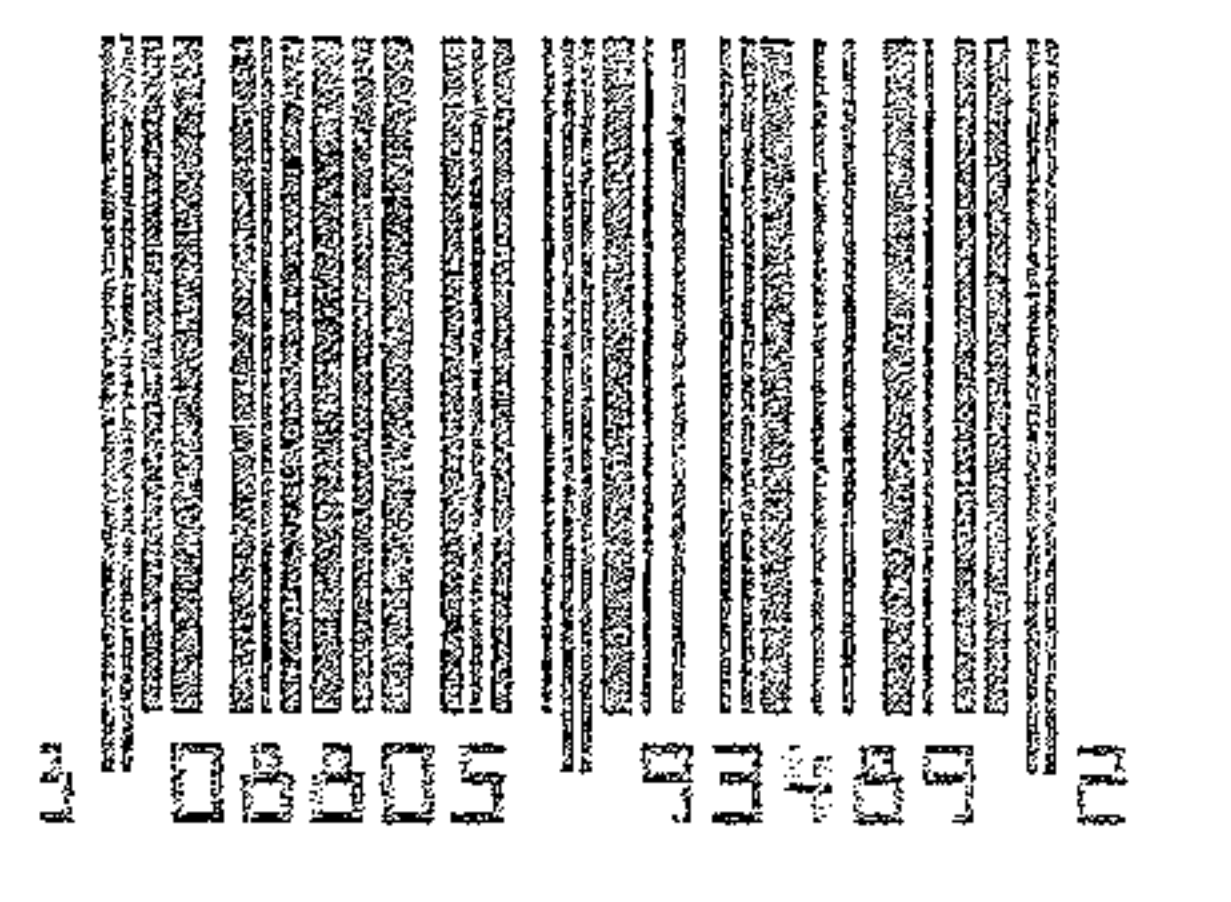

Deputy gave her the command to put the car in park, to which she looked at him and could not find the shift gear. After approximately 30 second, she was able to put the vehicle in park. Deputy instructed her to exit the vehicle, which she was able to do. As Ms. Humphreys was exiting the car, she was unsteady on her

feet and hysterical. She continued saying "I'm sorry" and tried to get in the back seat to get to her son. Her eyes appeared to be blood shot and her speech was slurred. Deputy also observed her pupils to be tightly constricted. Due to her actions, Deputy detained her and placed her in handcuffs. From there, Deputy escorted her to the back of his patrol car where Deputy asked her if she had taken anything (drugs or medications) this evening. At first she said no, but then she admitted to taking a Xanax and a "Roxy", which Deputy later identified as Oxycodone. She said that she had taken them 30 minutes ago. Due to her condition and her admission, Deputy placed her under arrest for DUI.

After placing her in the back of his patrol car, went

back to her car where Deputy was able to observe a cellphone with what appeared to be white residue on the floorboard behind the drivers seat. A subsequent search of the vehicle yielded (11) oxycodone pills in a clear, plastic baggie, (11) Xanax pills in leg cramps pill bottle, a small red straw with white residue inside it, and a small black bottle with (2) oxycodone pills inside.


The child was placed in the back seat of Deputy M. Rodriguez's car. The father of the child, was notified by Deputy Rodriguez. At the time of this report, the child was still with Deputy Rodriguez. The SUV was towed away from the scene by Moneymaker's.

Mrs. Humphreys was read Implied Consent and she consented to a voluntary blood draw. Deputy trans-

ported her to Fort Loudon Medical Center for the blood draw. From there, Deputy transported her to the Loudon County Jail without incident.

A DCS referral was made in regards to the child. The referral number is: 1336384705. All occurred in Loudon County, TN.
