## LC Mayor Aikens Makes It Official! Rockin the Docks 20th Anniversary July 4th Celebration!



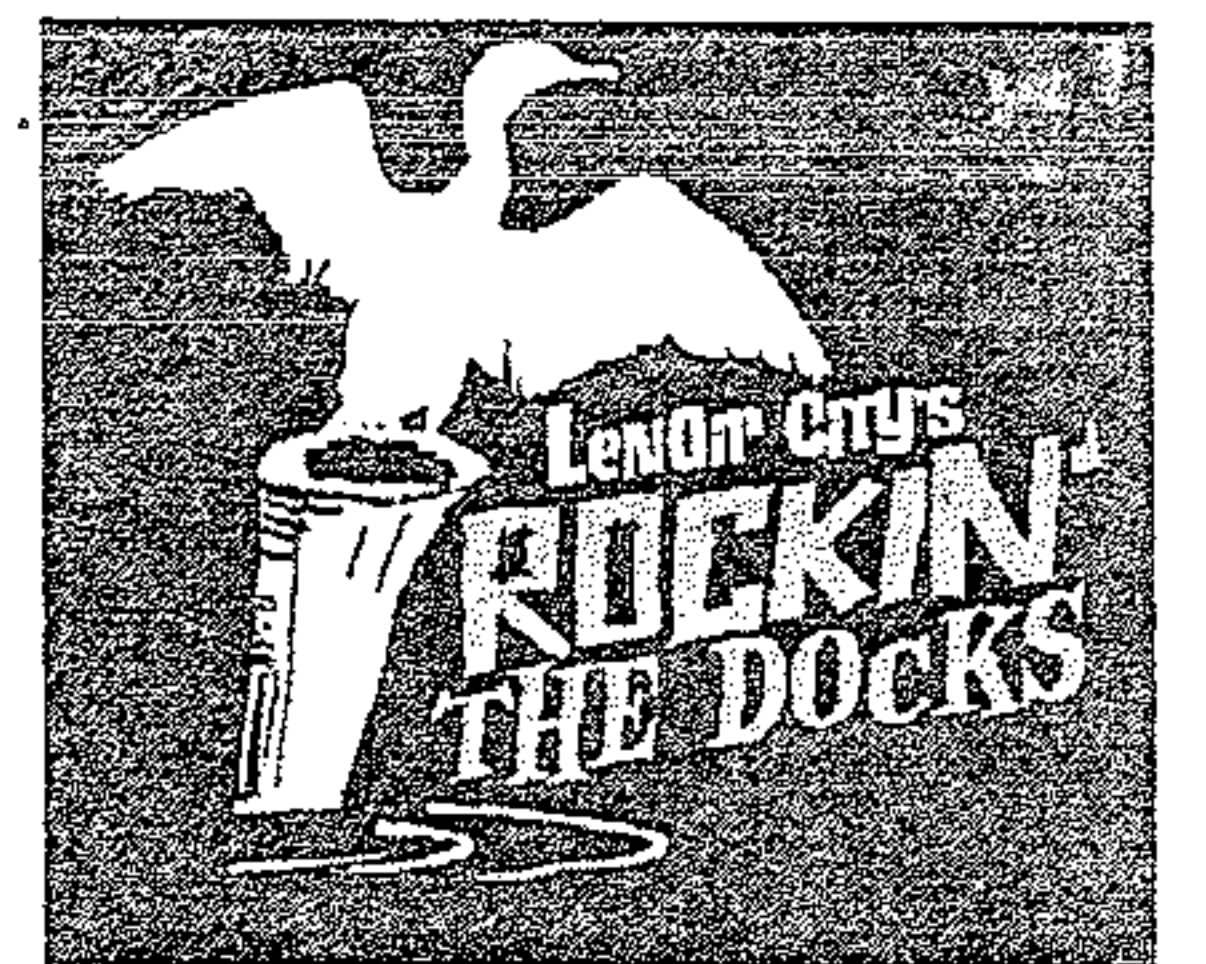

General Johnson's Office then filed an lawsuit which due to the Covid 19 Pandemic and the court being shut down has not been heard yet.
