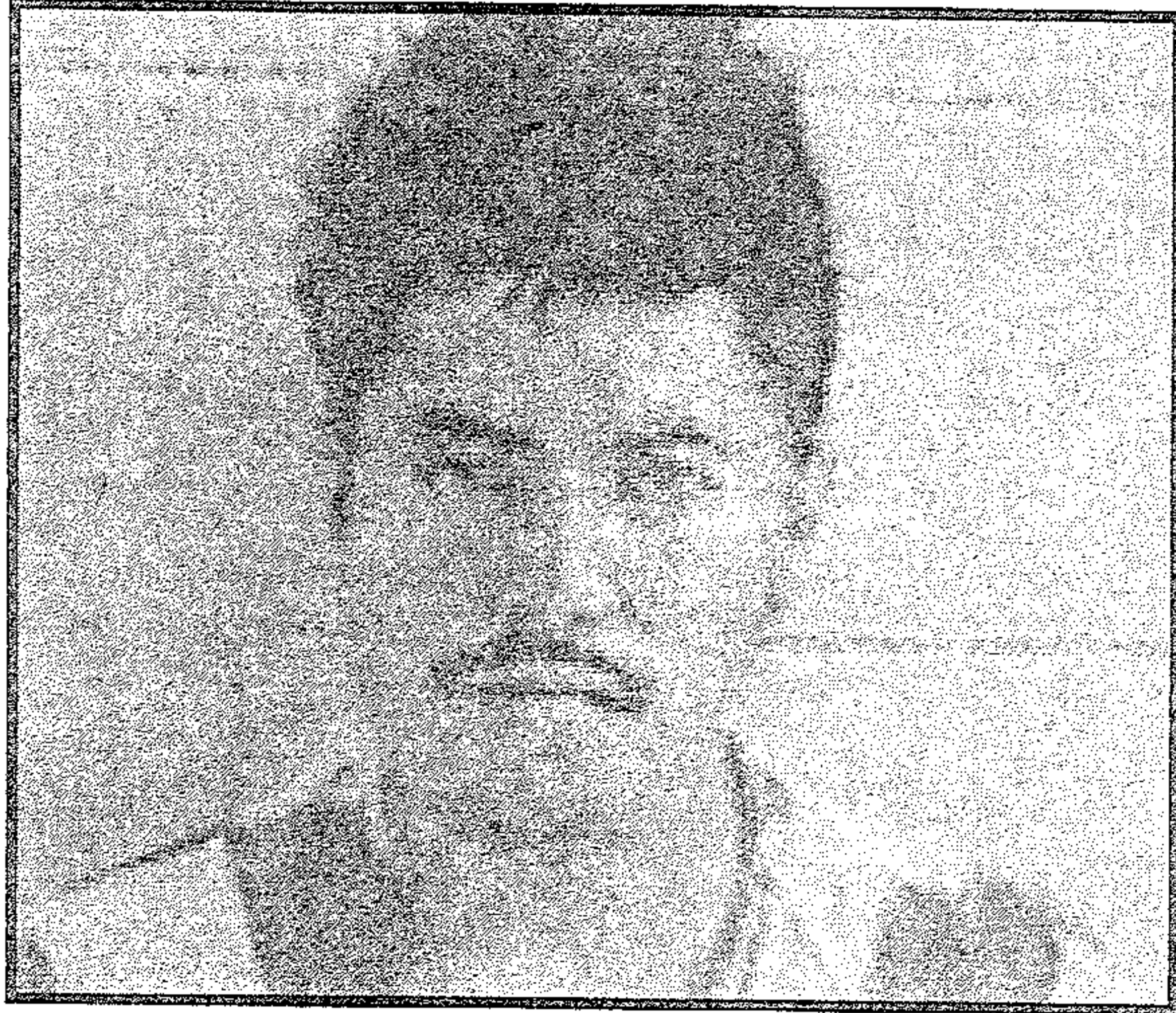

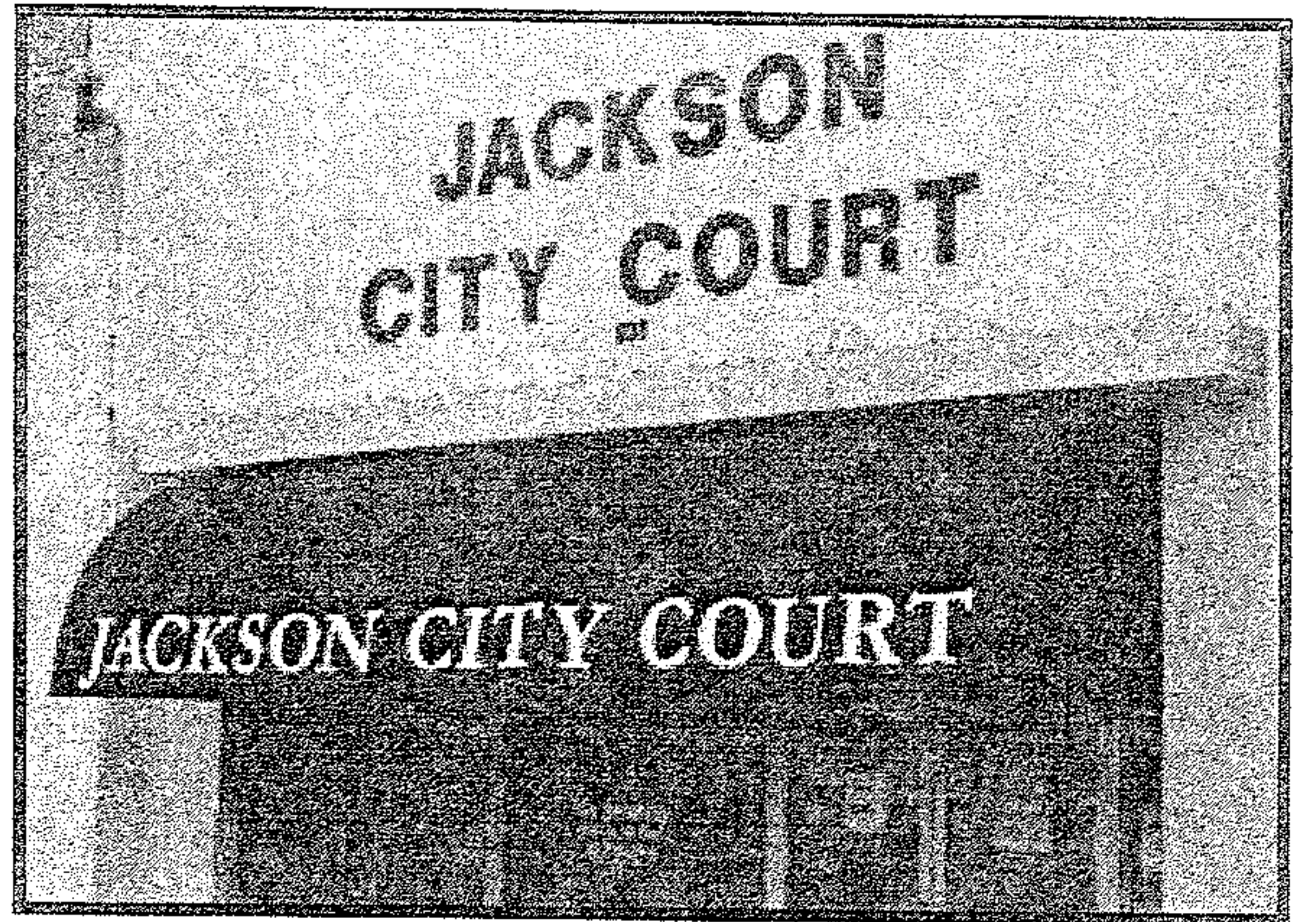

Problems Found Within Jackson City Court Clerk's Office

An investigation by the Tennessee Comptroller's Office has revealed numerous problems and irregularities within the office of Jackson City Court Clerk Daryl Hubbard.

Investigators discovered the clerk's office was not reporting case disposition information to the Tennessee Department of Safety and Homeland Security (TDOSHS) as required by state law. This information included DUI convictions,

No License

Santos Jesus, 25, Reed Spring Road Philadelphia, was charged with DUI, Driving without Valid License, Criminal Impersonation, Contributing to the Delinquency of a Minor, and violation of Implied Consent. Officer Benny Houser LPD, was dispatched for a reckless driver on Hwy 72 passing the dog park. After getting behind the vehicle Officer observed a blue vehicle cross the center line multiple times. Officer activated his emergency equipment, and the vehicle slowed down and put its emergency blinkers on and continued to drive in the center lane. The vehicle went back into his lane and finally stopped in the emergency lane.

As Deputy pulled in behind the vehicle the passenger threw a beer can out the sliding glass window. Officer made contact with the driver Santos Jesus and passenger Omar Palacios. Jesus stated he didn't have license and spoke no English. Jesus had a strong odor of an intoxicant about his person. Jesus had 2 ID'S, and 2 social Security card in his possession. Omar Palacios had been drinking and had a open 18 pack of beer. Both were placed under arrest and transported to the Loudon Jail where a transla-

tor was used to explain the charges.

Jason Ervin, 42, Kelly Lane Lenoir City, was charged with Theft, and Burglary. Officer Espinoza LCPD, transported Jason Ervin to the Loudon County Jail. Jason Ervin had 2 active warrants issued for theft and burglary. Deputy Jackson LCSO, served Ervin with the active warrants at the Loudon County Jail.

forfeitures of bail, and the failure to report a guilty plea.

Additionally, the clerk's office intentionally entered information into the wrong fields in its computer system. These actions effectively concealed failure to appear cases from TDOSHS, and hindered TDOSHS from promptly suspending driver licenses as required by law.

Investigators interviewed staff to determine why this information was intentionally entered incorrectly and staff stated that, in their opinion, a defendant should not be penalized for failing to appear in court.

The investigation also found irregularities in the handling of indigent cases, including reporting dispositions for two DUI cases related to one individual despite the fact that the cases had

been bound over to the Madison County Circuit Court. Staff admitted this was done to help the defendant get their license reinstated.

Investigators also noted multiple instances when the clerk failed to issue capiases (an order requiring an officer to take a named defendant into custody) within 30 days after entry of the court's order. Some capiases were entered between 46 and 106 days after being ordered.

In June 2020, the Madison County Grand Jury indicted City Court Office Manager Shenile Ward on two counts of forgery and two counts of official misconduct.

"Our investigators also noted several problems with how the clerk's office handles financial matters," said Comptroller Justin P. Wilson. "These include allow-
