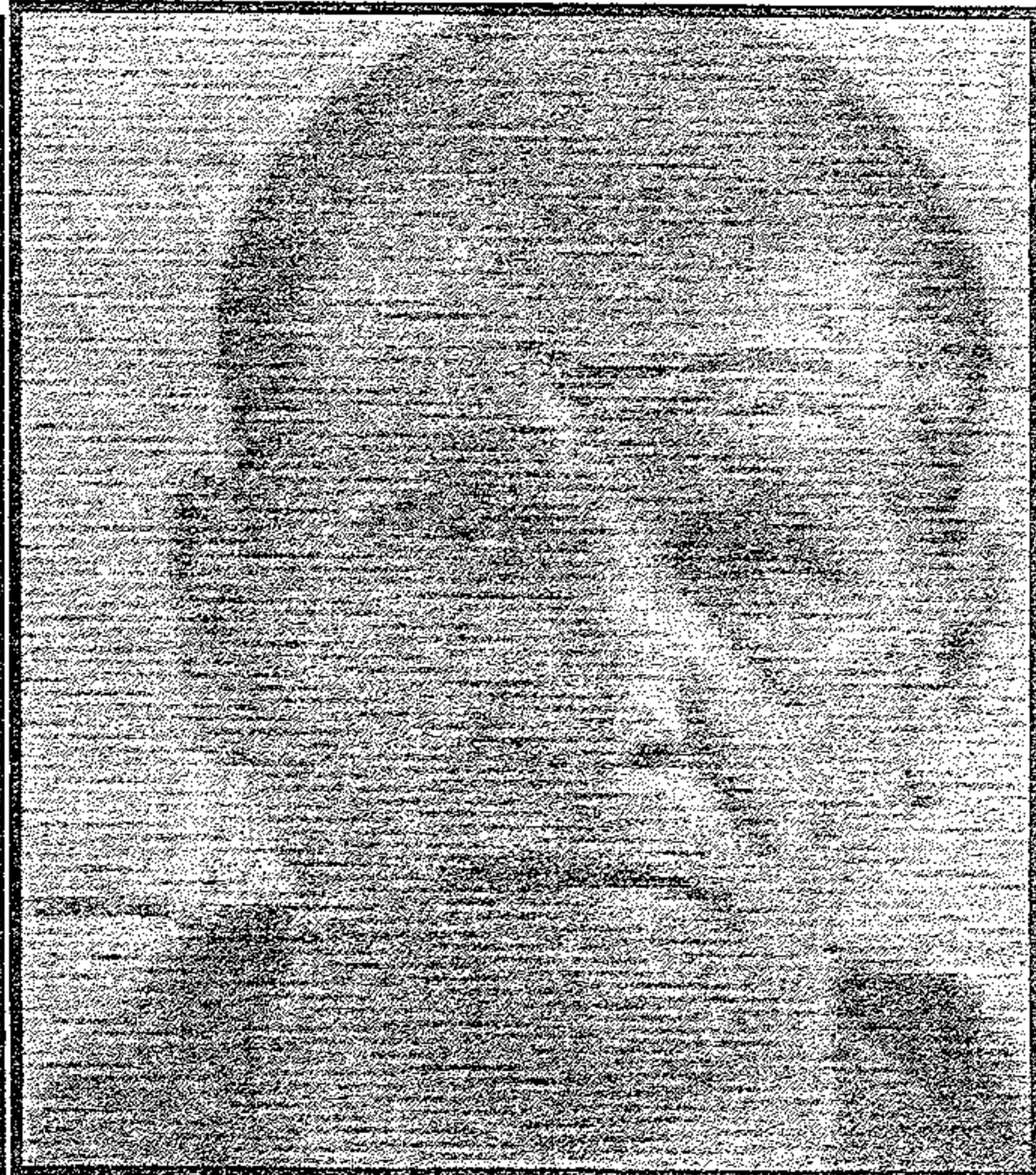

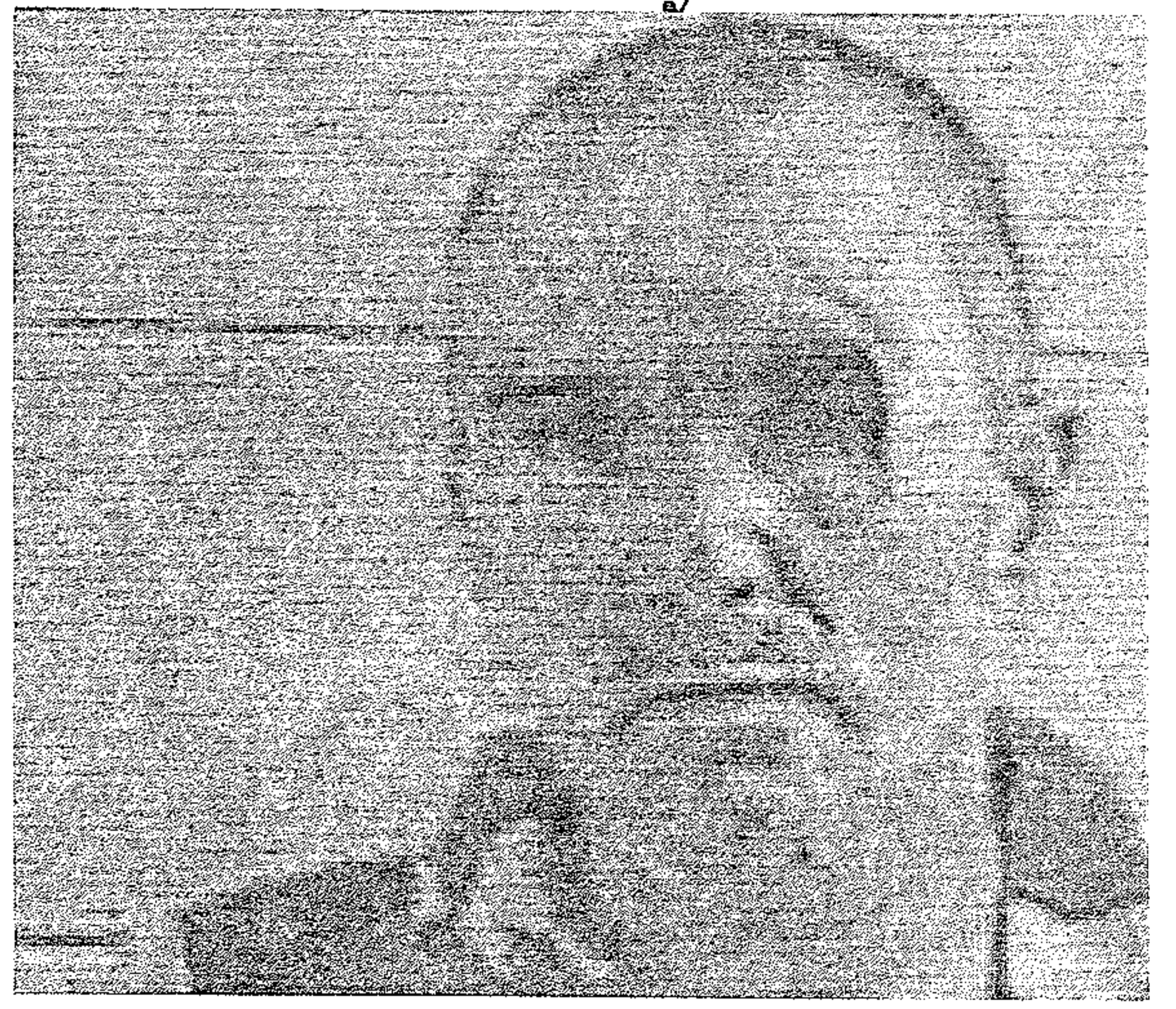

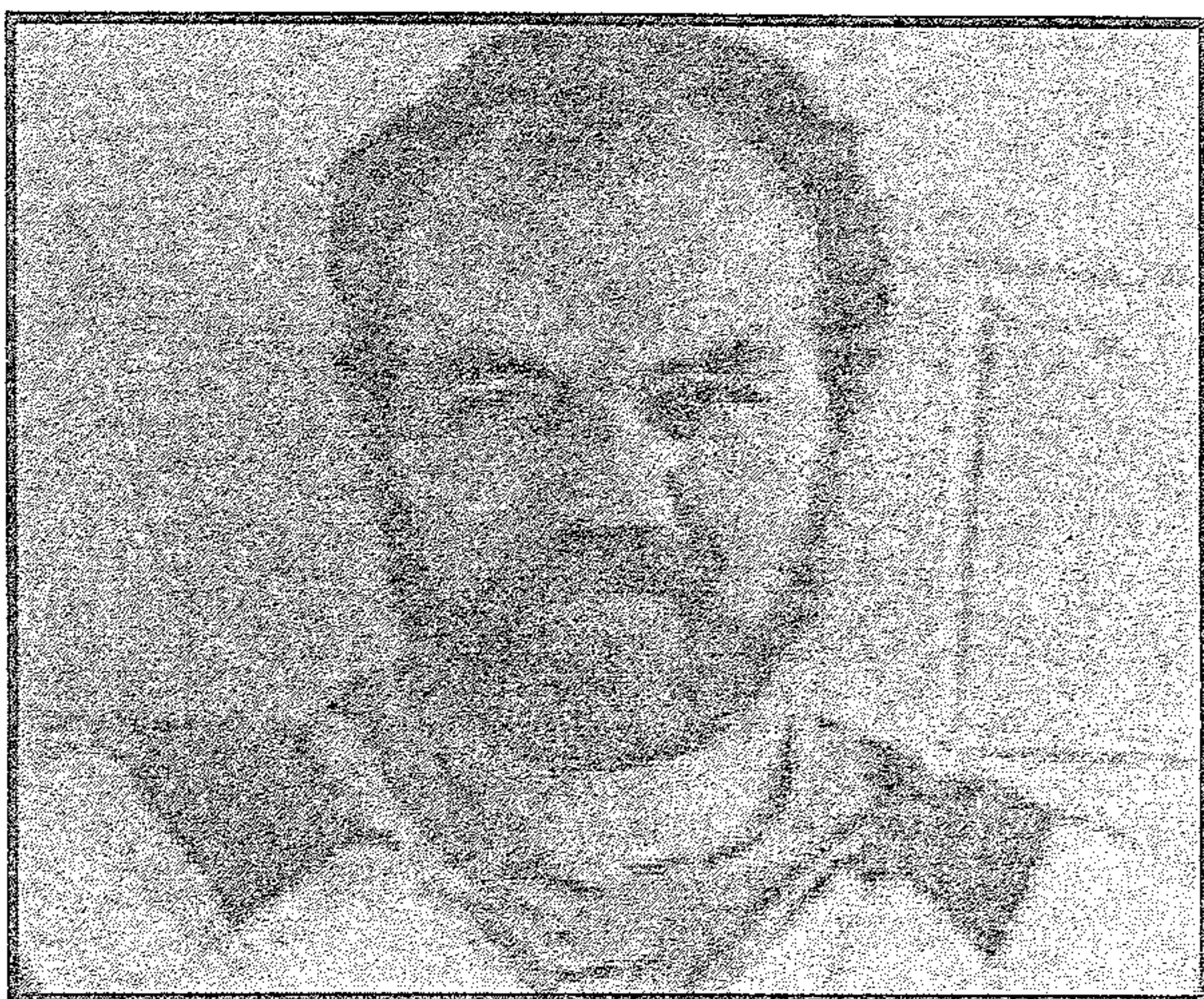

HHS Announces New Organ Transplant Guidance Update Improves Transplant Safety and Access to Lifesaving Organs

The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services and the U.S. Public Health Service (USPHS) published an updated solid organ transplant guideline to assess donors and monitor recipients for human immunodeficiency virus (HIV), hepatitis B virus, and hepatitis C virus infections. This guideline reflects advances in

transplant technology and safety that can increase the number of organs available for transplants.

Currently, more than 110,000 patients in the United States are waiting for an organ transplant. "Under President Trump, HHS has made it a priority to expand access to lifesaving organ transplants," said HHS Sec-

retary Alex Azar. "Updating our transplant guidelines to match the latest science will complement the other efforts the Trump Administration is making to expand the supply of donated organs and incentivize transplants, allowing more Americans to live longer, healthier lives."

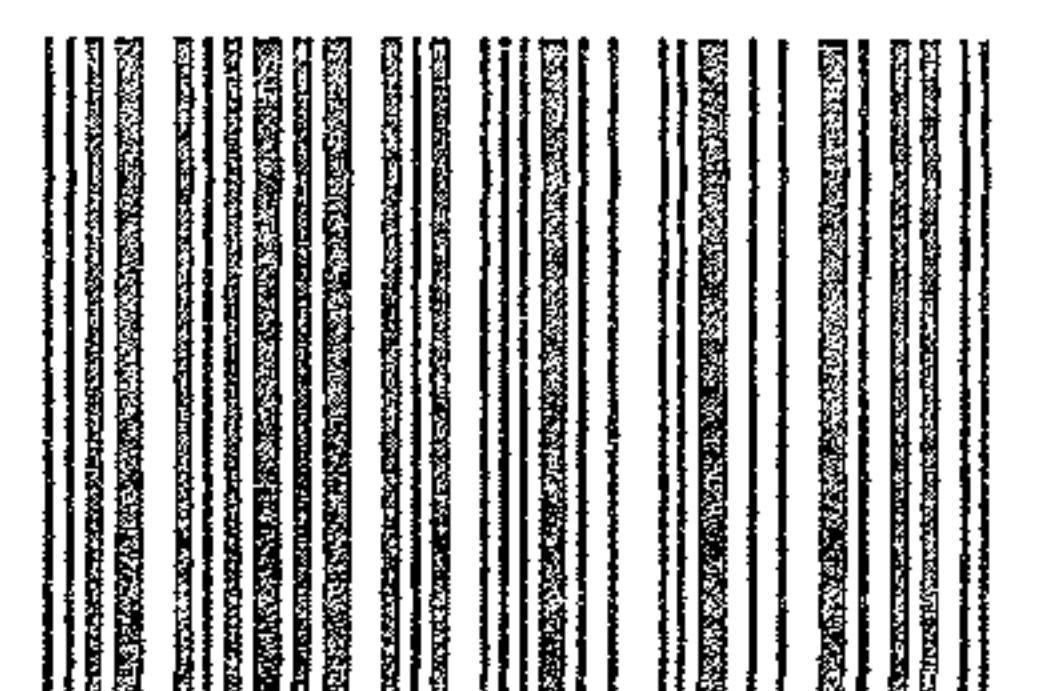

Assault

Michael Sonnier, 44, Industrial Park Drive Lenoir City, was charged with Aggravated Assault.

Jessika Wilson, 30, Waller Street Lenoir City, was charged with Man/Sell/Del/Resale Sch. II, Simple Possession, and Poss. Of Drug Para.

Deputy Billy Lewis LCSO, was dispatched to Wampler's Mobile Home Park for a possible domestic. Upon arrival Deputy made contact with Michael Sonnier who was walking with his girlfriend Jessika Wilson. Upon speaking with Sonnier he stated that they had been arguing stating that it was never physical.

Deputy then spoke with Wilson who appeared to be upset and stated she had discovered a phone message where Sonnier was talking to another woman and when she played it to Sonnier he became upset, when she attempted to walk away Sonnier ran after her and threw her to the ground and choked her to the point she thought she was going to die. Wilson did have red marks around her neck.

Michael Sonnier was placed under arrest. While on scene Deputy located a purple backpack in the edge of the woods, which Jessica Wilson stated it was hers. Upon getting verbal consent to search the bag Deputy located a lock box inside which contained several cut straws empty container with white residue, two small plastic baggies with meth one weighing .22 grams and the other weighing .57

Jason Dixon, 41, Thompson Street Philadelphia, was charged with Aggravated Assault, False Imprisonment, and Resisting Arrest. Deputy Ben Everett LCSO, was dispatched to Thompson Street in reference to a physical domestic in progress. Upon arrival Deputy witnessed a female running frantically out of the house, with a male standing by the door of the house. The female victim was yelling for help and her clothes were ripped up. Deputy and Officer House approached the residence, and Jason Dixon slammed the door in their face. The door beside the slammed door open and Dixon was inside yelling and screaming he would not comply to their commands. A witness stated that Dixon had the victim on the ground 2 different times choking and punching her and would not let her up. Dixon became combative while trying to place him under arrest. Jason Dixon was placed under arrest and transported to the Loudon County Jail. The victim stated they got into an argument she had ask Dixon to leave and he threw her to the ground and started choking her. The victim did have several bruises around

Ketner arrived on scene, where Agent Fritts was explaining to James Newell the reason he was being arrested. Agent Fritts attempted to place Newell in custody. Once Newell began to resist by pulling away saying no Inv. Ketner stepped in and cuffed

Newell. While Ketner was attempting to arrest Newell he began using racial slurs, and made several threats while in custody.
