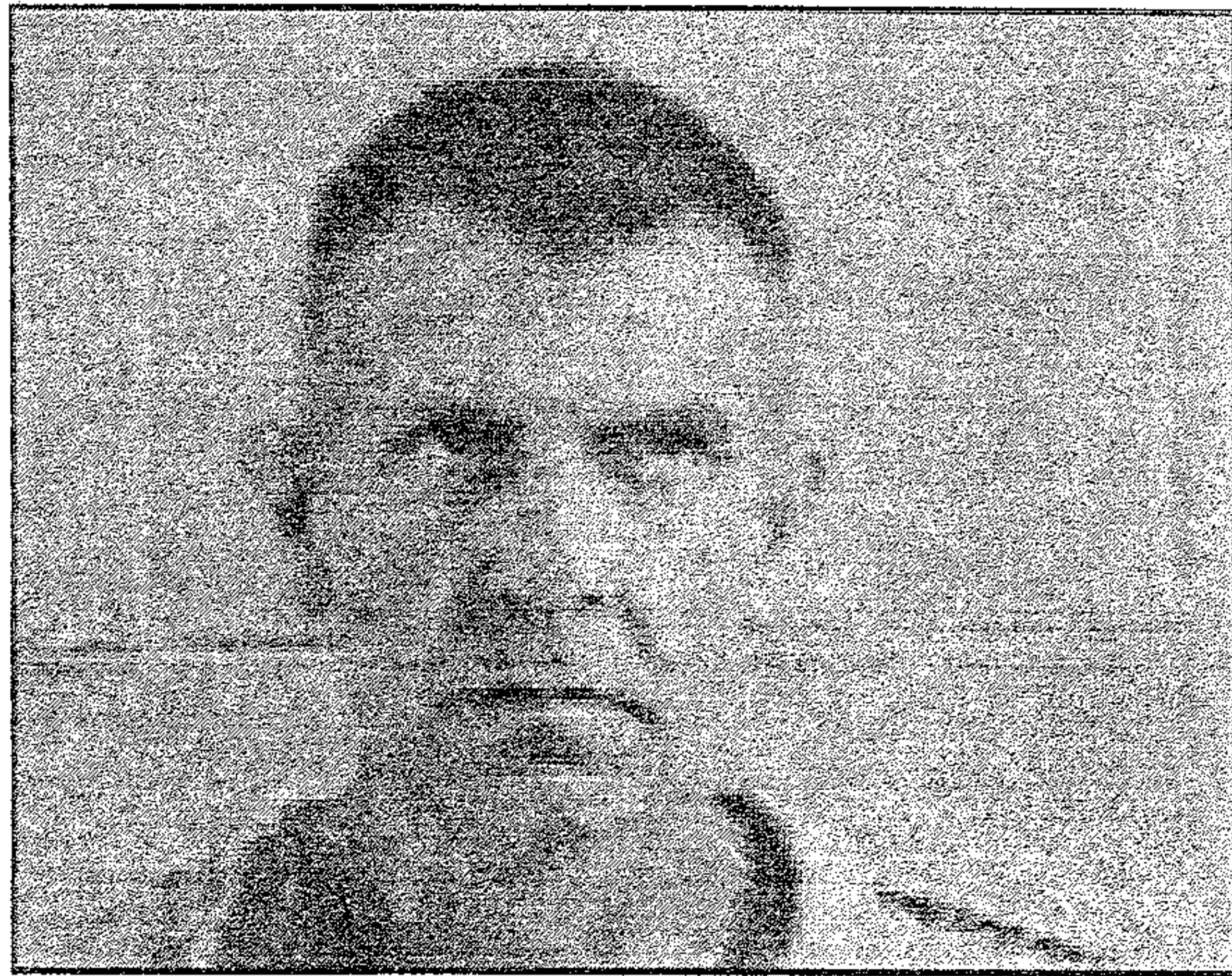

GINSENG DEALER PLEADS GUILTY TO FALSIFYING RECORDS

On August 11, 2020, Randall F. Henry, 49, of Sunbright, Tennessee, plead guilty before Magistrate Judge C. Clifford Shirley, Jr., to a felony count for falsifying records to conceal his illegal purchases of ginseng prior to the legal harvest season in 2015, violating the Lacey Act, a federal law enacted to

combat the illegal trafficking of plants and wildlife.

The plea agreement will require Henry to pay restitution to the State of Tennessee and perform 100 hours of community service. Sentencing is set for December 8, 2020, before the Honorable Pamela L. Reeves, Chief U.S. District Court

giene.

Not entering homes, and conducting interviews outside as much as possible or practical.

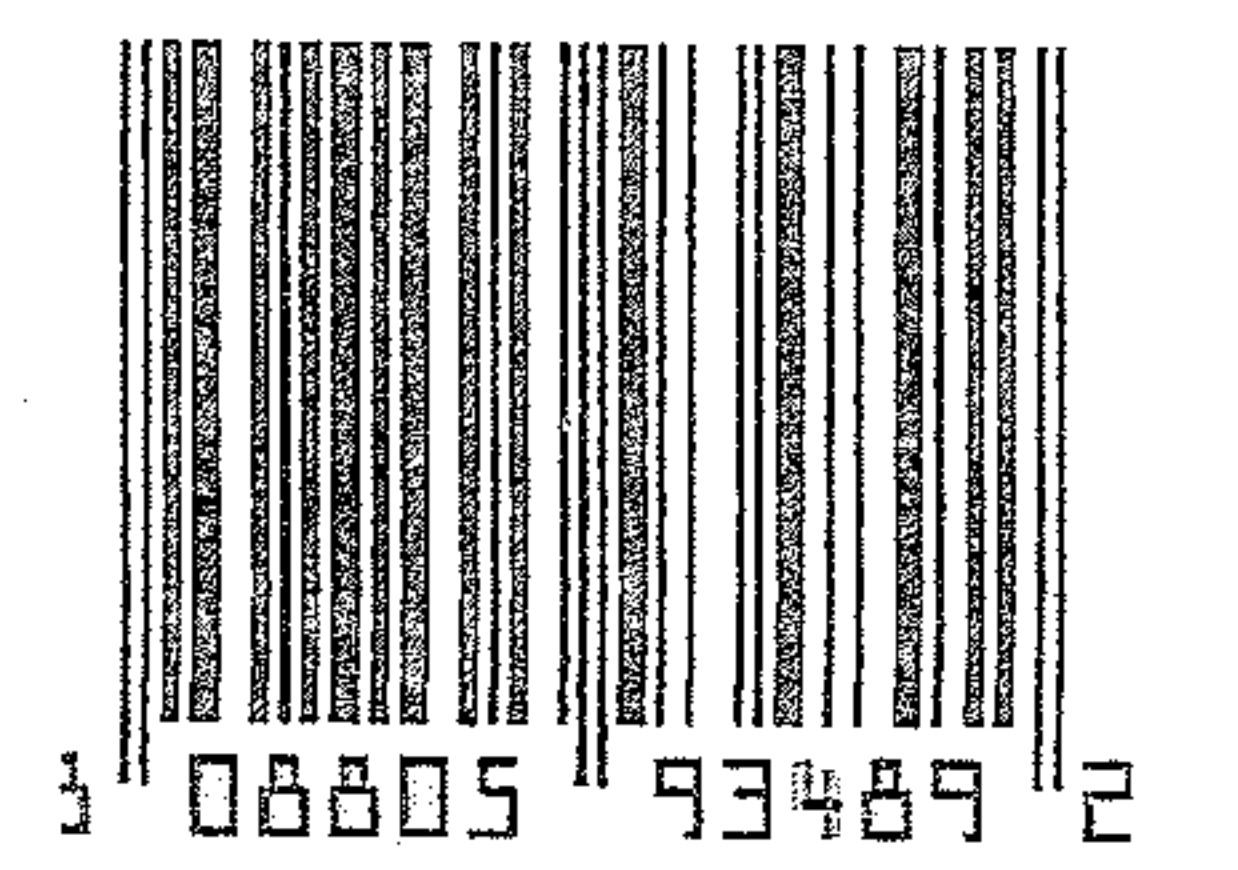

Alan Miller, 29, Old Tell-ico Hwy Madisonville, was charged with Man/Sell/Del/Resale Sch. I, II & VI, Poss. Of Drug Para., Speeding and Reckless Driving.

Katilyn Scogin, 26, Pump-kin Hollow Road Madi-sonville, was charged with Man/Sell/Del/Resale Sch. I, II, & VI, and Poss. Of Drug Para.

Trooper Walker THP, checked the speed of a white vehicle going 102 mph in a 70 mph zone. As Trooper turned and pulled out the vehicle changed lanes from the right to the left and ac-celerated even faster. The vehicle began weaving in and out of traffic. Trooper caught up to the vehicle and traffic stopped it at the 77 mm northbound. Upon in-vestigation the driver Allen Miller and the front seat pas-senger Katilyn Scogin were found in the vehicle. Miller was removed from the ve-hicle and was very nervous. Miller had no id and was placed in the back of Troop-er vehicle. After speaking with both parties they gave

different accounts of their whereabouts where they were coming from. Trooper ask if there was anything ille-gal in the vehicle, Miller stat-ed they may or may not be a joint in the vehicle. Miller stated he couldn't remember if he threw it out before get-ting pulled over. Trooper Ray arrived on scene to assist. When asking the driver about searching the vehicle, he be-came more nervous and did not want Trooper to search the vehicle. Trooper searched the vehicle and located a pack of rolling papers, a 1 hit baggie in the center console. A baggie with an unknown fine gray powder beside the driver seat and driver door approx.. 10 grams. There was \$1500 cash in the driv-er door compartment. Miller stated he worked construc-tion with his grandfather. There was a purple bag in the backseat behind the pas-senger seat. Miller denied ownership. Scogin was ask about the bag she advised it was Miller's. There was a combination lock on the bag. Upon opening the bag, there was many suspected drugs

and paraphernalia in the bag. There was a glass pipe, 2 pen with residue, pink spoon, blue grinder, green marijuana container with the name Katilyn Scogins on it, digital scales with a gray powder residue, vape pin, 4 containers of marijuana wax, a container with heroin approx. 2.7 grams, unknown pill, approx. 5 grams of crystal meth, and credit card

with Alan Miller name on it. Scogins had 2 drug pipes in her purse. Both parties were placed under arrest and transported to the Loudon County Jail.

American Ginseng (*Panax quinquefolius*) is a slow-growing perennial species of plant found throughout the Northeast, Midwest, and Appalachian regions of the United States. Wild American Ginseng has substantial commercial value because there is a national and international market for its use as an ingredient in food, drinks, and traditional medicines. American Ginseng is protected under the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora of 1973 (CITES) and the Endangered Species Act (ESA). The purpose of CITES is to monitor, control, and restrict, as necessary, the international trade of certain wild plant and animal species in an effort to prevent adverse impacts and ensure continued existence of those species in their natural habitat.

In Tennessee, the Tennessee Department of Environmental Conservation (TDEC) has responsibilities—under CITES, the ESA, and state law—to regulate and monitor the commercial harvest of wild American Ginseng and to ensure that populations are not imperiled.

Accordingly, American Ginseng dealers are required to routinely submit paperwork to TDEC to document their ginseng purchases. Henry admitted to falsifying such documents in 2015 after purchasing American Ginseng before the opening of the established season. The USFWS investigates illegal ginseng trafficking associated with the international

and interstate trade under the Lacey Act.

“The collaborative efforts of USFWS and the Department of Justice work to deter individuals from violating the laws and regulations designed to protect our natural ginseng resources, and from engaging in these types of illegal practices that threaten this resource. We will pursue any companies or persons who engage in similar unlawful conduct,” said J. Douglas Overbey, United States Attorney for the Eastern District of Tennessee.

“Breaking up international and domestic smuggling rings that specifically exploit native

plants and animals is a

very important part of the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service Office of Law Enforcement’s work,” said FWS Acting Special Agent in Charge Stephen Clark.

This plea is the result of “Operation Green Gold,” a multi-jurisdiction investigation conducted by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) into the illegal harvesting, trafficking, and smuggling of American Ginseng.

The USFWS conducted the investigation in this case. The United States is represented in Court by Assistant United States Attorney Matthew T. Morris and Environmental Crimes Section Senior Trial Attorney Todd Gleason.

Chadwick Hodges, 48, Adaline Street Kingsport, was charged with Poss. Of Drug Para., Man/Sell/Poss. Of Controlled Substance, and Driving on Roadways Laned For Traffic.


CPL. Z. Frye LCSO, observed a blue Ford Fiesta traveling Southbound on I-75 failing to maintain lane of traveling and crossing the white fog line on several occasions. Upon traffic stop Cpl. spoke with the driver, and the passenger, Chadwick Hodges. They both stated they were traveling from Hawkins County to the Inn of Loudon where they had a room together. Both occupants appeared nervous while speaking to me. Cpl. asked the driver if she would consent to

standardized field sobriety testing due to the manor in which she was driving and she did consent. The driver performed satisfactory on all tests given. While Cpl. was speaking with the driver, Deputy A. Parton was speaking with Hodges at the passenger side of the car. While Deputy Parton was speaking with Hodges he did notice a glass pipe with burn marks on it in the passenger side door of the vehicle. Deputy A. Parton then asked Hodges if he had anything illegal in the vehicle or on his person and removed him from the vehicle. Hodge's did state that he had a small baggie of cocaine and a small baggie of Methamphetamine on his person. Deputy Parton did retrieve both items from his person. Hodges did have approximate-

ly 1.34 grams of a crystal like substance believed to be Meth in a small baggie as well as 0.36 grams of a white powdery substance believed to be Cocaine in a small baggie. Hodges was placed under arrest for possession of both controlled substances, possession of drug paraphernalia for the glass pipe and cited for failure to maintain lane of travel. While Hodges was

being placed into Deputy's car he did state that he was bringing both the Methamphetamine and Cocaine to a friend in Loudon to sell to him. The vehicle was towed by Moneymakers Wrecker Service due to not having a valid registration. The driver was transported to the Inn of Loudon and released with no charges. This all did occur in Loudon County, TN.





jobs and will have more than 1,100 construction workers on site at peak. The data center will support a variety of positions and job types, from technical operations, electricians, logistics staff, security and more. Construction has just begun on the 982,000-square-foot facility.

The Facebook Gallatin Data Center will be among the most advanced, energy- and water- efficient data center facilities in the world. It will be supported by 100 percent renewable energy, will use 80 percent less water than the average, and, once completed, will be LEED Gold certified. Facebook has already partnered with the TVA to bring 220 MW of new solar energy to the Tennessee Valley to support Facebook's operations in the region.

The announcement is the

culmination of a three-year recruitment effort by the Gallatin Economic Development Agency, the Tennessee Department of Economic and Community Development and Tennessee Valley Authority.

Facebook will join several other large brand names located in the Gallatin Industrial Park, including Beretta USA, Gap and SERVPRO.

Since 2015, TNECD has supported 13 economic development projects in Sumner County, resulting in more than 2,000 job commitments and \$223 million in capital investment.
