

Shaniece Hundley, 50, Lay Avenue Knoxville, was charged with, DUI.

Trooper Sherman THP, observed a white 2008 Nissan Sentra on 1-75 around mile marker 76, displaying TN license plate: DP04654. The vehicle failed to maintain its lane when its passenger side tires crossed the right shoulder of the road.

Upon seeing the violation, a traffic stop was initiated and the vehicle came to a stop on the right shoulder. The vehicle was occupied by a female driver and juvenile passenger sleeping in the rear passenger seat. The driver was identified and participated participated in field sobriety tests. Furthermore, the driver was identified to have a suspended license with previous FTA

history. The driver contacted her mother to arrive to the seen of the traffic stop. This was allowed by his discretion, as well as to bring an additional person, with the intent to have a licensed driver pick up the Nissan Sentra following the driver's arrest so that it would not be towed.

The mother of the detained driver arrived on scene and was identified by her Tennessee driver's license as: HUN-DLEY, SHANIECE. When she arrived, the trooper could immediately smell the strong odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from her person and she maintained watery eyes. She informed the trooper that she consumed alcohol earlier in the evening and agreed to participate in voluntary field sobriety tests. She did not complete the sobriety tests as a sober person would and verbally informed

the trooper that her impairment 1 was a 4 out of 10, with 10 being the most impaired she has ever been on the scale, thus indicating that she was impaired by alcohol. While on scene, she became increasingly belligerent and slurred her speech. Based on

her performance on the sobriety tests, odor of alcohol coming from her person, admission to consuming alcohol, and her self-identifying as being impaired on a scale of 4 out of 10, probable cause was established that she was driving under the influence.







Lorenzo Jordan, 59, Swan Drive Georgia, was charged with, Simple Possession x2.

Officer C. Fine LCPD, was on routine patrol when he observed a vehicle in the northbound exit turn lane to I-75 with its hazards on obstructing a lane of travel. The officer then initiated a traffic stop on the vehicle due to the state that it was in. Upon making contact with the driver, identified as Jordan Lorenzo Jurod, it was apparent that he was sweating, his eyes were bloodshot, and his pupils

were pinpoint. Jordan was also acting very erratic. The officer then ordered Jordan out of the vehicle to speak with him about his demeanor, to which he complied. Once out of the vehicle, the officer asked Mr. Jordan if there was anything illegal in the vehicle to which he claimed there was not, and he gave Officers consent to search his vehicle. While searching the vehicle, Officers located on the driver side floorboard two broken pieces of glass which appeared to be burnt seeming to be part of a pipe used for recre-

ational use of narcotics. Further into the search between the center console and the passenger seat, Officer C. Fine, located two small clear baggies, both containing what appeared to be a white powdery substance weighing approximately .99 grams including small baggies. Also, between the center console and the passenger seat was a white crystal-like substance in rock form weighing approximately .24 grams. Both the baggies of powder and rock were tested with the TRUNARC drug analyzer resulting in the

baggies testing positive for Cocaine HCL and the rock testing positive for Crack Cocaine. Located in the trunk, was a clear baggie which was twisted at the bottom to which Sgt. Ketner stated is known to be used to package narcotics. Based on the evidence of narcotics located, Jordan was placed into custody and transported to the Loudon County Jail without further incident. Jordan's vehicle was towed by moneymakers via Officer request. This did occur in Lenoir City, Loudon County


