





On June 24, 2025, the FBI announced the addition of Giovanni Vicente Mosquera Serrano to its Ten Most Wanted Fugitives list.

They stated that they had just returned to their residence after visiting the grocery store. As they were unloading the groceries from the victim Toyota Camry TN#914B-MJY, Jeffery Harris pulled into their driveway in a blue truck and accelerated into the back of the Cam-

ry. After striking the rear end of the Camry once, Jeffery Harris, 35, Lynn Jefferey put his truck in re-Wood Drive Greenback, verse. Then he accelerated into the back of the Camry for a second time and then drove away. the vic-Deputy Knight LCSO, tims stated that they were in fear for their lives while Jefferey was ramming the vehicle. Victim 1 was in the driver's seat at the time of the crash, and victim 2 was nearby on the porch of the residence. The victim said that Jeffery was upset with her due to her taking his girlfriend to North Carolina and had stated that something was going to happen to her. The deputy observed damage to the back of the Camry


consistent with what they had described, as well as tire marks in the driveway and leaking fluid from the truck. Deputies went to speak with Jefferey at his residence at Lynnwood Drive and made contact with him at the front gate

of his residence. Jefferey was extremely uncooperative with deputies and did not allow access to his property to investigate the damage to his truck, and denied being at victims house. This did occur in Loudon County, TN.
