Rodrigo Santos, 37, Silvia Drive Knoxville, was charged with Domestic Assault.

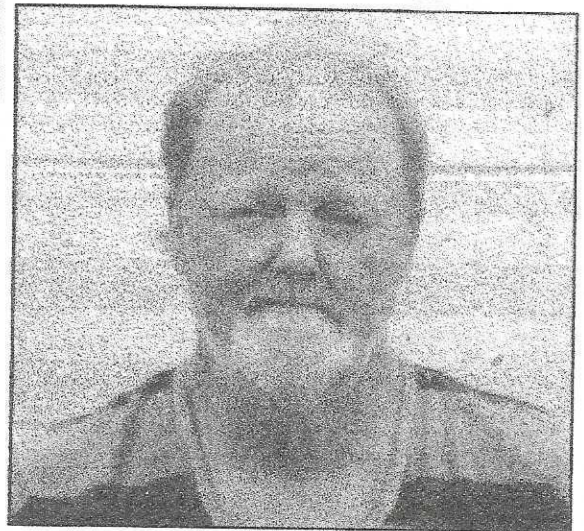

## Rutledge, Tennessee Man Sentenced To Over 24 Years In Prison For Production Of Child Pornography

On July 1, 2025, Patrick E. McAneny Jr., 28, of Rutledge, Tennessee, was sentenced to 292 months imprisonment by the Honorable Clifton L. Corker, United States District Judge, in the United States District Court for the Eastern District of Tennessee at Greeneville. Upon his release from prison, McAneny will be on supervised release for 20 years. He will be required to register with state sex offender registries and comply with special sex offender conditions during his supervised release. Tanner Burchfield, 26, Dailey Avenue Loudon, was charged with BUI, Violation of Implied Consent, and Violation of Boating Safety Laws x3.

C. Griffin TWRA, observed a vessel travelling downriver on Tellico Reservoir after sunset with no navigational lights illuminated. Upon conducting a vessel stop, the officer made contact with the driver, later identified as Tanner Colten Burchfield, DL # 125831966. Upon speaking with the operator, the officer noticed Tanner's speech to be slurred. The officer observed a smell similar to that of an alcoholic beverage emitting from the vessel. The officer also noticed that there were 3 open alcoholic beverage cans around the helm. The officer asked Tanner for the vessel's safety equipment,

and he held onto the countertop to sustain his balance while reaching for lifejackets. Additionally, he repeatedly forgot the safety equipment the officer asked for and the officer had to remind him numerous times. Tanner admitted to drinking 3 alcoholic beverages and would later admit to drinking at least 8 alcoholic beverages. The fire extinguisher Tanner provided to me was unserviceable due to the gauge reading showing red and he was never able to produce a Type 4 Throwable Flotation Device. Tanner also had difficulty putting his lifejacket on and put it on inside-out and had to be asked numerous times to correctly zip up the PFD and connect its straps. Upon conducting the seated battery of standardized field sobriety, the officer observed a strong smell similar to that of an alcoholic beverage emitting from Tanner's breath as he spoke to the offi-

cer. On Horizontal Gaze Nystagmus, the officer observed 4 clues. On Finger to Nose, he observed 12 clues. Tanner started early numerous times on this test. On Palm Pat, he observed 1 clue. On Hand Coordination, he observed 1 clue. Tanner also claimed he did not remember me reading the "second task" instructions. The officer asked Tanner how much he actually had to drink to which he replied "no less than 8." The officer also asked if he would drive a vehicle in the current state he was in, to which he replied no. Based on the observations

the officer observed during his contact with Tanner and his poor performance on field sobriety, the officer placed him under arrest for Boating Under the Influence. After reading Implied Consent, Tanner did not consent to a blood draw. He was transported to the Loudon County Justice Center for booking. He is charged with No throwable flotation device aboard vessel, unserviceable fire extinguisher aboard vessel, violation of navigational light law, Boating under the influence, and violation of implied consent.

Obaidullah Wahab33, Foxvue Road Knoxville, was charged with, TRESPASS ON OR INJURY TO CEMETERY PROPERTY — INTERFERENCE WITH PROCESSIONS OR RELIGIOUS EXERCISES, and LEAVING THE SCENE OF ACCIDENT PROPERTY DAMAGE.

Deputy Harrison LCSO, was notified of an abandoned vehicle in the Lakeview Cemetery, that was wrecked over top of a burial site set for a service on the following day. Once on scene, The deputy observed a blue Honda that appeared to have been purposefully wrecked onto a Muslim grave site. The registration on the vehicle came back to Obaidullah Wahab, an Afghani refugee who has been causing issues with the local Muslim community that resulted in a restraining odor being put in place in Knox County. Approximately one month prior, owners of the cemetery were actively digging another site and the subject showed up, got into the grave, and proceeded to lay on his back stating "Is this my grave?". The deputy was able to make contact the Admin for The Muslim Community of Knoxville. She

stated Wahab was picked up outside Lakeview Cemetery earlier this day by his friends. While Wahab was speaking with them he stated he had been in a car crash but did not provide any more information. The deputy was able to locate mail inside the vehicle addressed to the subject. The front bumper of the vehicle appeared to have been ripped off during the crash from the impact with the mound of dirt still present on scene. The deputy was able to locate the bumper in the trunk of the vehicle. Knox County Sheriff's Office attempted to make contact with Wahab at the address associated with the vehicle registration and mail but it is no longer occupied. Based on the facts above, and due to the proximity of the burial site to the roadway inside the cemetery, it is apparent the vehicle was intentionally wrecked over the grave site and left there abandoned afterward. This did occur in Loudon County, Tennessee.

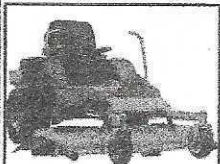

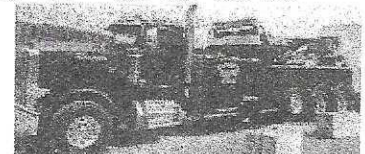

## DUI+

Ronald Cochran, 60, Pine Grove Road Loudon, was charged with, DUI x2, Simple Possession x2, Driving Unregistered Vehicle, Use of Safety Belt, and Financial Responsibility.

Officer A. Luna LPD, received a call for a welfare check at Grove St. at The Local Market. The officer was advised there was a male asleep at the wheel at pump number three. The officer made contact with Mr. Ronald Cochran who was asleep at the wheel of his vehicle. The employee advised he had not come inside and purchased anything. The officer did notice upon first contact that Mr. Cochran's pupils were pinpoint and he appeared confused. The officer performed a Standardized Field Sobriety test on Mr. Cochran which he performed poorly on. Mr. Cochran consented to a blood

draw. Dispatch also confirmed six active Loudon County warrants, three of which were cite-in, and three of which were arrestable. Mr. Cochran was placed into custody and transported to the Fort Loudon ER. While we were there, he did complain of chest pain and was evaluated by medical personnel, and was then discharged. The officer transported Mr. Cochran to the Loudon County Jail without incident, and this did occur in the City of Loudon.

Richard Calantoni, 51, New-ark Street Florida, was charged with, Theft of Property.

Deputy Reagan LCSO, spoke with the (Victim) via phone regarding her vehicle being stolen. A 2024 Toyota Corolla (888BNWC). She stated, on June 21, 2025, she picked up her friend, Richard Calantoni (Offender), from a rehab facility in Cookeville, TN. They had spoken about where her vehicle

was, due to her picking him up in a vehicle that he did not recognize.

She stated that her vehicle was located at the Tellico Village Wellness Center due to the street that she lives on being striped. She stated that she parked it at the wellness center on June 19th. She then advised the deputy that when she arrived at home with Richard, he began asking her to take him to Knoxville so he could purchase illegal narcotics from an individual located in an apartment complex near Summit Hill Drive. She told him no, and she stated that she went to bed around 1:00 am. She stated that when she woke up around 7:00 am, Richard was gone, the keys to her vehicle were gone, and the vehicle was no longer in the parking lot of the Wellness Center.

The victim stated that there is no relation to Calantoni, but they have been acquaintances for many years. She advised the deputy that she wanted to help him get back onto his feet and provided him with her guest bedroom. After speaking with

the victim, the deputy spoke with Officer Miller with the Lenoir City Police Department. He checked Flock Cameras for the vehicle. He advised deputy Reagan that it had appeared on the cameras at W 5th Ave. and Queen Rd. at 9:25 am in Knoxville on June 22, 2025.

After speaking with Officer Miller, the deputy requested that Dispatch send the information to Knox County to be on the lookout. A short time later, the deputy spoke with the victim again via phone, and she stated that her mother's credit card had been used at the Shell gas station at Summit Hill Dr. and Hall of Fame Dr. She stated that the credit card was located in her purse at home and she did not notice that it was missing until odd transactions were placed. She advised that there were four transactions for a total of \$61.52. The victim stated that her mother is in the hospital in critical condition and is unaware at the time of this report.

The victim stated that she has since locked the card. This did happen in Loudon County, TN.

plead guilty to count one of an indictment charging him with use of a minor to engage in sexually explicit conduct for the purpose of producing a visual depiction of such conduct in violation of 18 U.S.C. § 2251(a).

According to the written plea agreement filed with the court, McAneny began an online relationship with a 12-year-old girl. On February 4, 2024, McAneny traveled from his home in Grainger County, Tennessee to pick up the minor from her home in Hamblen County, Tennessee. She did not have permission to leave her home. Her family reported her missing the same day. From February 4 to February 6, 2024, while at McAneny's home he took photos, and video recorded the minor and himself engaged in sex-

ual acts. McAneny sent a video of the minor victim engaged in sexual acts with him to a third party online. The person contacted law enforcement upon receipt of the video. Based on the call law enforcement was able to locate the 12-year-old girl at McAneny's home.

U.S. Attorney Francis M. Hamilton III, of the Eastern District of Tennessee, and Special Agent in Charge Joe Carrico, of the FBI Nashville Field Office, made the announcement.

The criminal indictment was the result of an investigation by the Federal Bureau of Investigations, the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation and the Hamblen and Grainger County Sheriff's Office.

Assistant U.S. Attorney Meghan L. Gomez represented the United States at the

sentencing.

This case was brought as part of Project Safe Childhood (PSC), a nationwide initiative launched in May 2006, by the Department of Justice to combat the growing epidemic of child sexual exploitation and abuse. Led by the United States Attorney's Offices and the Criminal Division's Child Exploitation and Obscenity Section, PSC
