SECOND DEGREE MURDER CONVICTION IN MORGAN COUNTY FATAL OVERDOSE NETS DRUG SUPPLIER 15 YEARS TO SERVE AT 100%

Suspicious Person Call Leads to Arrest

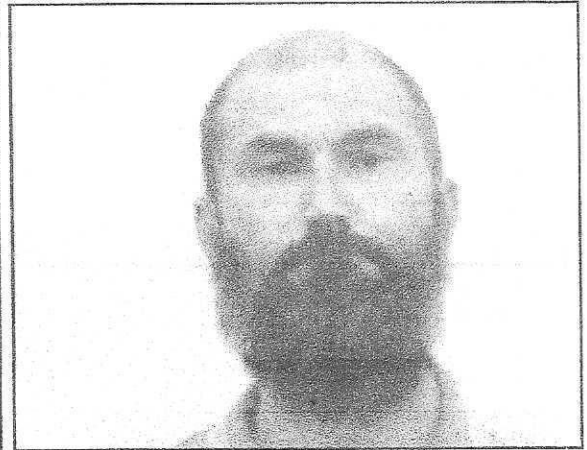

Anthony Shelley and Tammy Conner were convicted on Monday on charges related to the overdose death of the victim from fentanyl which death occurred in Deer Lodge on May 21, 2022. Shelley provided fentanyl to Conner in exchange for oxycodone pills.

Morgan County Sheriff's Office responded to the residence and found that three individuals had taken the illegal narcotics. Conner and another were able to be revived by law enforcement and EMS, but not the deceased whose autopsy revealed that he died from a combination of fentan-

Knoxville Police Officer Arrested For Production Of Child Pornography

Dan Roark, 47, an officer with the Knoxville Police Department, was arrested today in Knoxville on federal charges involving the production of child pornography.

An initial appearance was held on Monday, November 6, 2023, at 2:30 p.m., in United States District Court in Knoxville before the Honorable Jill E. Mc-

Cook, United States Magistrate Judge.

Details of the charges are outlined in the Criminal Complaint and Affidavit in Support of Criminal Complaint, Case No. 3:23-MJ-2201, which are filed in the United States District Court for the Eastern District of Tennessee.

The Criminal Complaint is the result of an investigation by Homeland Security Investi-

gations (HSI), Scott County Sheriff, Virginia, Tennessee Bureau of Investigation (TBI), and the Ninth Judicial District Attorney's Office.

Assistant United States Attorney Jennifer Kolman will represent the United States.

Members of the public are reminded that these are only

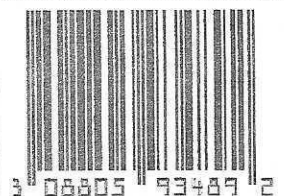

yl, oxycodone and Gabapentin toxicity.

Morgan County Sheriff's Office Narcotics unit investigated the case that was indicted by the Morgan County Grand Jury and prosecuted by the 9th District Attorney General's Office Assistant District Attorneys Kristin Curtis and Jonathan Edwards.

Anthony Shelley, as the direct supplier of the fentanyl, pled guilty to Second Degree Murder, A felony, 15 years to serve at 100% in the custody of Tennessee Department of Corrections.

Tammy Conner, for her

role in trading the oxycodone for the fentanyl from Shelley, ended up pleading guilty to Attempted Facilitation of Second-Degree Murder, a Class C felony, with a sentence of six years on probation and a requirement to successfully complete an inpatient program to be followed up with outpatient treatment.

District Attorney General Russell Johnson noted that since January 2023 there have been ten overdose deaths in Morgan County and 78 in the four counties of the Ninth Judicial District. To combat this epidemic Johnson formed an overdose task force in December 2021 con-

sisting of his office, his drug task force and local narcotics agents. This task force meets monthly at the District Attorney's Office and share the facts and persons involved as victims and suspects in their fatal overdose cases. They develop tactics from current drug trends and trafficking information within their areas and talk about prosecution angles with the ADAs. This sharing of information and brainstorming has led to successful prose-

cution of those responsible for the unlawful distribution of dangerous controlled substances like fentanyl.

General Johnson thanked Morgan County Sheriff Wayne Potter and his officers for exhibiting their dedication to combating these trends and unfortunate deaths in investigating this case, as well as thanking his prosecutors and the agencies combatting this epidemic who are likewise equally dedicated.

Tricia Cain, 54, Hampton Place Circle Loudon, was charged with DUI.

Deputy Parks LCSO, observed a black Cadillac CT5 failing to maintain lane traveling northbound on Interstate 75. Deputy observed the vehicle for approximately a mile and a half, observing the vehicle swerving in and out of the lane of travel approximately 5 times. The deputy initiated a traffic stop on the vehicle at the 70 mile marker and approached the car. Deputy made contact with the driver, Ms. Tricia Cain, who advised she was tired and had been driving from Dalton, GA. While speaking with Ms. Cain, the deputy observed her to have very lethargic behavior, slow deliberate slurred speech, and glassy eyes. Ms. Cain also exhibited thick spit, and a runny nose, which are common signs of narcotic impairment. Deputy asked Ms. Cain if she takes any prescription medication, and she advised

she takes Seroquel and Gabapentin. Ms. Cain stated she had taken a Gabapentin pill at approximately 10:30, and had not eaten until just a short time before the stop. Deputy asked Ms. Cain if she would be willing to perform Standardized Field Sobriety Tests, to which she refused. Based on the totality of the circumstances, the deputy believed Ms. Cain to be impaired while operating a motor vehicle. Ms. Cain was then placed under arrest and read Implied Consent, to which she also refused.

After being read implied consent, Ms. Cain nodded off and had to be startled to regain her attention. While inventorying the vehicle prior to tow, prescriptions for Clonazepam, Buprenorphine, and Gabapentin were located. The vehicle was towed from the scene by James, and Ms. Cain was transported to the jail without incident. All of the above occurred in Loudon County, Tennessee.

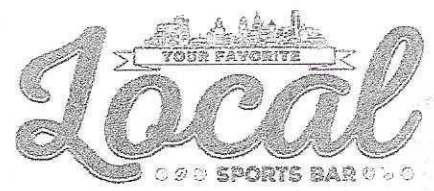

Officer J. Upon arrival Hixon was in the driver's seat of his truck a red 2000 GMC Sierra bearing TN Temporary tag (QMQ6A-VK) and after walking up to the truck he stepped out and said he was asking people for money because he ran out of gas. 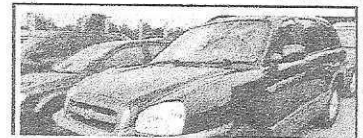

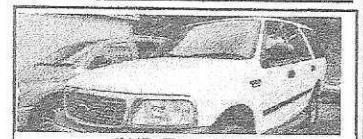

U.S. Attorney's Office Announces Participation in Justice Department's Nationwide Election Day Program

The United States Attorney's Office announced today that Assistant United States Attorney (AUSA) Mac Heavener will lead the efforts of the Office in connection with the Justice Department's nationwide Election Day Program for the upcoming November 7, 2023, general election. AUSA Heavener has been appointed to serve as the District Election Officer (DEO) for the Eastern District of Tennessee, and in that capacity is responsible for overseeing the Office's handling of election day complaints of voting rights concerns, threats of violence to election officials or staff, and election fraud, in consultation with Justice Department Headquarters in

Washington.

The Department of Justice has an important role in deterring and combatting discrimination and intimidation at the polls, threats of violence directed at election officials and poll workers, and election fraud. The Department will address these violations wherever they occur. The Department's longstanding Election Day Program furthers these goals and also seeks to ensure public confidence in the electoral process by providing local points of contact within the Department for the public to report possible federal election law violations.

Federal law protects against such crimes as threatening violence against election officials or staff, intimidating or bribing voters, buying and selling votes, impersonating voters, altering vote tallies, stuffing ballot boxes, and marking ballots for voters against their wishes or without their input. It also contains special protections for the rights of voters, and provides that they

can vote free from interference, including intimidation, and other acts designed to prevent or discourage people from voting or voting for the candidate of their choice. The Voting Rights Act protects the right of voters to mark their own ballot or to be assisted by a person of their choice (where voters need assistance because of disability or inability to read or write in English).

In order to respond to complaints of voting rights concerns and election fraud during the upcoming election, and to ensure that such complaints are directed to the appropriate authorities, AUSA Heavener will be on duty in this District while the polls are open. He can be reached by the public at the following telephone numbers: (423) 823-5009 or (423) 218-6652.

In addition, the FBI will have special agents available in each field office and resident agency throughout the country to receive allegations of election fraud and other election abuses on election

day. The local FBI field office can be reached by the public at (865) 544-0751.

Complaints about possible violations of the federal voting rights laws can be made directly to the Civil Rights Division in Washington, DC by phone at 800-253-3931 or by complaint form at <https://civil-rights.justice.gov/>.

"Ensuring free and fair elections depends in large part on the assistance of the American electorate," stated United States Attorney Francis M. Hamilton III. "It is important that those who have specific information about voting rights concerns or election fraud make that information available to the Department of Justice."

Please note, however, in the case of a crime of violence or intimidation, please call 911 immediately and before contacting federal authorities. State and local police have primary jurisdiction over polling places, and almost always have faster reaction capacity in an emergency.

(1) (A) Four (4) months from the date of the first publication (or posting, as the case may be) of this notice if the creditor received an actual copy of this notice to creditors at least sixty (60) days before the date that is four (4) months from the date of the first publication (or posting); or

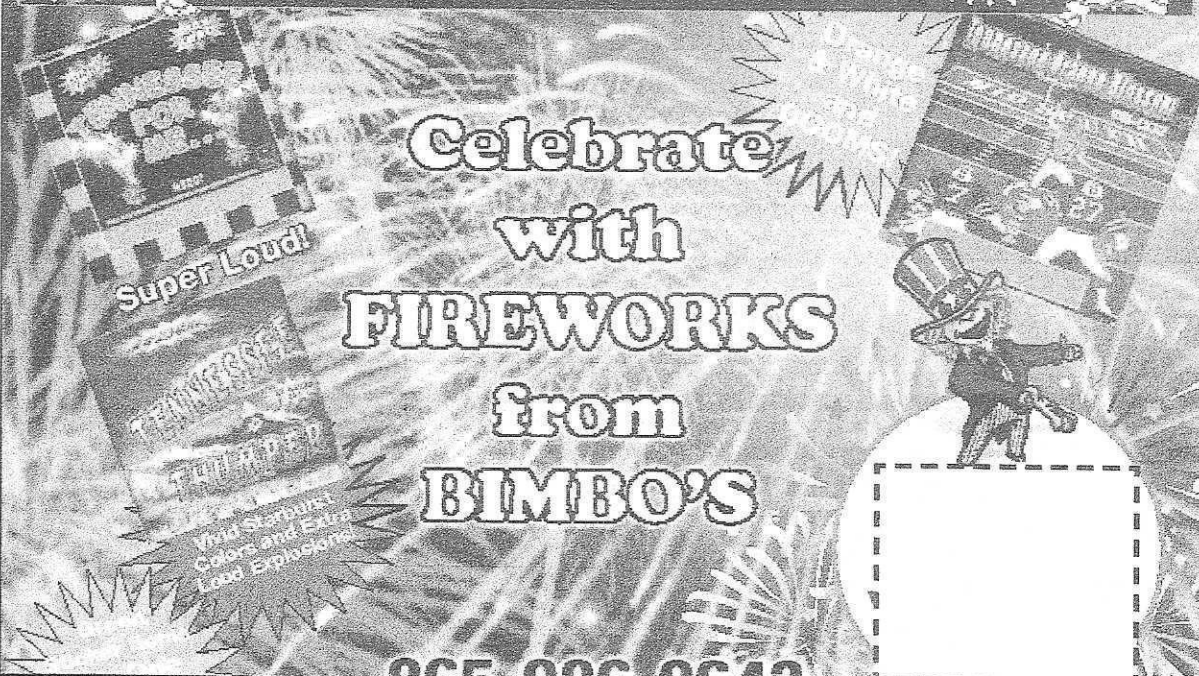

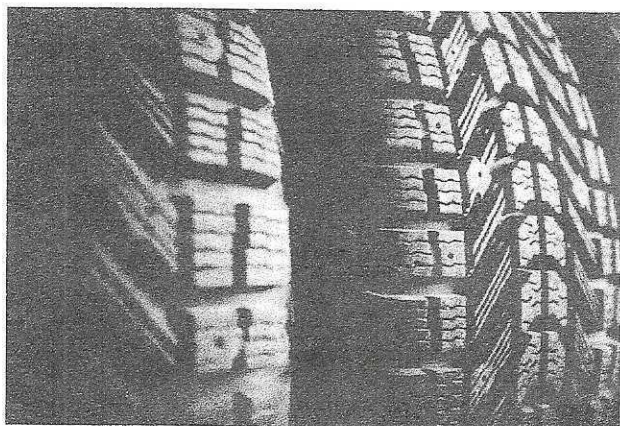
