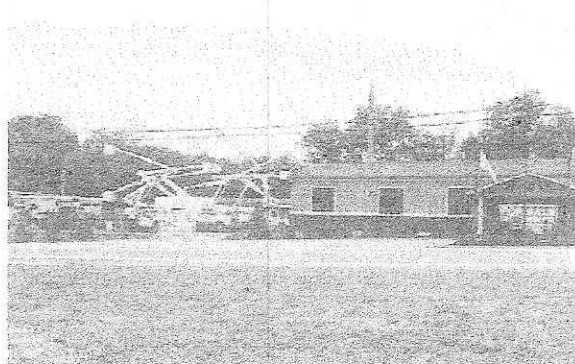

Former Department Of Energy Contractor Sentenced To 121 Months For Distributing And Possessing Child Pornography

The Honorable Thomas A. Varlan, United States District Judge for the Eastern District of Tennessee, sentenced David Bryon King, age 57, to serve 121 months in federal prison followed by a lifetime on supervised release for attempted distribution and possessing child pornography. During the time of the offense, King was a contractor working as a fire inspector for the Oak Ridge National Laboratory.

According to the filed plea agreement, King admitted that he distributed child pornography to others in 2022, in violation of 18 U.S.C. § 2522A(a)(2)(B), and possessed child pornography in 2021 and 2022, in violation of 18 U.S.C. § 2252A(a)(5)(B). King was identified as making online payments to individuals believed to be selling child pornography. Agents with the Department of Energy Office of Inspector General interviewed

King at his residence. During the interview, King admitted to being in possession of child pornography, specifically on his smartphone. Agents seized the device and obtained a federal search warrant to search the device. Forensic analyses of King's smartphone uncovered images and videos of child pornography and other evidence linking King to the attempted distribution of child pornography.

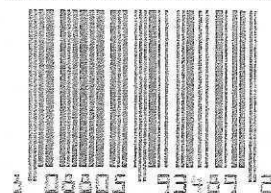

Charged

Braydon Corley, 18, Cate Lane Lenoir City, was charged with, Escape, DUI, Violation of Implied Consent, Man/Sell/Del/Resale Sch. II, and Resisting Arrest.

Officer Law LCPD, was dispatched to 911 Highway 321 North (Walmart) in reference to an unwanted guest. The complainant advised a male employee by the name Braydon was asked to leave but refused. The officer located a Black Acura TLX (TN Tag BNL-3456) with a shirtless male who appeared passed out in the driver's seat with the vehicle running. Officer had to slightly sternum rub the male who he identified as Braydon Corley. While speaking to Mr. Corley he was sweating profusely, seemed confused and had white foam around his mouth. Mr. Corley stated he was 18 year old, in plain view of the vehicle was a small black container with THC printed on the label, and inside was located 73 Blue Circle Pills with the imprint M/30. Mr. Corley consented to SFST, during HGH Officer observed lack of smooth pursuit, distinct and sustained nystagmus at

maximum deviation, and an onset of nystagmus prior to 45 degrees in both of Mr. Corley's eyes. Mr. Corley was swaying forward and backward significantly during the test. At least 3 inches in both directions. Sergeant Bialek was on scene to perform ARIDE, Sergeant Bialek observed Mr. Corley to have eye tremors, could not understand simple instructions and was continuously swaying back and forth during testing. Mr. Corley was placed under arrest and then read Tennessee Implied Consent which he refused. While in the back of officer patrol car, Mr. Corley stated he had to throw up. Officer then rolled down the window as he leaned his head out and began coughing out my window.

Mr. Corley then leaped out his window, thus landing on the ground causing a slight cut on his forehead and took off towards the Murphy USA. Officer Law caught up to the Braydon, tackled him to the ground, and with the help of other Officers on scene we were able to place him back in his patrol car. Mr. Corley was then transported to the Loudon County Jail without incident. All the above occurred in Lenoir City, TN.

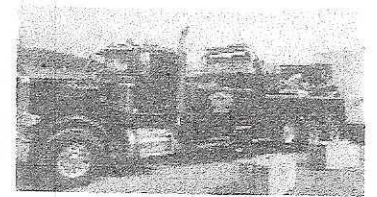

Brewster

Friday afternoon, Ken Brewster, announced that his business, Brewster's Service Group, was suspending services as of Friday 4/21/23. In a letter to his customers, Brewster seems to indicate that the closure was caused by the failure of some of his customers to pay their contract obligations. Allegedly, Brewster laid off over eighty employees Friday. The letter says "Services Suspended".

Brewster's Service Group holds millions of dollars in contracts with Lenoir City, LCUB, Loudon City and

LUB. These include mowing and power line right of way clearing and tree trimming. Brewster also has had the Lenoir City, residential garbage pick up contract since April 2021. The undated letter does not specifically state which services are to be suspended, mowing, tree trimming or garbage.

Back in 2008, Ken Brewster filed Chapter 7 bankruptcy for nearly two million dollars on a similar business. And according to property records, Mr. Brewster hasn't yet paid many of his 2022 property taxes.

Neither city has yet an-

nounced how they will replace the services but the Lenoir City Street Depart-

ment stepped up to temporarily fill the void until another company is hired.

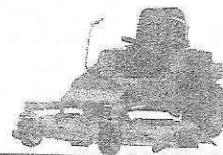
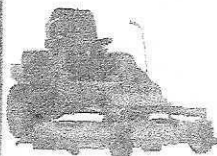

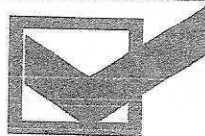

Keith Kelser Jr is charged with two counts of aggravated assault, two counts of reckless endangerment and domestic assault. An arrest affidavit accuses Kelser of "using a deadly weapon during the commission of a physical domestic dispute."

According to the report and interview with Chief Don White, LCPD; Investigators say Kelser allegedly fired a shotgun into a heater in the master bedroom of a home on Bell Avenue in Lenoir City while a woman and young girl were on the other side of the wall in the kitchen area. Kelser is also accused of damaging property and destroying items in the home prior to firing the weapon, investigators stated in the affidavit.

Lenoir City Police Chief Don White said that officers responded to a report of a domestic dispute at the residence on Bell Avenue around 1 p.m. Wednesday.

The report states Kelser fired the weapon a second

time while police officers were on scene. The shots were not fired in the direction of the police.

White said the woman and child were able to flee the property safely and call 911.

Officers briefly established phone contact with the suspect before establishing a perimeter with assistance from the Blount County Sheriff's Office SWAT Team.

DUI


Archie Welch, 58, Dutch Valley road Knoxville, was charged with DUI, and Violation of Implied Consent.

Officer H. Wilkes LCPD, responded to the area of U.S. Highway 321 in the area of Zaxbys in reference to a possibly intoxicated driver. While responding, the complainant stated that the vehicle pulled into the Shell gas station, at 1104 U.S. Highway 321, and was getting gas. Upon arrival, Officer made contact with the suspect's vehicle, a black Audi bearing Tennessee registration 521BKVD. Officer made contact with the driver of the vehicle, Archie Welch, and the

passenger of the vehicle. While speaking with the passenger, Officer observed a 12 OZ bottle of Michelob Ultra sitting in between her legs, when asked about it, she advised the Officer that she was holding it for Mr. Welch. While speaking with Mr. Welch, Officer detected the odor of alcohol omitting from his person, and observed his eyes to be glossy and blood-shot. When asked about the half drunk bottle of alcohol in the vehicle, he admitted to drinking it while operating the motor


vehicle. Mr. Welch was asked to perform SFST's, he performed poorly. Due to the totality of the circumstances, Mr. Welch was placed into my custody for Driving Under the Influence. Mr. Welch was read the TN Implied Consent form, to which he refused. The passenger was given the vehicle and released from the scene, and Mr. Welch was transported to the Loudon County Jail without further incident. All of the above did occur in Lenoir City, Loudon County, Tennessee.



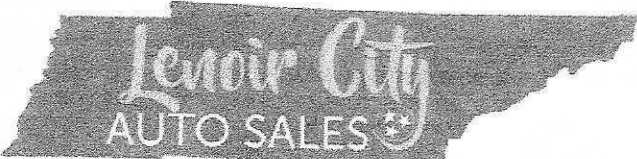



raphy. "Protecting children and holding perpetrators accountable is a top priority for the U.S. Attorney's Office and we will continue to work with our law enforcement partners to investigate and prosecute child exploitation cases," said United States Attorney Francis M. Hamilton III.

"I commend our agents and our partners at the Department of Justice and the U.S. Attorney's Office for investigating and prosecuting such heinous crimes against children," said Teri L. Donaldson, Inspector General for the Department of Energy. "Our investigators will continue doing everything they can to identify and investigate instances of child exploitation within the Department.
