### Missing or Murdered Indigenous Persons FBI supports initiative to close gaps, generate leads at tribal community event in Arizona

Monica Martinez knew something was wrong when her little brother Hector didn't call.

The siblings had always been close—from childhood on the Salt River Pima Maricopa Indian Community near Phoenix, through Hector's rambunctious teen years, and into his troubled adulthood spent in and out of jail.

"He always made

sure he called, no matter what," she said. "He could be out having a blast at a party at three in the morning, and he would still call me. He wrote to me all the time when he was in jail. So, when he went missing, and we didn't hear from him, that was really hard."

Hector Martinez was 32 years old when he got on a bus 14 years ago in Mesa, Arizona, and disappeared, joining a roster of thou-

sands of American Indian and Alaska Native (AI/AN) individuals who have since been categorized as Missing or Murdered Indigenous Persons (MMIP).

In recent years, federal agencies with legal authority on Native American lands—such as the FBI and the Department of the Interior's Bureau of Indian Affairs—have

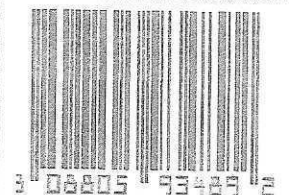
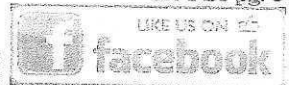

### Passed Out

Ashley Treadway, 33, Kingston Hwy Rockwood, was charged with Public Intoxication, and Simple possession x2.

Officer's with the Loudon Police Dept. were dispatched to Blair Bend Drive (Vanhooseco) for an unresponsive subject. Dispatch advised a subject was in a vehicle, with purple lips, and unresponsive to coworkers knocking on the window. At some point, someone had busted out the passenger side rear window for fear of the subject's well-being. Upon Officer Nix arrival the female was sitting behind the driver's seat. She was incoherent and briefly unresponsive. After a few moments, she began responding to EMS and fire personnel. The female subject had refused EMS. Officer was able to

make contact and request her identification. The subject was then identified as Ms. Ashley Treadway.

Officer asked Ms. Treadway if she had anything illegal in her vehicle to which she stated she had a marijuana blunt in her purse. Officer then requested for permission to search the vehicle. Ms. Treadway did consent. Inside the vehicle was a glass container with several different pills, there was also a large plastic baggie that contained several different pills. There were a total of three (3) yellow pills with the engraving TEVA 832. These are believed to be Clonazepam. The other pills were believed to be Gabapentin, Buspirone, and Diclofenac.

Officer went around to his patrol unit which was in front of Ms. Treadway's Volvo SUV. As Officer passed the driver's side Officer saw

what is believed to be a meth pipe laying in the grass. Officer then asked for Ms. Treadway to perform standard field sobriety tests. She

consented and performed very poorly. Ms. Treadway was then placed into custody and transported to The Loudon County Jail.

redoubled efforts to work with local and tribal agencies to solve MMIP cases. Last year, the Department of Justice made addressing the disproportionately high rates of violence that Native Americans experience—and the large number of Indigenous persons who are reported missing—a priority.

For Monica Martinez, that was all far-off background noise until a victim specialist from the FBI's Phoenix Field Office called her this spring. The Bureau was holding a Missing Person Identification Project (MPIP) event with local agencies and the National Missing and Unidentified Persons System (NamUs). The victim specialist, Maricela Savalas, wanted to know if Martinez and her family could attend. It would be a chance for the Martinez family to meet directly with federal and local investigators in their community to get updates on cases or provide leads. It would also let them meet with local

advocates and service providers.

Federal law requires victims of crimes like murder, child and adult sexual abuse, kidnapping, and violent felony assaults receive resources and support. For the FBI, that role belongs to the Victim Services Division (VSD) and its victim specialists.

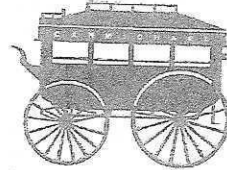
The Identification Project grew out of a recognition that there are large gaps in data about MMIP for agencies to work with, according to FBI Phoenix Victim Specialist Kathleen Lawler, who developed the project in 2022. She has held events in the White Mountain Apache and San Carlos Apache tribal communities east of Phoenix. She said the victim-centered, coordinated events aim to gather accurate data so everyone can work off the same information. Families can create police reports, meet investigators, and provide DNA samples that could help their cases. The events also reassure families of victims that they haven't been forgotten.
