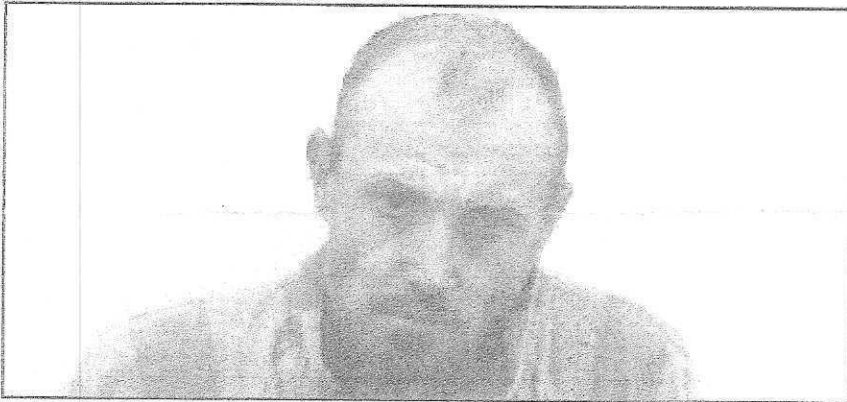

## Investigation Questions Food and Alcohol Purchases by Tennessee Association of Chiefs of Police

Investigators with the Tennessee Comptroller's Office have examined the operations of the Tennessee Association of Chiefs of Police (TACP), a nonprofit organization that receives more than half of its funding from governmental sources.

The investigation focused on TACP's activities from January 2017 through December 2021. During

this time, TACP's day-to-day operations were managed by a former executive director who resigned on March 18, 2022.

Comptroller investigators noted questionable credit card transactions totaling \$63,923.74. Many of these transactions lacked documentation or proper approvals and appeared to have no TACP related purpose or were made in violation

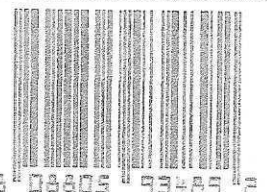

Charles Shubert, 43, St. Charles Place Pigeon Forge, was charged with Mfg/Del/Sale or Poss. of Meth, General Session Capias, and Poss. of Drug Para.

Officer R. Miller, with the Lenoir City Police Department, was conducting a patrol in the area of Simpson Road West near Highway 321 in Lenoir City, TN. During my patrol duties Officer observed a white in color BMW SUV traveling east on Simpson Road West. While observing the vehicle

Officer noticed that the driver had his cellular device in his hand and looked down at it while he was operating his motor vehicle on a public road-

way. Officer then initiated a traffic stop on the vehicle in the area of Highway 321 near Simpson Road East in Lenoir City, TN.

Upon traffic stop Officer made contact with the driver, who admitted to having his cellular device in his hand while operating his motor vehicle on a public roadway.

During the roadside traffic stop the front seat passenger in the vehicle stated that his Tennessee Identification Card was located in his bag which was in the trunk of the vehicle. The passenger who was identified as Charles Shubert gave consent to Sgt. C. Butler to go into his bag in the trunk of the vehicle and retrieve his wallet and get his Tennessee ID.

Upon initial contact with

SHUBERT at the beginning of the traffic stop Officer noticed that he was slouched in his seat and hat his hat pulled down over his eyes covering his face as if he was attempting to hide his identity. Officer also visually observed a handheld butane torch lighter in SHUBERT'S lap.

As the officer was conducting his business in regards to writing a traffic citation the owner of the vehicle, the driver, gave verbal consent to conduct

a search of the entire vehicle. During a subsequent search of the vehicle, Officer located a glass pipe which had been shoved in between the passenger's seat in which SHUBERT was sitting and center console of the vehicle. Officer then located a bag containing a crystal-like substance believed to be methamphetamine (6.68 grams) in a black box inside of the bag that contained SHUBERT'S Tennessee Identification Card, wallet and other items.

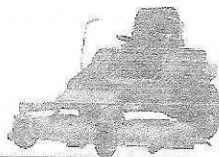
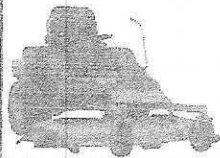

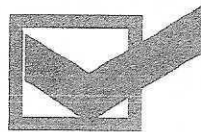

Ronald Boldin, 34, Walnut Street Lenoir city, was charged with Vandalism, and Public Intoxication.

Deputy Goad LCSO, was dispatched in reference to a B & E in progress at Lynnwood Dr. The female caller told dispatchers that someone was beating on the doors and she heard glass breaking. Upon arrival contact was made with a male subject standing outside near a vehicle. He was identified as Ronald Boldin, which had been at the address on a date with a female later identified as

the caller. This residence is currently being used as an Air B & B, which is owned by victim. As Deputy spoke to the Mr. Boldin Deputy noticed he was unsteady on his feet and his speech was slurred. Mr. Boldin stated he had been there on a date and it didn't go well so he decided to leave. That he then was just trying to get his keys to his car that he thought he left inside the residence. Upon speaking with victim stated they were on a date earlier, they both had been drinking and started arguing. That Mr. Boldin

had decided to leave and she went to bed and woke up to what she thought someone trying to break in. Later she told dispatchers that it could possibly be Mr. Boldin although she had locked herself in the bedroom. A ladder was observed through a window in the living area and this

is the glass breaking that the victim heard. Mr. Boldin was arrested for public intoxication and vandalism. He was transported to L.C.S.O. for booking. The owner of the Air B & B was contacted and came to the residence.

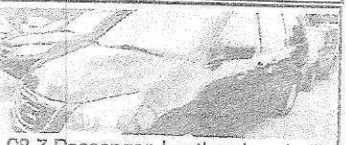

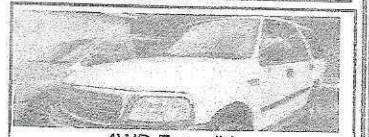

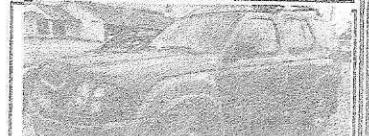

of TACP's purchasing policy. The questionable credit card purchases include:

Food and alcohol totaling \$23,763.74 for TACP's bi-monthly meetings and annual conferences. Investigators question whether government funds were used to purchase these items. Vendor sponsorship payments for food and alcohol purchases were less than the totals spent on these items.

Meals totaling \$15,217.66. Investigators noted 243 occasions where a TACP credit card was used to purchase either individual or group meals ranging from fast-food chains to upscale restaurants.

Purchases of gifts and gift cards totaling \$14,411.24.

Gasoline for personal vehicles totaling \$796.57.

Other miscellaneous purchases totaling \$9,734.53 that were not supported with itemized receipts or invoices.

Investigators also found the former executive director had a potential conflict of interest by simultaneously working as a

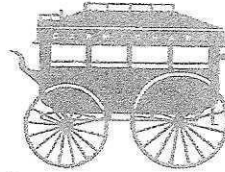
registered lobbyist for another nonprofit that provides insurance coverage to Tennessee municipalities.

The former executive director continued to work as a lobbyist for the outside organization after she was instructed by TACP's Executive Board to stop, and in violation of her employment agreement. Investigators determined she also used TACP computer devices and its email account while performing outside lobbying activities during normal TACP business hours.

The results of the investigation have been communicated to the Office of the District Attorney General of the 20th Judicial District.

"TACP's Executive Board has a responsibility to provide adequate oversight of the organization and its staff," said Comptroller Mumpower. "The board should ensure the organization is following its policies concerning check signing and credit cards as well as revisit its official policy on the funding of hospitality suites."

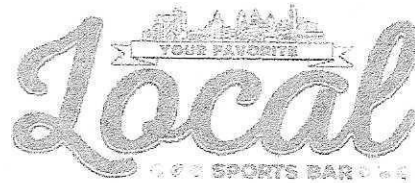



son, Kani Johnson, Makayla Leake, and Dustin Simmons to misappropriate \$117,024 in Labor and Workforce Development grant funds while participating in the Work Experience program, which provides pay to eligible participants with employability struggles.

Investigators found that Henry aided the three individuals in representing that they were gainfully employed when they were not. It also appeared that Henry fabricated timesheets for the three individuals and directed a Career Service Provider (CSP) in Bedford County to sign and approve their timesheets. All three were paid through the SCHRA's payroll system.

Jennifer Henry's employment with the SCHRA was terminated on November 23, 2021.

Based upon this investigation, in May 2023, the Lincoln County Grand Jury indicted Jennifer Henry on eight separate counts; Kani Johnson on six separate counts; Makayla Leake on six separate counts; and Dustin Simmons on six separate counts. For a full list of the 26 total counts, please view the investigative report.

"When Henry directed the Career Service Provider to approve timesheets without verification, it caused a significant breakdown in internal controls," said Comptroller Jason Mumpower. "The CSP's role is to contact worksites, correspond with worksite supervisors, and visit worksites as needed. This did not occur in this case, which allowed the scheme to go undetected."

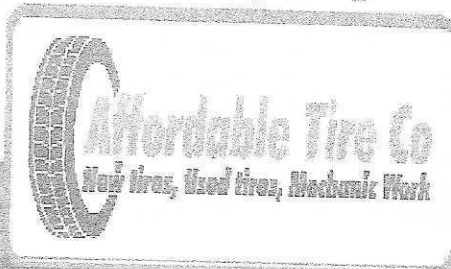

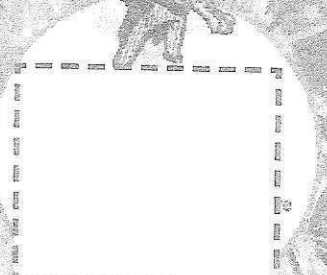

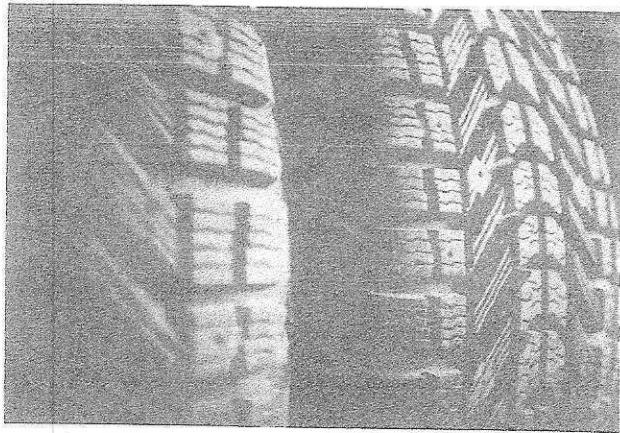
