## MAN CONVICTED OF BEING A FELON IN POSSESSION OF A FIREARM

Following a one-day trial in United States District Court, in Chattanooga, Tenn., a jury convicted Andre Blocker, Jr., 22 of Chattanooga of possessing a firearm as a convicted felon in violation of 18 U.S.C. §922(g)(1).

Sentencing is set for October 26, 2023, at 10:00 a.m. before the Honorable Charles E. Atchley, Jr. in the United States District

Court for the Eastern District of Tennessee at Chattanooga. Blocker faces up to ten years imprisonment.

The evidence presented at trial showed that on February 9, 2022, a Hamilton County Sheriff's Office Lieutenant observed Blocker driving recklessly on Glenwood Drive in Chattanooga and initiated a traffic stop. During the stop, Blocker brandished a

pistol and then fled, leading law enforcement on a high-speed pursuit. Block eventually crashed, striking an innocent motorist's vehicle and a building, and then fled on foot. He was taken into custody a short distance from the crash. Officers located a Taurus 9-millimeter pistol in Blocker's vehicle.

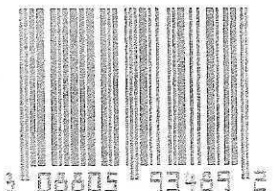

## Illegal

Roberto Gonzalez, 37, Wellthim Place Oak Ridge, was charged with DUI, Leaving the Scene of Accident, and License Required.

Officer DeLandv LCPD, responded to a dispatch regarding a vehicle that hit a fuel pump and fled the scene at 95 Market on Old Hwy 95. The complainant, who is also the owner of the Market, showed Officer DeLandv the damage to the gas pump and provided pictures of the vehicle that fled. The vehicle was a White Chevy with license plate number: BCP0859, which turned into the Trailer Park next door at Old Hwy 95. Officer DeLandv found the van in question at lot 57 of the Trailer Park and saw Roberto M. Gonzalez,

sitting on the porch drinking beer with several empty beer cans and 2 empty cases of Bud Lite beside him. Officer asked if he'd just got back from the Market and drove the van. He responded, "Yes". Mr. Gonzalez was unsteady on his feet and had a strong alcohol odor on his person. He admitted to driving the van to buy more beer and hitting the gas pump while backing up. He told me that he was too drunk to drive. So he went back to his friend's house after leaving the market instead of going home. Officer DeLandv conducted the Standard Field Sobriety test, which Mr. Gonzalez failed. Mr. Gonzalez also mentioned that he was here illegally from Guatemala and did not have any form of identification. Consequently, Mr. Gonza-

lez was arrested for driving under the influence, leaving the scene of an accident with property damage, and driving while unlicensed. This incident took place in Lenoir City, Tennessee.

The report did not indicate what identification the man used at the store to purchase the alcohol with in the first place since he did not possess a license for the driving and was here illegally.

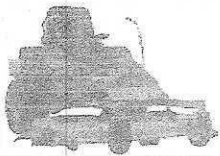

 Carrie Cardwell, 41, Guinn Road Knoxville, was charged with Simple Possession and Poss. of Drug Para.

Richard Shepherd, 45, Price Road Lenoir City, was charged with Violation of Probation.

Deputy Parks LCSO, observed two subjects walking on the shoulder of Highway 70. A male subject was wearing dark clothing and was not easily visible. When Deputy turned around to make contact with the subjects they then crossed through both lanes of Highway 70 and continued onto Hickory Creek Road. Deputy got out and made contact with the individuals and advised he was concerned for their safety due to their lack of visibility on a major roadway. The subjects identified themselves as Mr. Richard Shepherd and Ms. Carrie Cardwell. While speaking

with the two the deputy noticed Mr. Shepherd creating distance between he and the deputy and Ms. Cardwell making erratic movements into her purse. I asked dispatch to conduct a warrant check on the subjects. I asked if either were on probation or parole and Ms. Cardwell advised she was. Deputy then asked Ms. Cardwell for consent to search her purse, to which she consented. A

search of Ms. Cardwell's purse revealed 4 cut straws and a baggie containing approximately 0.62 grams of a white crystalized substance. Dispatch also advised Mr. Shepherd had a warrant out of Loudon County for Violation of Probation. Both subjects were placed under arrest and the drugs and paraphernalia were bagged for

evidence. Both subjects were transported to the Loudon County Justice Center without incident. The crystalized substance was identified by True Narc as methamphetamine. Both the drugs and paraphernalia were placed into evidence.

All of the above occurred in Loudon County, Tennessee.



U.S. Attorney Francis M. Hamilton III of the Eastern District of Tennessee made the announcement

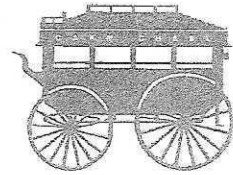

Officer Silvey LPD, responded to a domestic call at the Inn of Loudon that was between a father and son. Upon arrival the officer spoke with a Mr. Casey Donley and his son the victim age seventeen. First speaking with Casey he was very belligerent towards officer and his fellow officer. To calm him down we detained him by putting him in handcuffs and having sit down in a chair. When speaking to the father, he said that it was a verbal argument over money that his son spent on food, and that nothing physical had happened. Speaking with the victim he said, that his dad started going off on him verbally and pushed the victim, then pushed his dad away from him and then from there his dad started swinging his fist and hitting the victim. In the room there was evidence of the victim hitting his face under his right eye on the tv after his dad pushed him into it. After speaking to both parties Officer took Mr. Casey Donley into custody for Domestic Violence. After putting him in the back of his patrol vehicle Officer spoke with a male that witnessed Casey Donley hitting his son. Witness said he tried to stop Casey. Then Casey started towards the witness, and the witness went outside.
