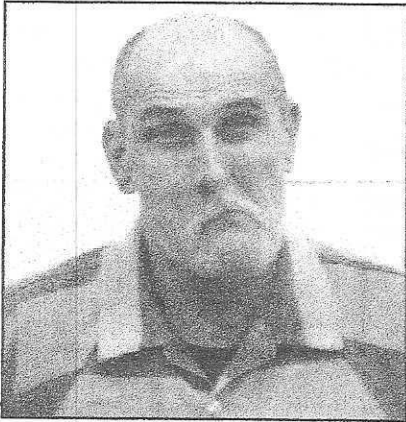

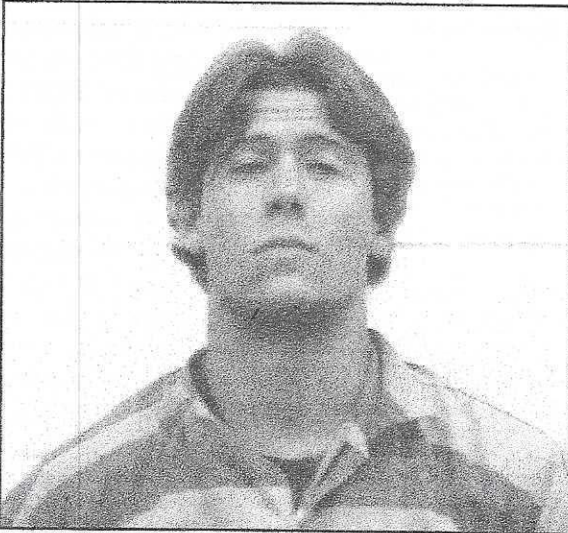

Knoxville Man Sentenced To 24 Months In Prison And Ordered To Repay \$411,963 For Health Care Fraud Scheme

Ian P. Clarke, 43, currently of Knoxville, was sentenced to 24 months in prison by the Honorable Katherine A. Crytzer, in the United States District Court for the Eastern District of Tennessee at Knoxville.

As part of the plea agreement filed with the court, Clarke agreed to plead guilty to conspiracy to commit health care fraud, in violation of 18 U.S.C. § 1349. Judge

Crytzer ordered Clarke to pay restitution to Medicare in the amount of \$411,963, and a fine of \$44,258. Following his imprisonment, Clark will be on supervised release for two years.

As set forth in the filed plea agreement, Clarke was responsible for the day-to-day operations of TN Premier Care, a medical clinic in East Tennessee. Clarke paid kickbacks to coconspirators

in exchange for signed doctors' orders for durable medical equipment ("DME") that was medically unnecessary. TN Premier Care provided the DME to Medicare beneficiaries across the country who did not want or need it. Clarke then caused the DME orders to be submitted to Medicare for reimbursement on be-

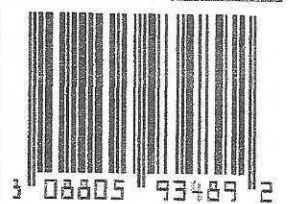
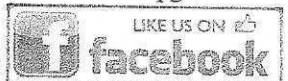

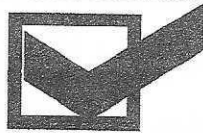

Alexander Nawrocki, 19, County Lane Lenoir City, was charged with Underage DUI, Violation of Implied Consent, and Poss. of Handgun while under the influence.

Officer Law LCPD, observed a white Dodge 2500 (TN Tag 836-BJKV) touch the shoulder several times. Upon conducting a traffic stop, Officer identified the driver to be Alexander Nawrocki, and while speaking to Mr. Nawrocki Officer could smell the strong odor of alcohol emitting from the truck. While speaking to Mr. Nawrocki, Officer observed him

to have bloodshot, watery eyes, and slightly slurred speech. Mr. Nawrocki stated he had no drinks prior to our encounter but did consent to SFST. During HGH Officer observed lack of smooth pursuit, distinct and sustained nystagmus at maximum deviation, and an onset of nystagmus prior to 45 degrees in both of Nawrocki's eyes. The DME orders were obtained from "leads," which consisted of a recorded call between a call-center employee or telemarketer and a Medicare beneficiary during which the beneficiary provided their Medicare information. The recordings were provided to doctors who used the information to generate a completed DME order. The doctors who signed the DME orders often did so regardless of medical necessity, in the absence of a preexisting doctor-patient relationship, without a physical examination, and sometimes based solely on a short telephonic conversation. The completed DME orders were uploaded to a shared cloud-based document storage system to which Clarke had access.

To conceal the conspiracy, Clarke and his coconspirators created sham contracts and documentation to disguise the kickbacks as legitimate payments for marketing and consulting services. Clarke also opened a separate bank account in TN Premier Care's name for the purpose of paying kickbacks and receiving reimbursement checks from Medicare.

Between in or about July 2018 and in or about May 2019, Clarke caused the submission of approximately \$778,429 in claims to Medi-

care for DME orders on behalf of TN Premier Care, for which Medicare paid to TN Premier Care approximately \$411,963.

U.S. Attorney Francis M. Hamilton, III, of the Eastern District of Tennessee; U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, Office of Inspector General ("HHS-OIG") Special Agent in Charge Tamala E. Miles; and Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) Special Agent in Charge Joseph E. Carrico, made the announcement.

This case is the result of an investigation conducted by U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, Office of Inspector General, and the FBI.

Assistant United States Attorney William A. Roach, Jr., prosecuted the case.

Eric Ellison, 52, Harris Drive Harriman, was charged with Simple Possession x2, Criminal Impersonation, and Prevention or Obstruction of Service.

Officer R. Millerv, with the Lenoir City Police Department, was conducting a patrol in the area of Highway 321 near Highway 70 in Lenoir City, TN. During patrol duties the Officer observed a maroon in color Ford pickup truck with heavily tinted windows traveling south on Highway 321. The Ford pickup truck was registered to an Eric Ellison whom the officer knew from prior knowledge was driving on a suspended Tennessee License status. Officer then

initiated a traffic stop on the Ford pickup in the parking lot of Highway 321 (Dollar General) located in Lenoir City, TN (Window Tint 13%). Upon the traffic stop the officer made contact with the driver, Eric Ellison and passenger, who both appeared nervous. While speaking with the driver, Officer advised him that he was driving on a suspended license status at which time he stated that he was not Eric Ellison and stated his name was David and that Eric Ellison was his bother. The officer then knew that ERIC had given him a false name and date of birth due to viewing his license picture prior to the traffic stop. While conducting business in regards to the traffic stop Officer visually observed ERIC quickly walk over to the passenger's side door of the truck and reach his arm into the back seat. Further into the investigation the officer observed a small mirror lying on the front passenger's side dash of the truck. The mirror contained a crystal-like residue on it at which time the officer asked the passenger if there were any other illegal items inside of the truck. The passenger stated that she had several hypodermic needles inside of her bag which the officer was able to locate. During a probable cause search of the truck, the officer located a container that had a bag containing a gray rock-like substance believed to be fentanyl (0.57 grams) and a yellow pill with the number (230) imprinted on it. The pill was identified to be oxycodone. Once mirandized ERIC stated that his daughter does not use fentanyl.

Dustin Shirk, 36, Shaw Ferry Road Lenoir City, was charged with DUI, Violation of Implied Consent, Resisting Arrest, and Use of Safety Belt.

Inv. Clay Jenkins LCSO, attempted to conduct a traffic stop on a gold Buick Century TN registration 086BKVD at the intersection of Hwy 11 and Old Midway Rd due to the driver not wearing his seat belt. The driver observed the Deputy was attempting to stop him but he continued traveling on Old Midway Rd. The deputy then turned on his emergency equipment as the driver still would not stop. He then stopped at the stop sign at the intersection of Old Midway Rd and Shaw Ferry Rd in which he motioned for cars to go through the stop sign so he could turn right onto Shaw Ferry Rd. He then turned right onto Shaw Ferry Rd with his hazard lights on and turned into the driveway on Shaw Ferry Rd. Deputy then ordered the driver which was found to be Dustin Ray Shirk out of the vehicle and placed him into custody. Mr. Shirk appeared to be under the influence of a stimulant narcotic and refused to perform any Standardized Field Sobriety or give a blood sample. Mr. Shirk said that he thought he had a warrant is the reason why he ran, but it was found he did not have a warrant. He also stated that the reason he did not stop when ordered to, was to get the car home. His vehicle was then towed by Malone's Wrecker Service. He was then transported to the Loudon County Jail without incident. All of this did occur in Loudon County, TN.

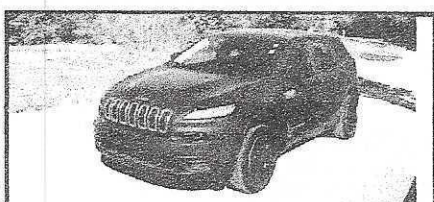

Richard Wayne Soles, 55, Uria Circle Oak Ridge, was charged with Man/Sell/Poss. Richard L Soles, 33, Uni-tia Circle Oak Ridge, was charged with Simple Posses-sion, and Poss. of Drug para. Officer R. Miller, with the Lenoir City Police De-partment, was conducting a patrol in the area of High-way 321 near Interstate 40 in Lenoir City, TN. During patrol duties Officer ob-served a blue in color KIA sedan exiting the top parking lot and disregarding a post-ed stop sign by not coming to a complete stop at Loves Truck Stop located in Lenoir City, TN. 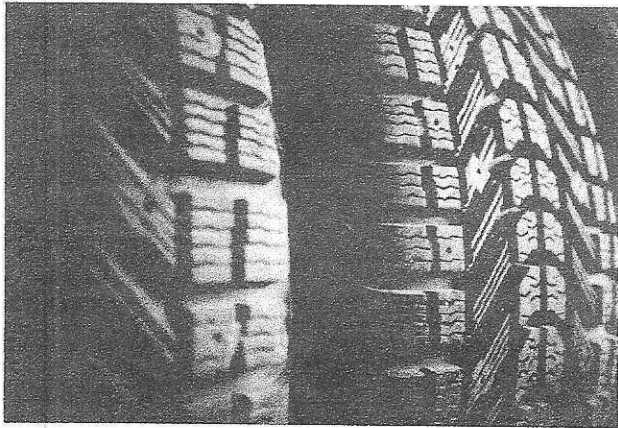
