Many healthcare providers not familiar with allergic condition

The CDC reports that between 2010 and 2022, there were more than 110,000 suspected cases of alpha-gal syndrome identified. However, because the diagnosis of alpha-gal syndrome requires a positive diagnostic test and a clinical exam, and some individuals with alpha-gal syndrome may not get tested, it is estimated that as

many as 450,000 people might have been affected by AGS in the United States, according to two reports issued today by the CDC in the Morbidity and Mortality Weekly Report. Studies show that many healthcare providers in the United States are not familiar with an emerging and potentially life-threatening allergic condition called alpha-gal syndrome (AGS), also known as the red-meat allergy or the tick bite

meat allergy. Of those aware of AGS, knowledge about diagnosis and management is low.

In one study, 1,500 family/general practitioners, internists, pediatricians, nurse practitioners (NPs), and physician assistants (PAs) across the country were surveyed, and results showed that nearly half of respondents had not heard

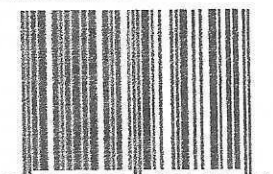

Taylor Savely, 29, West 2nd Ave Lenoir City, TN 37771, was charged with DUI, Violation of Implied Consent, and Child Abuse/Neglect or Endangerment.

Officers with the Lenoir City Police Department were dispatched to the area of West Broadway for a possible wreck in the alleyway. Upon arrival the Officer observed a female in a purple shirt who he later identified as Taylor Savely quickly go behind W Broadway. Upon further investigation Officers located a 2019 white Ford Explorer (TN Tag BJD-2334) in the alleyway just between the alley and the railroad tracks. The vehicles registration came back to a Taylor Savely subject,

who we then identified as the female near the vehicle behind W Broadway. While speaking to Ms. Savely, the officer could smell the strong odor of an alcoholic beverage emitting from her person, blood shot watery eyes, and slurred speech. After speaking to two witnesses, they stated they observed Ms. Savely walking up to them with her 8-month-old baby. Both witnesses stated a male, later identified as "Husband" arrived on scene to get the child. Ms. Savely then consented to SFST, the officer observed lack of smooth pursuit, distinct and sustained nystagmus at maximum deviation, and an onset of nystagmus prior to 45 degrees in both of Savely's eyes. During the walk and turn Ms. Savely could not maintain balance,

kept stepping off the line and could not perform the test as explained. Due to Ms. Savely being unsteady on her feet to the point she almost fell over, she was deemed unfit to continue with the SFST. Sergeant Bialek was on scene to perform ARIDE, to which she performed unsatisfactorily. Ms. Savely was then placed under arrest;

she was read the Tennessee Blood and/or Breath Consent Advisement. After reading the consequences, Ms. Savely refused to submit to a blood sample to determine his blood alcohol content. Ms. Savely was then transported to the Loudon County Jail without incident. All the above occurred in Lenoir City, TN.

Bruce Boehm, 35, Sandy Creek Road Crossville, was charged with Man/Sell/Del/Resale Sch. II. Poss. of Drug Para., and Public Intoxication.

Officer R. Miller, with the Lenoir City Police Department, was conducting a patrol in the parking lot of 9155 Highway 321 (Loves Truck Stop) located in Lenoir City, TN. During patrol duties the officer observed a red in color Ford SUV parked at the gas pumps located directly in front of Loves Truck Stop. While observing the Ford SUV the officer noticed a male subject in the driver's seat of the vehicle where it appeared that the upper portion of his body was slumped over the center console, and he appeared to be asleep. The officer then conducted a welfare check. Upon initial approach to the vehicle, the officer noticed what appeared

to be (2) hypodermic needles and a bag containing a grey/blue powder like substance sitting next to the male subject in the cup holder of the front seat.

The officer then attempted to wake the male subject up which after a short moment he did so. Once the male subject had awakened, he appeared to be non-coherent and asked if he was in Sweetwater, TN. Officer then requested for medics to respond to his location to conduct a wellness check on the male. After a short period of time the male was identified as Bruce Boehm. BOEHM stated that he arrived at Loves Truck Stop sometime around 05:30 that morning and stated he was in route to an unknown location in Kentucky. During the investigation a probable cause search of the vehicle was conducted where the officer recovered a bag containing a grey/blue powder

like substance believed to be Fentanyl along with two hypodermic needles.

The items were located in the center console cup holders. The grey/blue powder like substance along with the bag weighed approximately (3.79 grams). After medics on scene deemed BOEHM

clear he was placed under arrest.

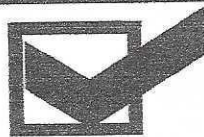

Officer Luna LPD, was dispatched to the area of Hwy 72 and I-75 for a Reckless Driver turning from I-75 into Hwy 72 heading towards Loudon City, description of the vehicle Red Toyota Tacoma. 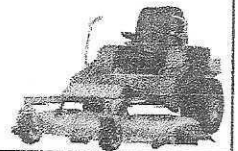
Deputy then also found a orange folded index card with a rock like substance inside. She claimed that the shorts was not hers. This did happen at The Loudon County Detention Center.

of AGS, approximately one-third reported that they were 'not too confident' in their ability to diagnose or manage patients with AGS, and five percent felt 'very confident' in their ability. In another study, CDC researchers examined laboratory test results from 2017 to 2022 from a laboratory that, until August 2021, was the primary commercial lab offering testing in the United States. More than 300,000 specimens were submitted by healthcare providers on behalf of patients with presumed clinical suspicion of AGS, and more than 30 percent were positive.

"Alpha-gal syndrome is an important emerging public health problem, with potentially severe health impacts that can last a lifetime for some patients," said Dr. Ann Carpenter, epidemiologist and lead author of one of the papers released today. "It's critical for clinicians to be aware of AGS so they can properly evaluate, diagnose, and manage their patients and also educate them on tick-bite prevention to protect patients from developing this allergic condition."

Alpha-gal is a sugar found in meat from mammals (pork, beef, rabbit, lamb, venison, etc.) and products made

from mammals (e.g., gelatin, cow's milk, milk products, some pharmaceuticals). AGS is a serious allergic condition some people experience after they consume food or products containing alpha-gal. Growing evidence suggests that AGS is primarily associated with the bite of a lone star tick in the United States, but other kinds of ticks have not been ruled out. Localities in the southern, midwestern, and mid-Atlantic regions of the United States identified more people who tested positive.

"The burden of alpha-gal syndrome in the United States could be substantial given the large percentage of cases suspected to be going undiagnosed due to non-specific and inconsistent symptoms, challenges seeking healthcare, and lack of clinician awareness," said Dr. Johanna Salzer, senior author on both papers released today. "It's important that people who think they may suffer from AGS see their healthcare provider or an allergist, provide a detailed history of symptoms, get a physical examination, and a blood test that looks for specific antibodies (proteins made by your immune system) to alpha-gal."

People who suffer from AGS may experience wide

ranging symptoms, including hives or itchy rash; nausea or vomiting; heartburn or indigestion; diarrhea; cough; shortness of breath or difficulty breathing; drop in blood pressure; swelling of the lips, throat, tongue, or eye lids; dizziness or faintness; or severe stomach pain. Symptoms commonly appear 2-6 hours after eating food or other exposure to products containing alpha-gal (for example, gelatin-coated medications). AGS is diagnosed by an allergist or other healthcare provider and requires a thorough history with compatible symptoms, and diagnostic testing for antibodies specific to alpha-gal. Your healthcare provider may also recommend allergy

skin testing.

Preventing tick bites is important in preventing tick-borne disease and can reduce your chances of developing AGS. Find more information about AGS.

It is with deepest sadness that the family of **Raymond Kimble Doty**, of Loudon, TN, announces his death at the age of 94 on May 22, 2023. Ray was a long time resident of Tellico Village having moved there from Plymouth, Michigan after retirement from the Ford Motor Company where he worked as a mechanical engineer for 35 years. Ray was born in Big Sandy, TN to James Wesley and Lucille Crawford Doty in 1929, living for the first 8 years of his life in a small frame house adjacent to the L & N railroad tracks and a Pentecostal church whose lively revivals reverberated through the walls of their home. Growing up during the Depression years left an indelible mark on Ray and forever shaped his views on the importance of hard work, making do with less, perseverance in the face of adversity, good financial practices, and being a good neighbor.

Later, after his older brother, Willard, returned from WWII in late 1945, Ray and Willard enrolled at the University of Tennessee (first at Martin then, two years later, at Knoxville) where they simultaneously obtained degrees in mechanical engineering and graduated

in 1950. Ray had a wide range of interests over the years which included jewelry making, wine making, writing poems, limericks, and odes, scuba diving, biking, golfing, fishing, birdwatching, and visiting the national parks. He enjoyed designing and building unique bird houses that encouraged birds to take up residence in the yard, and he delighted in sharing amusing aspects of their behavior with his children and grandchildren. Ray was a loving and devoted husband, father, grandfather, uncle, and friend whose greatest pleasure was getting together with family on every occasion possible; long trips were never an obstacle, and being present for each grandchild's graduation was a top priority. A diligent, thoughtful communicator, Ray stayed in touch with regular phone calls, email and texting in his later years, and beautiful handwritten letters that frequently included newspaper clippings he thought would be interesting, entertaining, or helpful to the lives of his recipients. Ray thought always in terms of helping the 'other person' first; his kindness and generosity brought people together and set a magnificent example for how to live a truly meaningful life. Preceded in death by his parents, Wes and Lucille Doty of

Bruceton, TN, his son, Curtis Wesley Doty, and his brother, James Willard Doty of Dayton, TN, whom he counted as "the best brother and friend anyone could ever have", Ray is survived by his beloved wife of 72 years, Betty Wilson Doty of Loudon, TN (formerly of Bruceton, TN), sons Raymond Kimble Doty, Jr. of Loudon, TN, and David E. (1) (A) Four (4) months from the date of the first publication (or posting, as the case may be) of this notice if the creditor received an actual copy of this notice to creditors at least sixty (60) days before the date that is four (4) months from the date of the first publication (or posting); or
