

PAT ALLEN POTTER SENTENCED TO 25 YEARS FOR EXPLOITATION OF A CHILD AND POSSESSION OF CHILD PORNOGRAPHY

Pat Allen Potter, 48, currently of Andersonville, Tennessee, was sentenced to 300 months imprisonment by the Honorable Thomas A. Varlan, United States District Judge, in the United States District Court for the Eastern District of Tennessee at Knoxville. Following Potter's imprisonment, he will be on a lifetime supervised release and will be required to register with state sex offender registries and comply



Malcolm Williams, 59, Highway 95 Greenback, was charged with Sexual Battery.

Loudon County Sheriff's Office was informed of an allegation of sexual battery occurring at Greenback School. The victim who is a custodian at the school, stated that she was working near the field house on Friday when Mr. Williams, who is a teacher and coach at Greenback, pulled up to her car and asked her to clean the field house. While in the field house, the victim stated Mr. Williams had been drinking and that he touched her inappropriately. The victim stated

she told him to stop, as this made her feel uncomfortable. She reported this to her supervisor, who reported the incident to school administration and Law enforcement.

Potter

with special sex offender conditions.

As part of the plea agreement filed with the court, Potter agreed to plead guilty to an indictment charging him with, one count of exploitation of a child in violation of 18 U.S.C. § 2251(a); and one count of possession of child pornography in violation of 18 U.S.C. §§ 2252A(a)(5)(B) and 2252A(b)(2).

According to court filed docu-

ments, in March of 2024, Knoxville Police Department Internet Crimes Against Children and Homeland Security Investigations began an investigation after receiving a tip that Potter was uploading and storing child pornography (CP) onto a website. During the investigation, a ten-year-old victim was identified who was known to Potter. On March 19, 2024, law enforcement obtained and executed arrest and search warrants for Potter and electronics located at his residence. Forensic examinations were conducted which revealed Potter possessed 20 videos and 38 images of CP. Evidence further revealed that Potter produced CP of the 10-year-old victim and groomed the victim to make CP videos of

himself for Potter.

U.S. Attorney Francis M. Hamilton III of the Eastern District of Tennessee and Special Agent in Charge Rana Saoud, Homeland Security Investigations ("HSI") made the announcement.

The criminal indictment was the result of an investigation by the Knoxville Police Department Internet Crimes Against Children (KPD-ICAC) and HSI. The investigation was headed by Detective Johnny Williams, HSI-ICAC task force officer. Also assisting in the prosecution were the Clinton Police Department and the Anderson County Sheriff's Office.







Timofey Kolomiychenko, 27, Davis Hill Road Harrison, was charged with, Mfg/Del/Sale or Poss. of Meth.

Cpl. J. Sartin LCSO, observed a grey Honda come off the interstate and move into the fast lane in front of the deputy. While in front of the deputy he noticed the driver not wearing a seatbelt. The driver started moving around a lot in the vehicle and then merged between two other vehicles in the slow lane to turn on to Town Creek Road West. While behind the vehicle it crossed the center lane multiple times before pulling into a driveway just after Dynasty Drive. The deputy initiated a traffic stop at that time. Upon approach the deputy made contact with Timofey Kolomiychenko. The deputy observed him still not wearing a seatbelt and explained to him my reason for stop. The deputy asked him if he had a license and he stated he did not. The deputy then asked if he was suspended or revoked and stated he was suspended out of California. The deputy was then able to get a California identification from him which was confirmed suspended. Mr. Kolomiychenko was asked if he had ever been to jail and he said he had in Tennessee in Bradley County for paraphernalia. At this time, the deputy asked him if anything illegal was

in the vehicle and he stared at the center console before turning to me and stating yes and told me there was meth. The deputy had Mr. Kolomiychenko step out and he asked if he had anything illegal on him and he stated he had a pipe in his back pocket which was located. He was then detained and placed in his vehicle. The deputy was then able to locate the suspected meth in a Wal-Mart bag in the center console of the vehicle. Deputy Curtis and Edgmon arrived on scene and no other paraphernalia or narcotics were located in the vehicle. The deputy advised Mr. Kolomiychenko he was under arrest and transported him to the Loudon County Jail. The deputy then made contact with Narcotics Investigator C. Gray who tested and weighed the meth using the TruNarc which tested positive, and the weight came to 4.0 grams. Mr. Timofey Kolomiychenko is charged with Possession of Methamphetamine (39-17-434). This did occur in Loudon County, TN.

Lenoir City Police Department was dispatched to a wreck with no injury at Highway 321 N. Officer Garren LCPD, made contact with the driver of the vehicle, identified as Brayden Pass. The officer was able to smell a strong odor of alcohol emitting from Brayden. The officer asked Brayden if he was injured, or needed EMS and Brayden denied. Brayden stated that he felt fine. Brayden advised that he had just left Ayalas, a local mexican restaurant, for a birthday party. The officer asked multiple times throughout the encounter with Brayden if he wanted to be seen by medics and he denied. The officer questioned Brayden about the odor of alcohol. Brayden stated that

he had multiple drinks at the restaurant. Brayden had very slurred speech, could not balance, and openly admitted to having drank too much. Brayden was asked to perform Standard Field Sobriety test. Officer Brown conducted the standard field test. Brayden was observed to have lack of smooth pursuit, nystagmus as max deviation and nystagmus prior to 45 degrees. Brayden could not perform heel to toe steps during the walk n turn and used his arms for balance. During the one leg stand test, Brayden used his arms for balance and started the test early. Brayden was also observed to not be able to follow the proper count of one thousand one, one thousand two and so on for the entirety of the test. Due to the totality of the circumstances of: slurred speech, the odor of alcohol, performance on standard field sobriety test, and Brayden openly admit-

ting to drinking too much, Brayden was placed into custody for underage driving while impaired. Brayden was read the Tennessee Blood Consent Advisement Pursuant to TCA 55-10-406 and consented to provide a blood sample. Brayden was transported to Fort Loudon Medical Center for a blood draw. Brayden was then transported to Loudon County Jail without further incident. The above did occur in Lenoir City, Loudon County, Tn.

Christopher Mogren, 40, Norwood Street Lenoir City, was charged with, Driving on Revoked/Suspended License, and Misuse of Evidence of Registration.

Officer Garren LCPD, while on routine patrol conducted a Tennessee registration check through central dispatch on 908BMW. The registration plate was being





was BLK8052, which expired in 2023. Christopher stated that he did place the incorrect plate on the vehicle, which violates TCA 55-5-115. The registration 908BMW was seized and removed from the vehicle. Christopher was placed into custody for driving on a suspended license and misuse of evidences of registration. The vehicle was inventoried on scene and impounded. Christopher was transported to Loudon County Jail without further incident.






