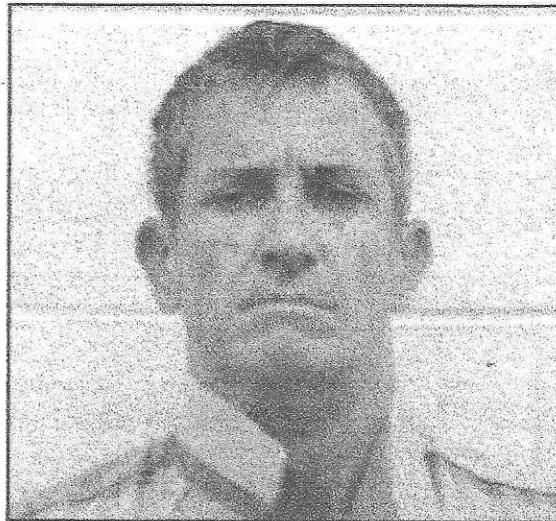

Deputy Edgmon, and Deputy Lewis LCSO, responded to Loudon County Jail in regard to a welfare check. Upon arrival, the deputy made contact with Deputy Martin who stated the female was slumped over at the

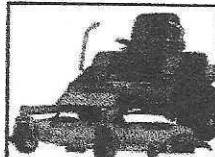
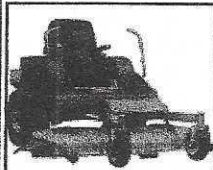

Heroin

Elizabeth Buckner, 41, Elizabethton Way Clinton, was charged with, Driving on Revoked/Suspended License, and Contraband in Penal Institution.

Deputy K. Henderson LCSO, came into contact with female subject Elizabeth Jill Buckner at approximately 2110. Deputy K. Henderson, was searching Elizabeth Buckner who was brought in on a driving charge. During the search, a baggie with white substance, a black tube, and an orange tube with white powder substance inside, a small baggie with white powder, and a blue pill were found inside her bra. Deputy K. Henderson, asked Buckner what it was; she stated, "I'm not sure it's my sisters, but I think it's heroin". Deputy K. Henderson, took the baggie and informed FTO A. Netherton. The evidence was then bagged, and Corporal C. Netherton was also notified. He then stated to call Narcotics and inform them of our findings. Lieutenant S. Ezell then came to the facility and tested the evidence. After testing was complete, the drugs were identified as Heroin and Methamphetamine. This did occur without further incident. This did occur at the Loudon County Detention Center.

In 2024, the FBI investigated 104 sexual assault aboard aircraft cases. The number of incidents, however, could be higher, as additional incidents may have gone unreported.

Learning more about this type of crime and what to

do if you are assaulted or witness an assault can help bring justice to victims—and prevent future cases of abuse.

The Q&A below includes insight from subject matter experts FBI Special Agent Greg Tarbert and Federal Air Marshal and FBI Joint Terrorism Task Force Officer David D'Arcangelis. Tarbert and D'Arcangelis are both airport liaisons working with FBI Tampa to enforce federal laws at Orlando International Airport.

Q&A

Q: What is the FBI's jurisdiction in investigating crimes on aircraft?

A: The special aircraft jurisdiction of the federal government covers any aircraft—from commercial to military—that is in flight and will land in the U.S. or its next destination will be in the U.S.

Tarbert explained, "We investigate crimes that violate Title 49 or Title 18 while in the air. When the aircraft doors have been closed, that's when the special aircraft jurisdiction starts. And when the aircraft arrives at its destination and the doors open, that's the end of our jurisdiction. This applies to domestic as well as international airlines—as long as the aircraft is going to be landing somewhere in the U.S., then we have authority when it lands."

The FBI has airport liaison agents (ALA) assigned to the nearly 450 U.S. aviation facilities that have passenger screening operations regulated by the Transportation Security Administration (TSA). In larger airports, multi-agency task forces, like the Joint Terrorism Task Force, are on location to further assist in investigating criminal matters, such as sexual assault, as well as national security matters, such as terrorism and espionage.

Gun

Steven Day, 28, McHaffey Road Knoxville, was charged with, Aggravated Assault x3.

Deputy Miller LCSO, and other Deputies responded to a reported armed person on Interstate 75 in Loudon. The complainant advised there was a Black Dodge Magnum driving aggressively and waving a handgun at them. Units were able to catch up to the vehicle and make a traffic stop at the 368MM of Interstate 40. We got the driver out of the car at gunpoint and were able to place him into custody. The driver's name was Steven Day, and he confirmed there was a Taurus G2C in the center console. We located the gun where he said it would be and found it to have a full magazine with one in the chamber. It was at this point that the complainant arrived on the scene. The complainant/victim, was riding

with his father, victim2 in the passenger seat and his mother, victim 3 in the back passenger seat. Victim 1 stated he was driving next to a Dodge Magnum when the driver appeared to get angry with his driving. Victim 1 then stated that victim 3 began screaming that the driver next to them was waving a gun at them. The Magnum then sped around them, and victim1 stated he saw the driver wave a black semi-automatic handgun out the window, toward the vehicle in front of them.

All three victims did make it clear they were in fear for their lives or imminent bodily harm and were visibly shaking. After Mr. Day was Mirandized, he did admit to having a road rage incident with the 4-Runner the victim's were in, although he didn't admit to brandishing a firearm.

Mr. Day was then transported to jail without further incident.

Endangerment

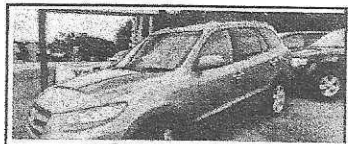
Kerry Andersen, 44, Place Lafitta Maryville, was charged with, Reckless Endangerment x2, Domestic Assault, and Public Intoxication.

Officer Bonilla, and Sergeant Bo Cogdill LPD, responded to a BOLO released for a stolen Jeep Gladiator near the interstate in Loudon. Complainant, Mr. Kerry Andersen, stated to dispatch that his wife and her boyfriend took off in his Jeep moments before he called. Upon making contact with Kerry, there was a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage emitting from his person. Kerry stated that his wife was at Love's truck stop across the road, but he had walked to the Marathon. Love's employees stated that Kerry made a scene (cursing loudly in anger at them and his wife) after being denied alcohol due to his level of intoxication. After calling his wife, she and her friend, were on the interstate and agreed to return to Love's in order to give a statement. According to statements from both parties, after leaving Love's the wife was

driving on Highway 72 when Kerry threatened to wreck the Jeep. He promised it would be wrecked by the end of the day as he was punching the center console. Kerry hit the wife/victim elbow in the process. As they turned south to the I-75 on ramp, Kerry reached over from the passenger seat and jerked the steering wheel in order to wreck the vehicle. The victim was able to stop to put the Jeep in park, and she tried to flee from Kerry by exiting the vehicle. Kerry jumped into the driver's seat and drove 40-50 feet before "slamming the Jeep in park," according to statements. Afterward, Kerry took off on foot the victim was still with the Jeep. Once the victim returned without Kerry they left. The victim stated to the officers that she was in fear of Kerry, and they needed to head back to Louisiana without him. Kerry was arrested without incident and transported to Loudon County Jail for the following charges: Domestic Assault, Reckless Endangerment x2, and Public Intoxication.

Q: What is the role of U.S. air marshals?

A: Air marshals' primary focus is security when the aircraft is in-flight or when the door is closed, per special aircraft jurisdiction. Once the aircraft touches ground, air marshals closely coordinate with the FBI and other law enforcement who are waiting when the aircraft door opens.

Q: What are common factors across sexual assault aboard aircraft cases?

A: Sexual assaults typically occur on long commercial flights, and offenders tend to be male, seated directly next to the victim, and under the influence of alcohol or drugs. They may try to conceal their activities, for instance, by using a blanket to cover the victim or taking advantage of a darkened cabin.

Victims are typically solo female passengers or unaccompanied minors, although flight crew members can also become the targets of sexual predatory behavior. Usually, victims are

sitting in a middle or window seat when they are attacked. "It's kind of a closed-off area where a potential assaulter or attacker can target victims with fewer witnesses," said D'Arcangelis.

If you've been the victim of one of these crimes or have witnessed one take place, report it to your flight crew. You can also contact the FBI at 1-800-CALL-FBI (225-5324) or tips.fbi.gov.

Q: What should you do if you're being attacked?

A: If someone is attacking you on the flight, Tarbert explains that the first thing you should do "is to make noise, make a ruckus, and tell the person to stop—and then notify the flight crew as quickly as possible to hopefully get reassigned to a new seat and to explain what happened so the flight crew can notify law enforcement on the ground to meet the aircraft when it lands."

Offenders may take advantage of the fact that some victims might not report an incident because they are embarrassed, don't want to cause a scene, or try to convince themselves the assault was accidental.

"If you need a reason to get

out of your seat and find a flight attendant, you can use the excuse of going to the restroom to get up and talk to them. Or you can hit the flight attendant call button and when they come over you could say something like, 'Hey, can I come back and get a water' or 'I would like to get another snack, and I'll pay for it,'" said Tarbert.

Q: What should you do if you witness an attack?

A: Notify the flight crew as soon as possible.

Q: Why is it important to

promptly notify the flight crew if you've been attacked or witness an attack?

A: Timely notification to law enforcement is key—crime aboard aircraft is more difficult to investigate once days, or even hours, have passed following the incident since witnesses depart and recollections fade. The more advance notice the flight crew has, the more information they can provide to law enforcement to assist upon landing.

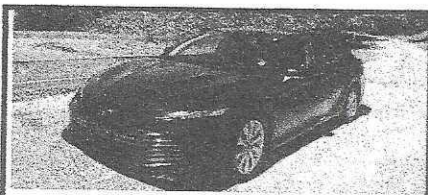



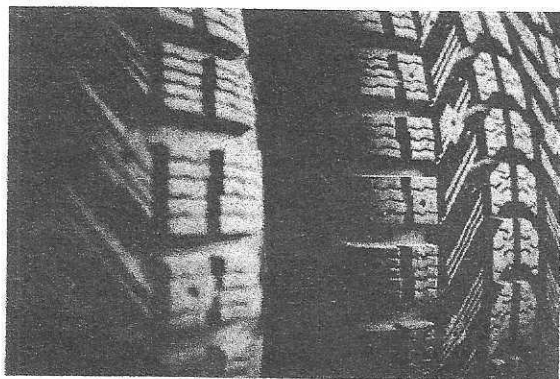
