

TBI Agents Investigating Morgan County Officer-Involved Shooting

At the request of 9th Judicial District Attorney General Russell Johnson, TBI special agents are investigating the circumstances of an officer-involved shooting that occurred Friday morning in Morgan County.

Preliminary information indicates the incident happened at approximately 10:30 a.m. at a home in the 300 block of Ray Cross Road in Harri- man. Deputies from




Billie Robinson, 51, Skyline Drive Alabama, was charged with, DUI, Poss. of Drug Para., Resisting Arrest, and Mfg/Del/Sale or Poss. of Meth.

Deputy Edgmon, assisted Cpl. Sartin LCSO, on 175 South Bound at mile marker 79.4. Upon arrival, the deputy made contact with Billie Robinson. Mr. Robinson advised he was willing to perform Standardized Field Sobriety. Mr. Robinson performed

poorly on all tests. While attempting to place Mr. Robinson into custody he began pulling away from us and refused to comply with commands. We were able to gain control and get handcuffs on him.

During an inventory of the vehicle, Sheriff Davis located multiple syringes located in a baggie near the driver's seat. Also in the baggie was a clear plastic tube with 2 baggies containing a crystal-like substance inside believed to be methamphetamine.

Narcotics investigator Caleb Green tested the substance using the TruNarc which tested positive for meth. 1 baggie weighed .54 grams and the other 2.23 grams with a total field weight of 2.77 grams. Mr. Robinson was placed under arrest for Driving

under the influence, Possession of Unlawful Drug Paraphernalia, Resisting Arrest, and Mfg., Delivery, Sale or Poss of Meth and transported to Loudon County Jail without incident. This did occur in Loudon County, Tennessee.





Mazon Harris, 23, Choate Place Circle Pea Ridge, was charged with, DUI.

Deputy Owens LCSO, was notified by dispatch about a reckless driver on Highway 321 headed from Blount County. As Dispatch gave him the call, the vehicle we were getting a call on passed him on Highway 321. The deputy was able to catch up to the car, which was a White SUV with a California temporary tag bearing DZ62N88. The deputy observed the vehicle cross over the fog line on the right shoulder of the highway and then cross into the left lane. The deputy initiated a traffic stop on Highway 321 at Antioch Church Road.

Upon making contact with the driver and passenger, the deputy could smell the odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from the vehicle. The driver was identified as Mazon Harris. The deputy asked if anyone had been drinking, and the passenger said she had been drinking, but the driver had not been drinking at all. Due to the location of the stop and for his safety, the deputy asked the driver to pull into the Antioch Church parking lot. The deputy asked the driver if he would perform standardized field sobriety, and he agreed. When the driver was asked to exit the vehicle, he noticed he had red, glossy eyes, and he could smell the odor of an alcoholic beverage coming from his person. Standardized field sobriety testing was conducted, and Harris performed poorly. Harris had admitted to having some alcoholic drinks at a concert that they attended earlier in the day. He admitted to hav-

ing 2 to 3 Michelob Ultras 16 fl. In the back of the SUV was an open box of Michelob Ultras. Due to the totality of the circumstances, Mazon was placed under arrest for driving under the influence of an intoxicant. Mazon was read the implied consent, and he agreed to give a breath sample. Mazon was transported to the Loudon County Sheriff's Office, where he was observed, and the breath test was administered. On the first test, Mazon's results returned as a .090, and on the second test, it returned as a .081 (See attachment). All of the above did occur in Loudon County, Tennessee.

the Morgan County Sheriff's Office were responding to a burglary call. Upon arrival, they encountered John A. Cox (DOB 5/30/1996). For reasons under investigation, the situation escalated, resulting in a deputy firing his weapon, hitting Cox, who later died at the hospital. No law enforcement officers were hurt in the incident.

TBI agents are working to independently determine the series of events leading to the shooting, including collecting evidence and conducting interviews. Throughout the process, investigative findings will be shared with the district attorney general for his further review and consideration. The TBI acts solely as fact-finders in its cases and does not determine whether the actions of an officer were justified in these types of matters. That decision rests with the district attorney general requesting TBI's involvement.

The TBI does not identify the officers involved in these types of incidents and instead refers questions of that nature to the respective department to answer as it sees fit.

Devin McMillan, 25, Highway 70 West Lenoir City, was charged with, Domestic Assault.

Deputy Brockwell LCSO, arrived at Highway 70 West for a physical domestic. The deputy spoke with (victim/complainant), and she stated that her boyfriend, Devin McMillan (offender), was arguing about some text messages that were sent to her about McMillan cheating. When she tried to have a further conversation was not getting anywhere, she told Mcmillan that she was going to get her stuff and leave. This is when McMillan told her no and that she needed to go now. The victim told him no and that she was going to grab her stuff. This is when McMillan became very agitated and told her that he was going to drag her out of the house. McMillan attempted

to grab the victim, but she dodged it, and at this time, McMillan placed his head under her arms and placed her in a headlock. After McMillan held her in a headlock for approximately 1 minute, the victim then called 911. All of this was stated on a body cam and on a written statement form written by the victim (see attachments). The deputy then spoke to McMillan, and the first thing he stated to me was that he had messed up. McMillan gave the same story the deputy did, and was very forthcoming with information on what happened. During the investigation Mcmillan stated that he knew he screwed up and that he did not mean to choke her if he did. Based on all the information gathered, McMillan was identified as the primary aggressor and was placed under arrest for domestic assault. The deputy then observed the injuries

on the neck area of the victim. She did have visible red marks on her neck that correspond with the story both parties provided. McMillan was then transported to the Loudon County Detention Facility. This did happen in Loudon County, TN, without further incident.

Endangerment

James Drake, 55, Riverview Road Loudon, was charged with, Domestic Assault.

Cpl. Clay Jenkins LCSO, responded to Riverview Rd for a physical domestic. Before arrival, Inv. Chance Gray arrived on the scene and had both subjects separated. The deputy spoke to victim, who had blood running down his left arm and abrasions on the back of his head. The victim said that he and his brother (Offender) James Drake

were arguing when James attacked him. Deputy Yap read James Drake his' Miranda Rights and then asked him what happened. James told us that he and Jesse got into an argument, and that's when he tackled the victim to the ground, causing the victim's injuries. The deputy attempted to speak to the complainant, who said that all she saw was the two brothers going at it with a lot of arguing, pushing, and shoving. She refused to write a written statement. The deputy then determined James Drake as the primary aggressor and took him into custody without incident. He was then transported to the Loudon County Jail by Deputy Hollinger.

The victim refused medical attention.

All of this did occur in Loudon County, TN.







Knox County Resident Pleads Guilty to Tax Charges

The Special Investigations Section of the Tennessee Department of Revenue conducted the investigation that led Chris Rothermel pleading guilty to tax evasion charges.

On Tuesday, Judge Hector Sanchez accepted Rothermel's guilty plea to tax charges stemming from his fraudulent vehicle registration at the Knox County

Clerk's Office. Rothermel was sentenced to one year of probation and ordered to pay restitution of \$2,170.

"The Department of Revenue strives to promote voluntary compliance of Tennessee's tax laws by educating taxpayers and pursuing criminal sanctions for accountability of fraudulent actors," Revenue Commissioner David Gerregano said. "This guilty plea underscores the department's efforts to ensure fair admin-

istration of Tennessee's tax laws."

The department pursued this criminal case in cooperation with District Attorney General Charme Allen's Office. Citizens who suspect violations of Tennessee's revenue laws should call the toll-free tax fraud hot line at (800) FRAUDTX (372-8389).

The Department of Revenue is responsible for the administration of state tax laws

and motor vehicle title and registration laws, as well as the collection of taxes and fees associated with those laws. The Department collects around 87 percent of total state revenue. During the 2024 fiscal year, it collected nearly \$22.2 billion in state taxes and fees and more than \$4.7 billion in taxes and fees for local governments. 


